instant ease the trial court has disagreed and not accepted the final charge sheet of the CBl. On the contrary the trial court has directed fresh investigation in the matter under the supervision of a new officer fore, no scheduled offence which is required to be investigated by the respondents. The respondents are summoning the family members of the petitioner, including the petitioner and some other persons, for the investigation purposes without any authority of law and without jurisdiction. The respondents have even failed to collect any evidence with regard to the market value of the land in question, which as per the market value is less than one crore of rupees.

As per the admitted of the prosecution (CBI) the petitioner is in possession of excessive land. as envisaged by Section 14 of the J&K Agrarian Reforms Act, 1976. The CBI has placed on record all the sale deeds and the gift deeds pursuant to which the petitioner is allegedly retaining the excessive disputed land. The value of the entire land is reflected in the said documents. As per calculation the total value of the entire land is less than thirty lacs. As per the ECIR in question the petitioner has been charged for the offence under Section 3 of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act.
