**Public Notice**  
Air pollution, as defined under the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, includes noise pollution. High Ambient Noise levels can have deleterious effects on human health. The Noise Pollution (Regulation & Control) Rules, 2000 were notified with the objective of maintaining ambient air quality standards in respect of noise.  
It is provided in the said Rules that: -

1. Noise levels in any area / zone shall not exceed the prescribed standards in respect of noise for the area.
2. Loudspeaker or Public Address system shall not be used without obtaining written permission from the competent authority.
3. Loudspeaker or Public Address system shall not be used at night time (10.00 P.M. to 6.00 A.M.).
4. Noise levels at the boundary of the public place where Loudspeaker or Public Address system is being used, shall not exceed 10dB (A) above the ambient noise standards for the area or 75dB (A), whichever is lower.
