Congress never condemned terror attacks due to vote bank politics: Amit Shah

AHMEDABAD: Home Minister Amit Shah on Saturday said terror attacks were rampant when Congress was in power and terrorists from Pakistan used to kill Indian soldiers but the then ruling party never condemned them due to "vote bank" politics.

Paying tributes to the victims of the November 26, 2008 (26/11) Mumbai terror attack, Shah said it is impossible to carry out such an attack under the watch of the Narendra Modi government.

"Today is the anniversary of the 26/11 attack. On this day (in 2008), Pakistani terrorists killed 164 persons in Mumbai. I pay my humble tributes to the departed souls. Though such attacks were rampant during the Congress rule, it is not possible to carry out a 26/11 type terror attack today because Narendra Modi is the prime minister," Shah said while addressing a poll rally in

JeI's properties worth over Rs 90 Cr sealed

SRINAGAR: Authorities in district on Anantnag Saturday sealed several properties worth more than Rs 90 crores belonging to the banned Jamaat-e-Islami (JeI), officials said.

The properties in the south Kashmir district were sealed on the orders of the district magistrate and the recommendation of the State Investigation Agency (SIA), they said.

"The SIA has discovered assets of banned Jamat-e-Islami throughout J-K worth crores. Today in Anantnag, properties at eleven locations worth more than Rs 90

crores, after being notified by DM Anantnag on the recommendation of SIA J-K, have been barred with restrictions on usage and entry," officials said.

Besides "red entry" to this effect has been made in the relevant revenue records to choke the availability of funds for secessionist activities and to dismantle the ecosystem of anti-national elements and terror networks hostile to India's sovereignty, they said.

The sealed properties include residential houses, commercial complexes, orchards and land.


