Recipes

Gur Choorma Laddoo



Ingredients
2 cup whole wheat flour
water as required
1/2 cup jaggery
refined oil as required
1 cup powdered green cardamom
1 dash salt
5 tablespoon ghee
1/4 cup crushed almonds
1 dash nutmeg
poppy seeds as required

Method:
To make this traditional Gur Choorma Laddoo, take a large bowl and 2 cups of whole wheat flour and add 3 tablespoons of ghee and mix it nicely. Next, add a dash of salt and gradually add water; knead a dough and make dough balls.

Next, heat a pan and add oil to fry the dough balls. Once the oil is hot, deep fry the Choorma balls. Transfer them to a plate and allow it to attain room temperature.

Grind these dough balls and make a coarse powder. Take a large bowl and using a sieve and spoon, extract the Choorma mixture. Keep it aside.

Next, heat another pan and add 2 tablespoon of ghee, once the ghee melts add in ½ cup sugar/ jaggery, make sure there are no lumps. Next add this ghee blend to the Choorma mixture along with a teaspoon of cardamom powder, a dash of nutmeg and crushed roasted almonds to add a crunchy taste.

Make a smooth dough, grease your palms and roll small laddoos. Then roll the Choorma Laddoos on some poppy seeds. Enjoy anytime!
