# 'Escalation of terrorist attacks in J&K sparks concern' LFO-BHF organises menstrual hygiene

Sham Lal Gupta, Chairman of the Anti-Corruption Bureau (NGO), has raised serious concerns over the recent surge in terror activities in Jammu and Kashmir, highlighting the growing impact on the region's security and stability. The latest wave of attacks has not only resulted in the tragic loss of lives among civilians and security personnel but has also deepened anxieties regarding the safety of communities in the area. Gupta's statement comes at a time when the frequency and intensity of militant incidents have seen a marked increase, casting a shadow over the region's already complex security landscape.

In recent months, Jammu and Kashmir has experienced an alarming escalation in violence, with terrorists targeting both civilians and members of the armed forces. These attacks have included ambushes, grenade blasts, and encounters in various districts, causing widespread fear and impacting the everyday lives of the region's residents. Many of these incidents have occurred in areas

previously considered relatively stable, indicating an unsettling shift in the terrorists' strategies and expanding areas of influence. Security forces, in turn, have ramped up their counterinsurgency operations, engaging in heightened surveillance numerous combing operations aimed at tracking down the perpetrators and preventing further attacks.

Gupta, in his statement, highlighted the urgency for a cohesive strategy to address this growing crisis. He pointed out that while the security forces are making significant efforts to curb militancy. there is a need for more proactive measures to ensure long-term peace. "The safety of our civilians and the bravery of our soldiers are of utmost importance. The rising number of incidents calls for a collective response from all stakeholders involved. We must work towards a comprehensive solution that addresses the root causes of terrorism and strengthens the region's security framework," Gupta said. His remarks underscore the necessity for a multipronged approach that incorporates not only military actions but also socio-economic initiatives to counter the appeal of terrorism among vulnerable segments of

The increase in terrorist activities has also raised concerns about the influence of external elements in fueling violence in the region. Authorities suspect that support from across the border has been instrumental inproviding resources and intelligence to terrorist groups, allowing them to carry out well-coordinated attacks. In response, the Indian government has intensified its diplomatic efforts to address cross-border terrorism and is engaging in discussions with international allies to put pressure on nations believed to

be aiding these groups. In the wake of these incidents, calls for community vigilance have become stronger. Local leaders and civil society organizations are encouraging residents to report suspicious activities and support security efforts aimed at restoring peace. The government, on its part, has emphasized the importance of intelligence-sharing and collaboration between various agencies to curb terrorist infiltration and disrupt their networks.

Sham Lal Gupta's concerns echo the sentiments of many in Jammu and Kashmir who long for a peaceful, stable environment free from the specter of violence. The rising attacks pose a critical challenge, underscoring the need for sustained efforts and cooperation across all levels of governance to safeguard the region's future and protect its people.
