received moderate snowfall, they said.

There was trace precipitation in the plains of Kashmir, including parts of Srinagar and Budgam districts, during the night, the officials said and added

that the day temperature dropped due to the snowfall in the higher reaches. The minimum temperature, which had fallen below freezing point last week

The trouble started on Sunday morning when a large group of people gathered near the mosque and started shouting slogans as the survey team began their work in the Shahi Jama Masjid.

District officials said the survey was planned in the morning to avoid interference with the mosque prayers that are usually held in the afternoon.

Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav lashed out at the BJP, saying the rul ing party, government and the administration orchestrated the violence "to divert attention from electoral malpractice".

According to the local administration, a second survey by an "Advocate Commissioner" as part of a court-ordered examination into the disputed site started around 7 am and a crowd began gathering there.

"The survey was proceeding peacefully until a group of people gathered near the mosque and began raising slogans. When the police attempted to clear the area, a group of miscreants in the crowd started pelting stones at the police, said the Moradabad Divisional Commissioner.

He said the people involved in the violence were likely incited by individuals with vested interests aiming to disrupt peace in the area.

Superintendent of Police Krishna Kumar Vishnoi said, "The police used

minor force and tear gas to bring the situation under control." He said those who engaged in stone-pelting and those who incited them will

be identified and action taken against them.

"We are in the process of registering an FIR," the police officer added. District Magistrate Rajendra Pesia said, "Some miscreants resorted to stone pelting but the situation is peaceful now. Around 10 people have been detained in connection with the stone-pelting incident. They are being inter-

rogated." Uttar Pradesh police chief Prashant Kumar told PTI that the situation was under control in Sambhal.

"We are monitoring everything. All police and civil administration officials are handling the situation on the spot. They are patrolling those areas. Antisocial elements will be identified very soon and strict action will be taken against them," the director general of police (DGP) said.

Additional police units have been deployed near the mosque to ensure law and order and officials are closely monitoring the situation

On Saturday, the Sambhal district administration bound down 34 people on a bond of up to Rs 10 lakh on apprehension of a breach of peace. Subdivisional Magistrate Vandana Mishra told PTI on Saturday that among the people bound down is Mamlukur Rahman Barq, the father of the

IPL mega auction: Pant, Iyer fetch record bids; Salam of J&K bought by RCB for Rs 6 crore

JEDDAH: Resurrected generational talent Pant pipped Shreyas Iyer to become the costliest buy in IPL's history with a Rs 27 crore winning bid from Lucknow Giants, Venkatesh Iyer was the surprise show-stopper as teams expectedly broke the bank for marquee Indian players at the mega auction

here on Sunday. Royal Challengers Bengaluru have signed up Rasikh Salam for Rs 6 crore at the IPL 2025 The auction. Bengaluru-based outfit made the opening bid Sunrisers before

Hyderabad joined the race.

Sunrisers Hyderabad opted against bidding when Challengers Roval Bengaluru raised the price to 2 crore. Delhi Capitals then exercised the RTM option. Royal Challengers Bengaluru then raised the bid to Rs 6 crore and Delhi decided against matching the bid.

Shreyas, who captained the Kolkata Knight Riders to the title earlier this year, and Delhi Capitals' icon Pant, reaped the benefits of making themselves available at the auction following differences with their respective teams.

Venkatesh was also a part of Shreyas' triumphant KKR outfit and the franchise had to pay a whopping Rs 23.75 crore to bring him back via the Right to Match card after not retaining him.

The big-hitting all-rounder, who has become an integral part of the KKR setup over the years, gained from an intense bidding battle between the Kolkata side and Royal Challengers Bengaluru to end with a massive sum. Shreyas, on the other

hand, was the first one to surpass Mitchell Starc as the IPL's most expensive with cash-heavy Punjab Kings shelling out Rs 26.75 crore for their potential captain before Pant overtook the fellow Indian by attracting Rs 25

Former DC teammates

Shrevas and Pant have had

to deal with adversity in the past couple of years but have shown remarkable resilience and courage to Pant beat all odds to

make a successful comeback to international cricket after a life-threatening car accident in 2022 while Shrevas put behind his exclusion from the BCCI central contracts list to lead KKR to their third IPL trophy earlier this

Delhi Capitals used the Right To Match to buy back Pant at Rs 20.75 crore but LSG raised the bid to Rs 27 crore and the former decided against matching that amount.

PBKS, who went into the auction with the maximum purse -- Rs 110.5 crore, -had the resources to go after the players they wanted including Shreyas, Yuzvendra Chahal (Rs 18 crore), Arshdeep Singh (Rs 18 crore) and Marcus Stonis (Rs 11 crore).

Rajasthan Royals, having retained six players, had the least amount to spend -- Rs 41 crore -- and they were spectators for a majority of day one. Their only buys were injuryprone pacer Jofra Archer (Rs 12.5 crore) and Sri Lankan spinner Maheesh Theekshana (Rs crore).

Among the second set of leg-spinner players, Yuzvendra Chahal drew an impressive winning bid of Rs 18 crore from Punjab Kings while former LSG captain KL Rahul turned out to be a bargain buy for Delhi Capitals at Rs 14

India pacer Mohammed Shami, who recently made a comeback from injury, was bought by SunRisers Hyderabad for Rs 10 crore. Among others, Punjab Kings bought back left-arm seamer Arshdeep Singh for Rs 18 crore via RTM while South African speedster Kagiso Rabada, who was released by Punjab Kings, was bought for Rs 10.75

crore by Gujarat Titans. Australian veteran Starc

got a much lower price than last year's Rs 24.75 crore and was sold to Delhi Capitals for Rs 11.75 crore this time. England's Jos Buttler went to Gujarat Titans for Rs 15.75 crore.

"Starc is a match-winner. he is a wicket-taker and we couldn't be happier. And with KL Rahul, again somebody who we believe is a bankable player, will give you runs each season," said DC head coach Hemang

After the lunch break it was Venkatesh's hefty price tag that attracted the most attention. Another significant devel-

opment was India veteran

Badani.

R Ashwin going back to the franchise of his home city -- Chennai Super Kings. CSK paid Rs 9.75 crore to secure Ashwin, who broke into the India squad following his exploits at the

franchise under Mahendra Singh Dhoni. Devon Conway and Rachin Ravindra were two good buy backs for CSK in the session, going for Rs 6.25 crore and Rs four crore respectively.

Destructive Australian batter Jake Fraser McGurk went back to Delhi Capitals for Rs nine crore after the franchise exercised its RTM. However, IPL stalwart David Warner had no takers on the opening day of the auction as he went unsold at a base price of Rs two crore. Similar was the case of Indian batter Devdutt Padikkal. They might come back in the accelerated auction on Monday.

Towards the end of the day, it was time for fast bowlers to land fat paychecks. Among them were Josh Hazlewood (Rs 12.5 crore, RCB), Prasidh Krishna (Rs 9.5 crore, Gujarat Titans), Avesh Khan (Rs 9.75 crore, LSG), Trent Boult (Rs 12.5crore, Mumbai Indians) and Archer.

This is the second time an IPL auction is being held outside the country after last year's event in Dubai.
