observed in memory of those who lost their lives in the recent car bomb blast in Delhi and the explosion at Nowgam Police Station in Jammu and Kashmir. The Union Home Minister said that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, eliminating terrorism from its roots is our collective commitment. He said that in line with the track record of the Modi government so far, the culprits of the Delhi bomb blast will be traced even from the netherworld, brought before the country's judicial system, and given the strictest possible punishment.

Amit Shah said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision is that strong states create a strong nation, and Zonal Councils play a very important role in translating this into reality on the ground. Zonal Councils are extremely important for dialogue, cooperation, coordination, and 'policy synergy'. Many types of problems have been resolved through these councils. He emphasized the continuance of all-out efforts to ensure speedy justice in crimes against women and children and also eradicate malnutrition and stunting. Laying stress on speedy investigation in cases of sexual offenses and rape under the POCSO Act against women and children, Shah said that no civilized society can accept such heinous crimes. He said that the safety of women and children is our top priority, for this the number of Fast Track Special Courts (FTSC) should be increased.

Union Home Minister said that the sectors of cooperation, agriculture and fisheries can become important means of eradicating poverty and providing employment. He said that poverty is being eradicated and employment is increasing through cooperation, agriculture, and fisheries. Referring to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's mantra of "Sahkar Se Samriddhi" (Prosperity through Cooperation), Shah said that the cooperative sector holds immense potential for employment. He said that only through growth in employment - especially selfemployment - along with Gross Domestic Product can we realise the dream of a Developed India. He said that GDP alone is not an indicator of a country's prosperity; true prosperity is achieved only when every individual rises above the poverty line. He said that the Government of India's Ministry of Cooperation has initiated 57 measures across the country to strengthen the cooperative sector. These include computerisation of Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS), establishment of three new national-level cooperative societies, and the setting up of Tribhuvan Sahkari University.

Amit Shah said that the original spirit and role of Zonal Councils is advisory, but in the last decade they have been accepted as action-oriented platforms and have delivered results. He said that with follow-up, we have not only accepted issues between states, between regions and states, and between the Centre and state governments, but also created concrete pathways for their resolution. Shah said that our goal is clear - Regional Strength along with National Progress and India's Global Leadership in every field, which will lead us towards the creation of a Great India. The Home Minister said that all states should work in mutual coordination to resolve water resource management and water-related problems

He said that compared to 2004-2014, the number of Zonal Council meetings from 2014 to 2025 has increased by about two-and-a-half times, and we have made these meetings meaningful. He said that between 2004 and 2014 there were a total of 25 meetings of Zonal Councils and Standing Committees, whereas from 2014 to 2025 till now, 64 meetings have been held. He said that more than doubling the number of meetings reflects Prime Minister Modi's concept of TEAM Bharat. In these meetings, 1600 issues were discussed and 1303 issues (81.43 percent) were resolved. This has been possible due to the cooperation of all state governments, union territories, and central ministries and departments, with the Inter-State Council Secretariat playing an active role.

Amit Shah said that this year marks the 150th anniversary of the creation of Vande Mataram. At one time, Bankim Chandra Chatterjee's great composition Vande Mataram became the clarion call for our country's freedom. Today, the Government of India and all states are working together to once again make it the clarion call for building a Great India. He said that this is an effort to instil the values of patriotism in India's younger generation. Shri Shah appealed to all states and union territories to rekindle the spirit of patriotism among the country's youth through the Vande Mataram song.

Referring to the implementation of the three new criminal laws, the Union Home Minister said that their enforcement has yielded very positive results. Under the new laws, the conviction rate has increased by approximately 25 to 40 percent and culprits are receiving timely punishment. He said that state governments need to make further efforts for effective implementation of these laws. At the same time, the Home Minister requested all state governments to upgrade technology from investigation and forensic analysis to online linking of courts.

were barred from entering the court premises, which virtually turned the proceedings 'in-camera'. According to NIA's remand paper, Ali's custodial interrogation was required to uncover the entire conspiracy.

It said that Ali, the registered owner of the vehicle used in the incident, allegedly provided logistical support to Umar. The remand paper also claimed that Amir had arranged a safe house for Umar in the days leading up to the blast.

It said that the blast's precision and intensity had been deliberately designed to instil fear in the minds of the public, besides causing alarm and panic.

Underscoring the seriousness of the alleged plot, it said that the act was intended to threaten and destabilise the nation's sovereignty and unity.

The agency also told the court that Ali would be taken to Kashmir for further investigation.

The judge then allowed the National Investigation Agency's (NIA) plea seeking custodial interrogation of the accused for 10 days.

A heavy deployment of Delhi Police and the Rapid Action Force (RAF) was seen outside the court premises, besides personnel equipped with anti-riot gear on standAli was likely the last person to have been in contact with Dr Umar Nabi

The remand comes a day after the NIA announced Ali's arrest for allegedly con spiring with "suicide bomber" Nabi to execute the terror attack.

The NIA investigation showed that the vehicle used in the blast was registered in Ali's name, who had travelled to Delhi specifically to facilitate the purchase of the

The vehicle was subsequently used as a "Vehicle-Borne Improvised Explosive Device (VBIED)" to carry out the attack. Nabi had known links with a "white-col lar" terror module that was recently busted following the recovery of explosives, pri marily from Faridabad in Harvana on November 10.

As reported by PTI earlier, Nabi, a 28-year-old doctor from Pulwama, emerged as the most radicalised and key operative in the network spanning Kashmir, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh.

Officials believe he was planning a powerful VBIED blast timed around the Babr Masjid demolition anniversary on December 6.

The plot, however, fell apart when a meticulous investigation by Srinagar police resulted in the arrest of Dr Muzammil Ganaie from Al Falah University in Harvana's Faridabad and the seizure of a huge cache of explosives.

The breakthrough is believed to have triggered panic in Umar, ultimately ending in the blast outside the Red Fort that left 13 people dead.

The intricate interstate terror network was exposed after a small but significant incident of JeM posters appearing on the walls in Bunpora, Nowgam, on the out skirts of Srinagar, on October 19.

Srinagar police registered a case and reviewed CCTV camera footage, leading to the arrest of three locals -- Arif Nisar Dar alias Sahil, Yasir-ul-Ashraf, and Maqsood Ahmad Dar alias Shahid, all with prior stone-pelting cases against them. Their interrogation led to the arrest of Maulvi Irfan Ahmad, a former paramedic

turned-Imam from Shopian, who allegedly supplied the posters and used his access

So far, eight people have been arrested by the Jammu and Kashmir Police in con nection with this case.

The NIA will now interrogate Ali to uncover the full extent of the conspiracy and his role in the deadly terror plot.

A motorcycle bearing registration number JK02CP-5240, owned by accused Mohd Razak, son of Gafoor Ahmed resident of Treen, Tehsil Katra, has been attached under Section 68-F of the NDPS Act, 1985.

The action follows a thorough financial investigation conducted by Police Station Katra during the course of FIR No 198/2025 under section 8/21/22/29 NDPS Act, P S Katra. The enquiry established that the said vehicle was purchased from the proceeds of illicit trafficking of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, qualifying it as an illegally acquired asset under NDPS provisions.
