Major breakthrough: AGuH terror module busted in Kashmir **Arms recovered in Awantipora**

SRINAGAR: In a major break-through against terrorists infrastructure in Kashmir, security forces busted a module of Ansar Ghazwatul Hind (AGuH) by arresting four persons including one handler of the outfit, police said on Monday.

Incriminating materials, huge cache of arms and ammunition have also been recovered from their possession, a police spokesman

"Police and security forces busted a module of AGuH by arresting its handler for north Kashmir and four OGWs cum terrorist associates in Sopore," he said.

"Upon an information by sister agency regarding movement of main terrorist handler, Sopore Police along with 22RR established an MVCP grid in Sopore. During checks, two individuals identified as Mushtaq Ahmed Bhat (main handler)

Arrested terror associates along with arms and ammunition seized by police. of Chanapora, Srinagar and Ishfaq Ahmed Shah resident of Budgam were arrested. One Pistol, one magazine, 10 rounds and three grenades were recovered from their

possession," he said. On further interrogation, two more terror associates identified as Abdul Maieed Kumar resident of Bernate. Boniyar and Abdul Rashid were arrested.



NEW DELHI: Hackers have allegedly demanded an estimated Rs 200 crore in cryptocurrency from the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Delhi as its server remained out of order for the sixth consecutive day, official sources said on Monday.

It is feared that data of around 3-4 crore patients could have been compromised due to the breach detected Wednesday morn-

Patient care services in emergency, outpatient, inpatient and laboratory wings are being managed manually as the server remained down,

The Delhi Police, however, issued a statement, saving

The India Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT-IN), Delhi Police and representatives of the Ministry of Home Affairs are investigating the somware attack.

A case of extortion and cyber terrorism was registered by the Intelligence Fusion and Strategic Operations (IFSO) unit of Delhi Police November 25.

Official sources said internet services are blocked on computers at the hospital on the recommendations of the investigating agencies.
