NEW DELHI: Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh announced here today that India is set to launch the European Union's Proba-3 Space Satellite by India in the first week of December, marking another milestone in its burgeoning role as a global space leader.

Disclosing this while speaking at the "India Space Conclave 3.0", Dr Jitendra said, this underscores the partnership deepening between India and the EU in space research and exploration. This mission, aimed at observing the Sun, signifies both nations' commitment to advancing scientific knowledge while reinforcing the reputation of the Indian Research Organisation (ISRO) as a trusted partner in international space missions. "Today, there are over 300, fuelling an entire industry and creating jobs across the country." This surge in

startups has not only curbed the historic brain drain but has also attracted Indian talent back from abroad. particularly from agencies like NASA, which previously drew many of India's brightest space scientists.

In his address, EU

Ambassador to India and

Bhutan, Herve Delphin, emphasized the significance of the Indo-European partnership in space, describing India as a "cost-effective, dynamic space power of the first order." Commending achievements, including the recent success of the Chandrayaan-3 mission, Mr. Delphin stated that the European Union views India as a natural ally in the realm of space exploration and innovation. He highlighted that both the EU and India are consolidating their roles as influential space powers, sharing a mutual

NEW DELHI: At the 70th Annual Meeting of the General Body of the Indian Institute of Public Administration, the Vice President of India, Jagdeep Dhankhar presented the prestigious Paul H. Appleby Award for the year 2024 to Jalil Ahmed Khan, wellknown former senior IAS officer of J&K, for his exceptional contributions to public administration and his dedicated service to the IIPA. The Vice President is also the President of the IIPA.

J A Khan is the eighth retired senior civil servant of Jammu & Kashmir and member of the Regional Branch of IIPA to receive this coveted award, which is a rare distinction.

J A Khan, a distinguished IAS officer of the 1967 batch of Jammu and Kashmir cadre, has been an outstanding civil servant of the state's administration who during his chequered public service spreading over 44 years, has to his credit several administrative achievements and earned all round respect for his integrity, administrative acumen and brilliance. He was an authority on J&K's financial management and headed the Finance Deptt, for more than a decade. Following his superannuation, he served as Economic Advisor to the J&K Government from 2009 to 2013, utilizing his expertise to shape the state's economic policies. The key positions he held included Divisional Commissioner of Kashmir & Jammu, Chief Electoral Officer of Jammu and

Industries & Commerce and Finance Departments. Khan's significant contributions to public service were recognized with a Gold Medal from the State Government in 1997.

As a founding member of the J&K Regional Branch of IIPA, established in the late 1970s, Khan played a vital role in its growth and development. His leadership as Chairman from 1995 to 2003 revitalized the branch during challenging times, particularly following the disturbances in the region. His efforts were instrumental in securing Government support, including Grant-in-Aid for organizing vital programs that addressed pressing public issues in Jammu and Kashmir.
