"We give high priority to our strategic partnership with Nigeria...I am confident that a new chapter in our ties will begin folowing our talks," the prime minister said.

Modi also described the around 60,000-strong Indian expatriate community as a key pillar of India-Nigeria relations and hanked Tinubu for ensuring their welfare.

The prime minister also announced that India is sending 20 tonnes of relief supplies for Nigerian people hit by last month's floods. He also referred to the African Union becoming a permanent member of the G20 at the India-hosted summit of the grouping last year and described it as a significant outcome.

Before the delegation-level talks, Modi and Tinubu held one-on-one meeting at the Presidential Villa.

The prime minister was also accorded a ceremonial welcome.

Both sides are likely to ink a number of agreements following the delegation-level talks.

Modi is in Nigeria as part of a three-nation tour. From Abuja, he will travel to Brazil to attend the G20 summit. His last des ination will be Guvana

The India-Nigeria ties were elevated to the status of a "strategic partnership' during then Prime Minister Manmohan Singh's isit to the African nation in October 2007.

Nigeria has been a close partner of India for over six decades.

New Delhi established its diplomatic House in Lagos in November 1958, two years before Nigeria became independent ir 1960. The presence of a large Indian expatriate community of about 60,000, the largest in West Africa, adds value to the importance of the long-standing relationship between the two countries. There are more than 200 Indian companies who have invested about USD 27 billion in all important manufacturing sectors and these companies are the second largest employers after the federal government, according to Indian officials.

India has emerged as a development partner of Nigeria on two fronts -- by offering developmental assistance through conces ional loans (USD 100 million) and by offering capacity-building training programmes.

The age limit has been raised from 30 to 35 years, while the upper age limit for reserved category candidates is now set at 37 years and for persons with physical disabilities at 38 years. This change was formalised in an order issued by the Jammu and Kashmir government within this month.

The National Conference, having secured a notable comeback by winning 42 out of 90 assembly seats in the region's recent elections, has set a promising tone for governance in Jammu and Kashmir as it enters this new chapter with a renewed focus on the welfare of its citizens, the functionary said.



RAJGIR: Defending champions India stormed into the semifinals of the Women's Asian Champions Trophy with an unbeaten record, defeating Japan 3-0 here on Sunday.

Continuing her stellar form, star striker Deepika netted a quickfire brace from penalty corners in the final quarter to seal the victory, following vice-captain Navneet Kaur's opener in the 37th minute. With this win, India topped the league stage with maximum 15 points from five matches, ahead of Olympic silver medallists China (12 points). India will take on fourth-placed Japan in the semifinal on Tuesday, while China will play third-placed Malaysia in the other lastfour game. Deepika, the tournament's leading scorer, now boasts 10 goals, including four field goals, five penalty corners, and one penalty stroke, underscoring her dominance.
