the safety of underage children, petrol pumps in Jammu have put up posters declaring "no fuel for vehicles driven by minors". The Jammu and Kashmir

Directorate of School Education (DSE) has also issued a circular prohibiting minor students from driving motor vehicles, including two-wheelers and fourwheelers, to school.

The poster, first displayed at petrol pumps in the Gandhi Nagar area on the Jammu-Pathankot highway reads, "No fuel for minors". "The poster, which specifically focuses on minors rid-

ing two-wheelers without helmets or four-wheelers, is aimed at ensuring the safety of children," said an employee of the petrol pump.

NIA raids multiple locations in J&K to probe cases of terrorist infiltration, attacks

NEW DELHI: The NIA on Thursday conducted searches at multiple locations in five districts of Jammu and Kashmir in connection with a case related to infiltration by terrorists from across the border and recent attacks on security forces and civilians.

According to an official National statement, Investigation Agency (NIA) teams conducted the raids at eight locations in the Reasi. Udhampur, Doda, Ramban and Kishtwar districts.

It said the searches led to the seizure of various materials showing linkages between terrorists of banned outfits with overground workers (OGWs) and hybrid terrorists whose premises were searched.

Premises of sympathizers and cadres of the banned outfits were also searched as part of the crackdown,

the statement by the antiterror agency said. "The suspected hybrid ter-

rorists and OGWs of today's searches were linked with the newly-formed offshoots and affiliates of the banned terrorist outfits," it added.

The searches are part of an investigation in a case registered by the NIA on October 24, based on information regarding the infiltration of active terrorists belonging to Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and Jaish-e-

Mohammed (JeM) into Indian Territory through the International Border and Line of Control, the statement said.

These infiltrations were facilitated by OGWs and other terror associates based in villages in the Jammu region who were engaged in providing logistical support, food, shelter and money to the terrorists, it said, adding that further investigations are continuing in the case

The report highlighted discrepancies in the distribution of ration for Below Poverty Line (BPL) and Antyodaya The case begun after the Anna Yojana (AAY) benefici-

aries. A detailed departmental reconciliation confirmed the irregularities.

Deputy Four Superintendents of Police led the investigation, uncovering that the accused had shown an excess issuance of BPL and AAY food grains far beyond the authorised quantities, they said.

The proceeds from this excess ration were allegedly misappropriated and swindled.

Of the 13 accused, seven have passed away, one has been granted bail, one surrendered in court, and the

remaining four were arrested and produced in the court at the time of filing the

chargesheet, they said. The Crime Branch had previously investigated a similar ration scam in 2004, which was also challaned by the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB).


NEW DELHI: A Delhi court on Thursday urged the District Judge to transfer the Jammu and Kashmir terror-funding case to a court designated to try lawmakers after observing one of the accused, Engineer Rashid. was now a member of Parliament.

Additional Sessions Judge Chander Jit Singh, who was also scheduled to pass an order on Rashid's application seeking regular bail, sent the case file to the District Judge, who would likely hear matter on November 25.

Apart from the case lodged by the NIA and the bail application of Rashid, the judge also recommended transferring a related money laundering case to the special court.

Rashid was elected from the Baramulla constituency in the Lok Sabha elections and has been lodged in Tihar Jail since 2019 after the NIA arrested him under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act in the

Thursday slammed Rahul Gandhi's attack on Prime Minister Narendra Modi over the US prosecutors' indictment of Gautam Adani on alleged bribery and fraud charges as part of his long-

running efforts to target its leader and noted that none of the four states named in American courts had a BJP government.

Addressing a press conference, BJP spokesperson and MP Sambit Patra steered clear of the US Justice Department's allegations against the infrastructure behemoth, saying it is for the company to give an explanation and defend itself.

JDA demolishes Kashmiri migrants' shops in Jammu; sparks protests, condemnations

JAMMU: The Jammu Development Authority has demolished a dozen shops belonging to displaced Kashmiri Pandits in Jammu city, allegedly without issuing notices, sparking protests from various sections that demanded action against the officials.

The demolition drive was launched on Wednesday, targeting shops built by displaced Kashmiri Pandits near the Muthi camp three decades ago, officials said.

The old shops were located on land belonging to the Jammu Development Drive carried out to clear land for construction of 208 flats for Economically Weaker Sections: JDA clarifies JAMMU: Clarifying its stand, the Jammu Development Authority (JDA) on Thursday stated that the demolition

Govt lists 15 bills including Waqf bill for winter session of Parliament

Draft report ready: Waqf panel head NEW DELHI: The govern-

NEW DELHI: The chairman of the Joint Committee of Parliament scrutinising the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, Jagdambika Pal, said on Thursday that the panel's draft report is ready amid opposition members' demand for an extension of its November 29 deadline for more deliberations. "Our draft report is ready. We will soon give a date for clause by clause discussion on its recommendations," Pal told reporters after an almost six-hour meeting of the committee during which the Minority Affairs ministry presented a detailed justification for the amendments proposed by the government in the Waqf Act.

Opposition members will meet Speaker Om Birla on November 25, the first day of Parliament's winter session, to push for their demand for an extension. They said they need more time to raise questions and seek clarifications.

Pal said the committee has engaged in an exhaustive deliberation with a gamut of stakeholders, and all its members were allowed opportunity to pose questions and seek replies as he suggested that all that is left now is for the panel to discuss the draft report.
