## Dr. Varinder backs crackdown on terror-linked Govt employees

JAMMU: Dr. Varinder Sharma, Co-Convenor of the Health Cell, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Jammu and Kashmir, today emphasized that the termination of government employees aiding militancy should not be politicized, as the safety and integrity of Jammu & Kashmir take precedence over all political considerations. "Those who misuse government positions to nurture terrorism and fundamentalism have no place in service. Lieutenant Governor has taken a bold and necessary step to protect the future of our youth and ensure peace and sovereignty," he stated.

Welcoming the recent dismissal of two government employees found aiding terrorist networks, Dr. Sharma said the action reflects the Government's firm stance

support structures within the Union Territory. "This year alone, six employees have been dismissed in three separate orders, and last vear several officials were rightfully removed. These measures are part of a consistent approach to eliminate terror networks from government

institutions," he added. Expressing concern over the involvement of educators in radicalizing children, Dr. Sharma noted, "Two teachers - Ghulam Hussain of Reasi and Majid Iqbal Dar of Rajouri - misused their positions to support Lashkar-e-Taiba, aiming to poison young minds rather than perform their duties. Their dismissal, based on credible intelligence, is fully justi-

He recalled a previous case where a teacher aided terrorists responsible for the Baisaran, Pahalgam massacre, highlighting the need for proactive action.

Responding to former Chief Minister Omar Abdullah's remarks on dismissal without conviction, Dr. Sharma said, "This is a matter of national security, not political ideology. The law empowers the government to remove individuals posing threats when credible intelligence exists. Terror supporters do not deserve the privilege of serving the State.'

He assured that the rights of genuine citizens and employees remain protected, while stressing that strict action against anti-national elements must be swift and decisive. Dr. Sharma appealed to political parties and civil society to support firm measures against terrorism, stating, "Peace, progress, and the future of Jammu & Kashmir depend on rooting out terrorism from every corner-be it jungles, borders, or offices.

### Devotees to observe Prabodhini Ekadashi with devotion fervour

JAMMU: Prabodhini Ekadashi, also known as Dithwan Ekadashi, is celebrated on the Shukla Paksha Ekadashi of the Kartik month.

On this sacred day, it is believed that Lord Vishnu awakens from His divine sleep (Yoga Nidra), spreading righteousness, virtue, and auspicious energy throughout the universe

Explaining the significance of the day, Swami Amit Shukla said that, according to the Padma Purana, when Narad Muni asked Lord Brahma about this Ekadashi, Brahma Ji revealed that Prabodhini Ekadashi destroys sins, increases virtue, and grants salvation. Observing a fast on this day is considered equivalent to performing a thousand Ashwamedha Yajnas and a hundred Rajasuva Yainas.

Swami Ji added that those who observe this fast are blessed with prosperity, wisdom, happiness, and fulfillment of desires.

On this day, devotees should offer water in a conch shell with Tulsi leaves, perform Panchamrit Abhishek, and worship Lord Vishnu with sixteen ritual offerings (Shodashopachar). Bathing, donating, chanting, and performing Hawan in Lord Madhav's name are said to yield eternal blessings. He further mentioned the special significance of Tulsi worship in the Kartik month-offering even a single Tulsi leaf brings immense merit. On this day, the Tulsi-Shaligram Vivah (divine marriage of Goddess Tulsi and Lord Shaligram) and sugarcane worship are also observed with devotion. Concluding his address, Swami Amit Shukla said that Prabodhini Ekadashi is not iust a religious observance but a divine opportunity for self-purification, righteous living, and spiritual awakening. Even a small act of goodness performed on this sacred day brings infinite blessings. He urged devotees to engage in vigil, service, and devotion to fill their lives with harmony, peace, and divinity.
