While some opposition members such as Adhir Ranjan Chowdhary have already submitted their dissent notes, a few others are likely to submit in the next two days. The committee, the sources said, has stuck to the Hindi names given to the bills

Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam bills in Lok Sabhaon August 11 during the Winter session. They are meant to replace the Indian Penal Code, The Code of Criminal Procedure and the Indian Evidence Act and were sent to the committee for scrutiny with a three-month deadline.

Shad had described the current set of laws guiding the criminal jurisprudence as a colonial legacy, a reference to their British Raj provenance, and asserted that they focussed on punishment while the proposed laws give primacy to justice.

The 30-member committee is headed by BJP MP Brij Lal.

The committee has recommended taking a more stringent view of deaths caused by negligence amid criticism that the current statute is too lenient, the sources said. The committee has also proposed a reduction in sentence for those convicted of deterring public servant from discharging their duties

The sources said the Section 353 of the Indian Penal Code provides for a maximum of two years of prison term and the committee may seek to slash it to one year. The law is often used against those staging protests and many members of the committee are of the view that common protesters should be dealt with leniently.

It has been reported that the committee has backed a gender-neutral adultery law and punitive measures for non-consensual sex between men, women and transgender people among other recommendations.

Israel has so far rejected US suggestions for a pause in fighting to facilitate humanitarian aid deliveries and the release of some of the estimated 240 hostages seized by Hamas in its raid. Israel has also dismissed calls for a broader cease-fire from increasingly alarmed Arab countries including Jordan and Egypt, which made peace with it decades ago.

After days of intense diplomacy around the Middle East, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken wrapped up his tour of the region on Monday, saying efforts to secure a humanitarian pause, negotiate the release of hostages and plan for a post Hamas Gaza were still "a work in progress" without pointing to any concrete achievements.

The war has also stoked wider tensions, with Israel and Lebanon's Hezbollah mil itant group trading fire along the border. In another sign of growing unrest, a Palestinian man stabbed and wounded two members of Israel's paramilitary Border Police in east Jerusalem before being shot dead, according to police and ar Associated Press reporter at the scene. Israel captured east Jerusalem, along with Gaza and the West Bank, in the 1967

Mideast war. The Palestinians want all three territories for a future state. Israe annexed east Jerusalem in a move not recognised by most of the international community and considers the entire city its capital. In northern Gaza, a Jordanian military cargo plane air-dropped medical aid to a

field hospital, King Abdullah II said early Monday. It appeared to be the first such airdrop of the war, raising the possibility of another avenue for aid delivery besides Egypt's Rafah crossing, which has so far been the only entry point.

Over 450 trucks carrying aid have been allowed to enter Gaza from Egypt since October 21, but humanitarian workers say it's insufficient to meet mounting needs in the territory, which is home to some 2.3 million Palestinians. (AP)

#### Court made absolute bail of suspended Dy SP ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: Special Judge Anticorruption Srinagar Surinder Singh made absolute bail to suspended Dy SP Sheikh Adil.

Court observed that counsel for the accused/petitioner stated that the accused has complied the directions of this court, and has appeared before the investigating agency as and when directed. He has further argued that the accused is no more required by the investigating agency as the investigation of the case stands completed. Spl PP already filed objections to the application. Nothing substantial was put forth by the prosecution to rebut the plea of the counsel for applicant seeking interim bail to be made absolute inter-alia on the grounds projected by him. No any doc ument has been brought on record by prosecution or the investigating officer against the accused before this court which would suggest that accused have violated any condition of bail. The accused is presumed to be innocent till the guilt is proved. The personal liberty of accused is precious as guaranteed by the constitution of India. In view of the above made discussion, the interim bail granted vide order dated 14-10-2023 is made absolute subject to the little modification in the condition (iv) of bail order that he will not leave the jurisdiction of this court without prior permission of the court or I.O as the case may be.

### CAT issues directive on suspension ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: The Central Administrative Tribunal, Jammu has directed the Secretary, School Education Department, Jammu to conclude the inquiry of suspended lecturer within a period of two months. The Judicial Member Rajendra Dogra has direct ed that if the inquiry is not completed within a period of two months, the suspension shall be deemed to have been revoked.

Abhinav Sharma, Sr. Advocate, who appeared for the applicant Harmohinder Singh, argued that the applicant who was suspended on 11.03.2023 is still under suspension for more than 06 months. No charge-sheet was issued and neither any inquiry was initiated against the applicant so it is bad in the eyes of law. The Court observed that the Supreme Court has in a catena of cases held that a person can not be suspended endlessly and the department has to issue charge-sheet within a period of 90 days, in case, if they fail to do so, then they have to review the suspension order by passing a reasoned order, then it can be extended for another 90 days. After 180 days, there is no provision to keep an employee under suspension without serving him charge-sheet and inquiry reports In this case, the applicant is under suspension for more than 06 months and no charge-sheet has been given and no inquiry was conducted, which is bad in eyes of law and Court directed the respondents to conclude the inquiry within a period of 02 months from the date of the order otherwise suspension would cease to exist
