

CRIME REPORT**Girl raped on pretext of marriage****STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Police on Thursday registered a case of rape against an army Jawan on complaint of a woman.

According to information, a complaint was lodged by a woman at Nowabud Police Station in which she told that she had an affair with one Raman Kumar, resident of Bishnah, who has promised to marry her. She told that one day, accused took him to a hotel in Nowabud area and raped her and now is refusing to marry. On her complaint, police has registered a case. Medical examination of girl has also been done.

4 arrested with 32 Kg poppy straw**STATE TIMES NEWS**

RAMBAN: Police on Thursday arrested four smugglers and recovered 32 Kg poppy straw from them.

According to information, Banihal police got information that two people are coming to the area with a consignment of drugs. Acting on this, a Naka was laid in the area. During Naka checking, police stopped a vehicle and recovered 24 Kg poppy straw. Both the smugglers, identified as Raj Kumar and Pintu Kumar, were arrested and a case has been registered against both. Apart from this, two smugglers were arrested by Ramban police and a consignment of poppy straw was also recovered from them. They were identified as Ghulam Navi Rather and Rajendra Singh. A case has been registered against both.

One died, two injured in vehicles' collision**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: A load-carrier rammed into a motorcycle in Satwari area due to which a youth died, while two others got injured.

According to the information, three people were going on a motor-cycle but on the way, a Tata mobile vehicle hit the bike, due to which trio got injured. They were taken to the hospital for treatment, but doctors declared one of them as brought dead. The deceased was identified as Sameer resident of Vijaypur while injured Deepak and Rohit are under-treatment.

Woman found hanging, parents allege dowry harassment**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: A woman was found hanging in her house in Gandhi Nagar area, however her family members alleged that she was being harassed for dowry.

According to information, Sheetal Bhagat, wife Raj Kumar, resident of Digiana, presently living in Nai Basti area was found hanging in her room. On getting information, Police reached the spot and took possession of body. A case has been registered in this regard. The family members of woman alleged that she was being harassed over dowry. She was married two years ago. Police has started investigating the matter.

Woman dies of burn injuries**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: A woman died of burn injuries in Sainik Colony area on Thursday.

According to information, Shashi Devi, wife Bittu Ram, resident of Chauadi suffered burn injuries in her house a few days back. She was admitted to the hospital for treatment, but she failed to recover and died during treatment. Police has started investigation.

Two women thieves arrested**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Bus Stand Police has arrested two women thieves on Thursday.

According to information, some people caught two women red-handed while stealing purse in the area. Police was informed which rushed to the spot and took both the women into custody. The purse was also recovered from their possession. Police has registered a case and started further action.

Narco-smuggler arrested with heroin**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Police on Thursday arrested a smuggler with heroin at Gharota.

According to reports, police got information that a smuggler is roaming in area with drugs. Acting on information, a naka was laid in area by police and smuggler was caught. On frisking, 10 gm heroin was recovered from accused, identified as Jaswa, son of Jagar Hussain. Police has registered a case in this regard and started further action.

4 arrested, 4 vehicles seized for illegal extraction, transportation of minerals**STATE TIMES NEWS**

BUDGAM: Acting tough against persons involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, Police on Thursday arrested 4 persons & seized 4 vehicles in Budgam.

As per details, Police Station Budgam received information about illegal extraction and transportation of clay at Sholipora. Acting swiftly, a Police party of Police Station Budgam raided specific location and seized 3 tipplers and a JCB besides arresting 4 persons identified as Gulzar Ahmed Ganie, resident of New Colony Kakanmaran; Imtiaz Ahmad Chopan, resident of Sholipora; Mohammad Ashraf Mir & Farooq Ahmed Khuchoo, both residents of Firdous Colony Bemina involved in crime. They were shifted to Police Station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR Number 374/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Budgam and further investigation initiated.

Missing girl traced, reunited with family**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Police on Thursday traced a missing girl and reunited her with family. As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Post Pargwal by legal-heirs of a girl stating that she went missing from her home. In this regard, a missing report was registered and investigation started.

After this, a team of Police Post Pargwal under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Mohan Lal led by Incharge Police Post Pargwal PSI Baljeet Singh Parhar, after putting in strenuous efforts, traced the missing girl from Lakhampur. Subsequently, family of missing girl was informed and she was reunited with her family after completing all legal formalities.

Two theft cases solved; 3 arrested, stolen gold items, cash recovered**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Two different theft cases were solved by teams of Police Station Satwari on Thursday and stolen gold items, cash amounting to Rs 25,000 and stolen vehicles were recovered by police.

As per details, a complaint was received at Police Station Satwari stating that on October 22, 2022 someone stolen a scooter (JK02BF2826). On this FIR No. 201/22 under section 379 IPC was registered at Police Station Satwari and investigation started.

After this, a team of Police Station Satwari under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Satwari Inspri Sameer Jeelani assisted by Incharge Police Post Chatha PSI Saddam Hussain, after putting in strenuous efforts and with the help of CCTV footages of area, rounded up a suspect identified as Sunny Bali, son of Madan Lal Bali, resident of Jagti at present Toph Sherkhania.

During sustained questioning accused confessed his involvement in crime and on his disclosure stolen scooter was recovered. Further, 3 more stolen vehicles were recovered from his possession.

Similarly, a written complaint was lodged at Police Station Satwari by a person stating that when he was not present at home, some thief decamped with 10 tolla gold and Rs 25,000 cash from his house. On the receipt of information, FIR No.195/2022 under sections 454/380 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Satwari under the overall supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Satwari Inspri Sameer Jeelani assisted by Incharge Police Post Gadigarth SI Ravinder Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, apprehended two suspects namely Ajay Kumar, son of Amarnath, resident of Gadigarth and Gurmeet Singh, son of Kulwant Singh, resident of Digiana. During intensive questioning, accused confessed their involvement in theft and stolen items were recovered from their possession.
