# Continue dry spell effects water bodies of picturesque Bhaderwah Valley; maximum areas under major potable water crisis

BHADERWAH: Majority of areas in Bhaderwah are facing major water crisis as continue dry spell is effecting water bodies, who are main source of water supply.

Bhaderwah Valley Jammu and Kashmir which is known for it's numerous water bodies including hundreds of natural water springs, now is reeling under serious potable water crisis due to prolonged dry spell, these water bodies are drying up very rapidly making common local populations in general and environmentalists in particular a worried lot.

Bhaderwah valley is facing major drinking water crisis due to continuous dry spell in the region and as a result of which the water bodies have largely dried up and glaciers



which is also effecting tapped water supply in maximum areas of Bhaderwah.

According to a recent report, 70 percent population of Bhaderwah town and it's peripheral areas use only natural springs water for drinking, as these are found

in abundance in every locality of the valley, but due to prolonged dry spell since September, these springs have started drying up effecting locals in a big way and leaving not only them in a state of tizzy but also environmentalists are apprehending a major water crisis.

Local Mohd Ayaz Khan and Educationist Arif Rana said that earlier there was continue local rains throughout the year, but now situation has been totally changed due to large scale deforestation and man made disasters to the nature in the area, which are increasing effects of global warming.

Meanwhile Jal Shakti Vibhag also confirmed the shortage of water supply in the area due to depletion of sources in view of dry spell.

Jal Bhaderwah Iqbal Singh said that, "it's true that water supply to the households has been effected to some extent but it's not fault of department as sources are depleting due to dry spell."

"We hope that, in coming days the area receive good

# SSP traffic rural Jammu reviews Jhiri Mela traffic management

SAMBA: SSP Traffic Rural Jammu Vinay Kumar, reviewed the Traffic management in the jurisdiction of Samba Kathua in light of the forthcoming Jhiri Mela, as a part of ongoing efforts to ensure road safety. A review meeting with the Traffic Police Personnel at Jatwal Samba was held and the participants were accordingly briefed that in view of the Annual Jhiri Mela, large number of devotees/public gathering use to pool in the buses/trucks/goods carriers and also tractor/trolleys to reach Jammu other from the neighbouring states viz Punjab/HP /Haryana etc. and intra state vehicles. During past, it has been witnessed that the devotees usually indulged in overloading which endangered the precious human lives. As such to ensure incident free pilgrimage, strict traffic regulation without any favour to overloading/road obstructions in the interest of devotees/ road users. Kumar directed the jawans that they shall remain very much alert and careful to avoid the fatal / non fatal accidents. No overloaded vehicle shall be allowed to proceed from Lakhanpur towards Jammu, rather shall be reverted back with a brief video clipping. However, the drivers of the devotee's vehicles be properly & politely guided and diverted towards the appropriate route to reach their destination. It was impressed upon the officers that the vehicles shall be got parked in the designated parking and get advance assessment of the additional traffic volume during peak hours/ lagte evening hours

during the pilgrimage. The officers were directed to have a close coordination with the local administration / Police and other stakeholders/enforcement agencies for launching joint drives against the visible traffic violations especially during the Jhiri Mela pilgrimage . Further shall also liaise with concerned NHAI authorities for immediate road repairs on the construction sites/ erection of temporary sign boards/ barricades and other road safety meas-

to the devotees. It shall be ensured by the field agencies approaching routes towards the main Venue (Jhiri) falling in their jurisdictions are kept free from all sorts of obstructions/traffic chaos for hassle free movement of devotee's vehicles and extend all possible assistance from traffic point of view to the pilgrims. It was also suggested to the officers that diversions and alternative routes for the general public shall also be kept in the plan and given wide publicity in print/social media on need

The officers and officials in the meeting were directed to intensify its enforcement and regulatory measures to reduce traffic congestion and accidents. Zero-tolerance policy shall be adopted for reducing the visible traffic violations like over speeding, over charging of passenger fare reckless driving, wrong parking, non-usage of helmets/seat belts, using mobile phones, triple riding, use of pressure/ honking horns, wrong lane driving obedience of traffic signals. It was emphasised upon the officers that in view of increasing traffic pressure on the roads/NHW of Traffic Samba Kathua and its peripheral/outskirts especially during peak / evening hours, the supervisory officers shall remain present in their respective AsOR for traffic regulation. During peak hours shall concentrate upon the traffic regulation to keep the roads worthy for hassle free traffic movement to have effective traffic management in view of the annual religious festival. It was impressed upon the jurisdictional Dy SP to ensure con-

the public regarding the traffic changes through the medium of social and print media for the convenience of pilgrims and general public. The jurisdictional officers ( DTIs) were also directed to chalk out a plan and discuss with the field traffic officers with regard to the challenges faced during last Jhiri Mela and its resolution. They shall also professionally keep a standby plan to have a quick response and clearance of blockages and accidents on the roads/NHWs.

Vinay Kumar also directed to the participants to enhance patrolling at highaccident zones and key intersections especially during peak hours, conduct regular vehicle inspections for roadworthiness and emission compliance, impart councelling sessions/traffic awareness campaigns to the drivers/vehicle operators as well as to the passengers/all road users. It was urged upon the Police Personnel to fully utilize the services of the PA systems/ patrolling bikes for regular announcement to keep the roads/NHWs free for hassle free passage to the during the Jhiri During duties all DTIs/SOs(T) shall ensure to give Traffic awareness to general public/motorists to obey/follow the traffic rules for their safety and avoid fatal/non fatal accidents.

The jawans were directed to ensure strictly that apart from discharging the traffic duties they shall also discharge the duties of social services by extending help to the needy/old age persons for crossing the roads and other duties in the interest of humanity. The field formations of Traffic Rural Jammu were directed to maintain high discipline/integrity while on

### Eligibility:

For Anganwadi Workers

The candidate must be domicile of the UT of J&K. Women candidates in the age group of 18-37 years shall be eligible.

The candidate should be a resident of the electoral ward where Anganwadi Centre is situated. Name in the voter list for the ward shall be considered as the proof of residence of the candidate. In case the name of the candidate appears in the voter list along with her parents, then she must

provide certificate of being un-married issued by the concerned Tehsildar. Where ever, there is any dispute as to residence for any reason, then a residence proof certifying the ward of residence from the concerned SDM/ACR shall be considered. Minimum qualification for Anganwadi Worker shall be 10+ 2 and maximum graduation. In case no

10+2 pass candidate is available in the ward, 10+2 pass candidate from the adjoining ward shall be considered which would require prior approval of Mission Director, Mission POSHAN. In case suitable candidate is not available for adjoining ward, candidate from the nearest ward within the ward can be considered subject to the approval of the MD. Mission POSHAN. Weightage shall be given on the basis of marks obtained in 10+2 and selection shall be done purely on merit basis and no other criteria to be considered.

In case of tie in merit of the eligible candidate, candidate with higher age will be preferred. Candidate with qualification higher than graduation shall not be considered.

For Anganwadi Helpers

The selection of Helper shall be restricted to the electoral ward where Anganwadi Centre is

Women candidates in the age group of 18-37 years shall be eligible.

The candidate must be domicile of the UT of J&K.

Minimum qualification for Anganwadi Helper shall be matriculation and the selection shall be made purely on the basis of merit.

In case no matriculate candidate available in the ward, candidates with qualification not less than 8th standard shall be considered. In case, no candidate apply where the post is advertised shall be considered from the adjoining ward.

The committee shall select the most destitute/needy married woman of the ward as helper from amongst those who fulfil the qualification criteria.

In case, no married candidate is available, an unmarried candidate may be considered. In case eligible candidate is available within the family of retiring AWWs/AWHs, the said candidateshall qualify for additional two percent points.
