Govt's neglect pushed far-flung, backward areas into stone-age: Rattan Lal

RAJOURI: National Conference Provincial President Rattan Lal Gupta on Tuesday castigated the J&K government for its phlegmatic attitude towards backward and far flung areas which this dispensation has pushed into Stone Age as people are facing dearth of amenities as never before.

The senior NC leader was addressing a meeting of the party's Rajouri District unit at Rajouri City wherein Zonal, District Presidents and Blocks besides office bearers of these units were also present. The meeting was chaired by Distict President Rajouri Urban Shafayat Ahmed Khan.He said that people in the far off belts are protesting on a daily basis seeking basic facilities like power, potable water and other civic infra but the govern-

ment is busy in rhetoric and misleading about changing the course of life of people through development, which in actual is nowhere on ground. "This shows that there is much difference between words and deeds of the government as far as development is concerned because not only backward blocks but the entire J&K is facing development dearth as indifference of concerned quarters galore in the region", Gupta said, adding that government authorities are in deep slumber while the people are confronting issues and difficulties with regard to health, civic infra, power and water shortage. The condition of the road from snot to Kalakote is in worse condition which proved utterances of govt are hollow slogans. And the performance of government on ground level is

abysmal with people facing the brunt of development deficit.

Rattan Lal Gupta said that the BJP which relies on divisive politics during elections will face stiff reaction in the J&K as its ploy to divide society on ethnic and religious basis won't work here. He said that both Gujjars and Bakervals are close to the NC and so do the Paharis, and therefore attempt to divide people on different lines to take political mileage will boomerang for the BJP as on ground electorate knows the truth of this divisive party which is masquerading to be the Messiah of the masses. He said that the development works in the far flung areas have been stalled due to fund diversion and mismanagement. "Works initiated during NC's regime are yet to be completed and the

Niabats and other Administrative units sanctioned under the NC regime are in shambles because the present regime showed indifference of the highest level. Shortage of Specialist doctors in Rajouri medical college has put the lives of people at stake", he said adding that BJP is desperately attempting to vitiate the atmosphere by spreading canards and provoking people by whipping up communal passions just for having an edge during the polls. The senior NC leader cautioned the people about dangerous designs of divisive parties active in J&K as these could go to any extent just to satiate their vested interests.

He emphasized on strengthening the slogan of Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah about Hindu, Muslim and

Sikh Itihaad. "NC believed in communal harmony, brotherhood and camaraderie, which is the true spirit of Jammu and Kashmir's pluralistic ethos", he maintained.

KVK Reasi promotes organic vegetables farming

REASI: Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Reasi under the aegis of Directorate of Extension, Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology of Jammu (SKUAST-J) is promoting the organic vegetables farming in Reasi distt. of J&K. KVK, Reasi scientists are providing the technical know-how on the scientific cultivation of organic vegetables to the farmers. Sr. Scientist & Head of Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Reasi, Dr. Banarsi Lal said that KVK, Reasi is endeavoring to enhance the income and employment of the farmers of the area by the introduction of new ventures in the district. He narrated that there is huge scope of organic vegetables in Reasi distt. of J&K as the distt. is visited by millions of pilgrims across the nation and there are number of hotels/restaurants at Katra and other areas of the distt. He informed that the organic vegetables are important crops and have multiple health benefits. He said that organic vegetables are a rich source of vitamins, minerals and antioxidants. He added that intake of organic leafy vegetables lowers the cholesterol levels and protects neuronal cells of the body. He informed that the regular inclusion of leafy vegetables in salads is known to prevent osteoporosis, iron-deficiency anaemia, cardiovascular diseases, age-related muscular disease in the elderly people,

cancers and Alzheimer's disease. He narrated that organic vegetables such as lettuce has low calorie content and zero fat. He further informed that it is a good source of chlorophyll and Vitamins A, B1, B2, C and K, folic acid and manganese. He informed that the KVK scientists are stressing on organic and natural farming and upgrading the knowledge of the farmers for the preparation of organic formulations such as Jeevamrit, Beejamrit, Ghanjeevamrit, Panchgavya, fermented butter milk, cow urine etc. so that they can utilize them for their organic vegetables production. He added that organic vegetables have more quality and farmers can fetch more money by growing them. He further said that by observing the successful results of organic vegetables growers many new farmers are coming forward for the organic farming. According to Prof.& Head, Division of Plant Physiology, SKUAST-J, Dr.Gurdev Chand that quality organic vegetables can also be grown in green house, poly house or hydroponically and said that they have an immense marketing potential. He discussed on the nutritional and packaging practices in organic vegetables crops for more profits. He guided on the technical knowhow on increasing the shelf life of organic vegetables so that the farmers can generate more farm income.

into a single Society of MoES. Dr Jitendra Singh said that the move is in tune with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's directive to avoid duplication and aim for greater integration to achieve

the maximum output. He said, PM Modi not only has a natural predilection for science but has also been forthcoming in supporting and promoting science and technology based initiatives and projects over the last 8 years.

Apart from Dr Jitendra Singh, who is the President of the Society, Members, Dr.M. Ravichandran, Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences, S. Somanath, Secretary, Department of Space, Dr. N. Dr Jitendra Singh said, Ministry of Earth Sciences has taken the notion of "Marine Surveillance" to a new level, where Space appli-

cations are also being deployed to share the valuable inputs with the Security Agencies. The Minister informed that Oceansat will be launched on 26th of November; 2022 and preparation for a NASA-ISRO Radar System is at an advanced stage. He also informed greater use of Global Navigation Satellite System, GNSS, as one of the key sources of position information, alongside radio navigation systems, which exchange information with nearby ships and land-based vessel traffic services (VTS) on a vessel's position, course and speed.

Jammu can't be Smart City till roads are freed from parking: LLLSI

JAMMU: Two-third part of the Jammu roads is covered by private vehicles parked on both sides of these roads leaving only one-third portion for general traffic which leads to lengthy traffic jams at every step and creating lot of hardships to the public. Some vehicles beyond economic repair and others rarely used are permanently parked on these roads as if the space is allotted to their owners. These private vehicles

with which the Jammu city is over-flooded provide comfort to a few people but creates lot of hardships to public. Patients some time are unable to reach the hospital and breathe their last in the ambulance because their sirens go unheard. The Jammu Smart City with ever increasing pressure of private vehicles will in this way, render any number of parking accommodation as irrelevant.

of India (LLLSI) had been endeavoring and requesting the Government for the last one decade to give specific attention to this issue and take suitable steps to solve this ever growing problem.

President LLLSI Santokh Singh Komal had appealed to the Government to take a decision to ban such road parking and let the road be made free for use for the purpose these are constructed. LLLSI had sug-
