The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH), Government of India, New Delhi has amended Central Motor Vehicle Rules, 1989 under which Automated Testing Stations (ATSs) shall be established for Testing of Fitness of Motor Vehicles.
As some applicants are facing problems in completion of documentary formalities required to apply for Preliminary Registration Certificate as envisaged in Rules as such the applicants shall be granted initially the Provisional Registration Certificate.

 - He shall fulfill all conditions as per Central Motor Vehicle Rules under Chapter XI Recognition, Regulation and Control of Automated Testing Station.
 - He shall submit all formalities as desired by the Registering Authority.
