"For the structural damage, I have talked to the MLAs, a case is being prepared and whatever we can give according to the procedure, we will, and the rest, because the blast took place in the police station, it is hoped that these house owners should get relief from the funds available with the Home Department and with the LG," he said.
Asked if the government will provide a job to the family of the tailor, Mohammad Shafi Parray, who lost his life in the blast, Abdullah said his kin should get the job.
"There used to be SRO (Statutory Rules and Orders) for such cases, now its name has been changed, but the scheme is the same. A government job is provided as compensation to the families of those killed in such incidents. I will tell the government officers to process the case for the tailor's family and as soon as it comes to us, we will approve it," the CM added.
Nine people -- five personnel from the police department and four civilians -- were killed, and 32 others sustained injuries in an accidental blast in Nowgam police station.

He noted that the ICCC functions as the central hub for real-time monitoring, communication, and decision-making, enabling seamless coordination among various agencies during both routine and emergency situations.
The CEO underscored the importance of conducting mock drills at regular intervals to ensure that the Shrine Board's disaster management teams, in coordination with all stakeholder agencies, remain fully prepared to respond swiftly and effectively to any emergency.
He instructed representatives of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) to organise such drills frequently to further enhance readiness and inter-agency coordination.
Emphasising strict adherence to the prescribed Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), the CEO reiterated the need for meticulous compliance in all aspects of disaster preparedness.
To bolster the Shrine Board's disaster management capabilities, the CEO directed a thorough inventory audit of Disaster Management Stores located along the track and within the Bhawan area. The stores will be replenished and upgraded wherever required.
Meanwhile, authorities conducted a comprehensive fire safety awareness and mock drills in two sectors enroute to Mata Vaishnodevi cave shrine, officials said.
The exercise, carried out at Tarakote and Banganga sectors on Trikuta Hills in Reasi district, was part of their continued focus on safety preparedness and disaster management along the pilgrimage route from Bhawan to Katra, the base camp of the temple, officials said.
"The mock drills were conducted enroute to the cave shrine to enhance efficiency, coordination and on-ground response of all concerned units in the event of a fire emergency," a senior official of the Mata Vaishnodevi Shrine Board said.
He said the awareness sessions included demonstrations on the use of fire extinguishers, methods of fire containment, evacuation procedures, and immediate steps to minimise potential damage to life and property.
"The participants were sensitised about identifying fire hazards, emergency communication protocols, and the importance of timely response," he added.
The exercises were carried out under the supervision of the respective area heads, ensuring close coordination between all concerned wings.
Shrine Board officials from multiple units, including Enforcement, Security, Sanitation, and Electrical wings, actively took part in the mock drill, the official said.
Personnel from the police, Central Reserve Police Force, private security personnel, and sanitation officials were also present, reflecting a strong inter-agency commitment to maintaining safety along the pilgrimage route.
At Banganga, local shopkeepers also participated in the drill, showcasing strong community involvement in safety initiatives, the official said. Their participation further enhances the preparedness of frontline stakeholders who operate near key points of pilgrim movement.
The Shrine Board conducts such exercises at regular intervals to ensure that all personnel remain well trained, alert, and equipped to respond effectively during emergencies.
These initiatives align with the Board's mission of providing a safe, secure, and seamless pilgrimage experience to devotees visiting the holy shrine every year.

Delhi blast case. They said that during the operation, a doctor working in the SMHS Hospital here and his wife were detained.
The CIK teams seized multiple digital devices and incriminating material having direct relevance to the investigation. The recoveries include five mobile phones, five SIM cards, a

tablet device, and additional digital and documentary evidence and literature, they said.
The doctor, a government employee, was found indulging in online unlawful activities, misusing his official position and social legitimacy to engage in behaviour detrimental to public order and national security, the officials said.
During the course of the investigation, it has also emerged that the detained individuals were misusing their positions and social standing to mask unlawful activities, they said.
"The female suspect, in particular, is alleged to have been involved in radicalizing local women through curated online and offline engagements, pushing divisive narratives, and influencing vulnerable groups under the pretext of community interaction," they said.
Her alleged affiliation with banned terrorist organization Dukhtaran-e-Milat is currently under investigation. This dimension of the case highlights a concerning trend of the exploitation of social roles and professional facades to advance disruptive agendas, they added.
The officials said all recovered devices are undergoing detailed forensic analysis, which is expected to unravel a broader digital network linked to organized propaganda efforts. Early leads indicate the possibility of a wider ecosystem of collaborators and sympathizers, whose activities were aimed at amplifying extremist content and manipulating public perception, they said.

displays zero tolerance towards terrorism in all its forms and manifestations. There can be no justification, no looking away and no whitewashing," the EAM said.
Jaishankar also emphasised on the prevailing economic situation globally and the importance of fostering greater cultural ties in the influential bloc.
"We assess the global economic situation to be particularly uncertain and volatile currently. Supply side risks have been aggravated by demand side complexities. There is consequently an urgent requirement to de-risk and diversify. This is best done by as many of us, forging the widest possible economic links," he said.
For that to happen, it is essential that this process be "fair, transparent and equitable," the EAM said.
"India's endeavours to conclude free trade agreements with many of us here are relevant," Jaishankar said.
And, India's long-standing ties with SCO members makes it particularly pertinent, he added.
"As a civilisational state, India strongly believes that people-to-people exchanges lie at the core of any genuine relationship. Facilitating greater interaction between our intellectuals, artists, sports people, and cultural icons will pave the way for greater understanding across the SCO," the external affairs minister said.

involved in a major terror module and the subsequent car blast near the Red Fort in Delhi on November 10, and the recovery of arms and ammunition, including an AK rifle, from the locker of a doctor at GMC Anantnag on November 8.
"We are conducting a check of all the lockers as part of a routine exercise. We have sought keys from the locker holders. They will be checked and re-allotted," Principal of Government Medical College, Dr Ashutosh Gupta, told PTI.
"This is part of a routine exercise. We maintain a logbook of the lockers. It is to maintain transparency," he said.
Similar locker checkups are being conducted at the SMGS hospital in Jammu, they said. Authorities have already conducted this exercise at the Government Medical College and SMHS Hospital, Srinagar, to identify and label their personal lockers last week.
The circular issued by the Administrator, Associated Hospitals, Srinagar, came in the wake of the Anantnag recovery.

traditional requirement of locus standi where only aggrieved parties could seek redress.
"Parallel to this procedural innovation, the Supreme Court was also embarking upon an exercise of expanding the scope of Article 21 of the Constitution (right to life) to include environmental protection, building on its broad language and humanistic interpretation," he said.
The top court judge said that the "fusion of PIL and expansive interpretation of Article 21" became the "bedrock" of India's environmental jurisprudence, and thereafter, from the 1980s onwards, the apex court delivered a series of path-breaking judgments, firmly establishing environmental principles in Indian law.
Justice Singh, however, said that the Supreme Court often faced the challenge of making complex scientific and ecological determinations without having expert infrastructure at its disposal.
He said that the experience of major industrial disasters, such as the Bhopal Gas Tragedy of 1984, was a wake-up call, following which the top court largely followed the legal principle of strict liability.
He further said the "uniquely Indian principle of absolute liability" arose in the 1986 case of M C Mehta versus Union of India, where it was held that enterprises engaged in hazardous activities bear full responsibility for any harm, with no exceptions.
Justice Singh said that subsequent rulings by the apex court introduced the 'Polluter Pays' and 'Precautionary Principles'.
"The Supreme Court has progressively adopted a range of innovative strategies to enhance the administration of justice, extending beyond environmental matters to diverse areas of public concern," he said.
The judge said that by the 1990s, India's environmental jurisprudence entered a phase of consolidation, building upon the foundations of the 1970s and 1980s, as the Supreme Court began to lay down comprehensive environmental policies through its rulings, which, under Articles 141 and 142 of the Constitution, became binding on all authorities and citizens unless altered by legislation.
By invoking its expansive writ jurisdiction and through the innovative use of PILs, the Supreme Court transformed itself into a guardian of environmental governance, Justice Singh said.

Couple among 7 drug peddlers arrested

JAMMU: Seven drug peddlers, including a couple, were arrested along with narcotic substances from different places in Jammu, Udhampur, Poonch and Samba districts of Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday, police said.
Anjad Khan alias Taiya and his wife Shamshad Akhter alias Putti were apprehended from a suspected drug hotspot in Sakinderpur Kothey area of Jammu's Bishnah, a police spokesperson said.
He said 22.45 grams of heroin were recovered from their possession.
Manohar Lal, a resident of Paddar area of Kishtwar, was nabbed along with 422.90 grams of charas during vehicle checking at Udhampur's Jakhani, the spokesperson said, adding that Lal was riding a motorcycle and was on way to Jammu when he was intercepted by police.
Another drug peddler, Sunil Kumar, was arrested after 472.27 grams of charas was seized from his bag during checking at Tikri in Udhampur, he said.
Police arrested one more drug peddler, Inam-ul-Haq of Surankote, and seized 11.20 grams of heroin from him during frisking at Fazlabad Bridge in Poonch district, the spokesperson said.
He said all the five arrested drug peddlers were booked under separate cases of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.
Samba Police also arrested two drug peddlers in the jurisdiction of Police Station Vijaypur and recovered approximately 06 grams of heroin (chitta) like substance from their possession. A Police party of Police Station Vijaypur during vehicle checking at AIMS Naka Vijaypur, intercepted a motorcycle bearing registration number JK02AU-1653 for its checking which was coming from Samba side. During frisking, approximately 06 grams of heroin like substance was recovered from the possession of both rider and pillion rider.
