9 drug peddlers arrested; contraband substances recovered

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police have arrested 09 drug peddlers in Shopian, Budgam & Pulwama and recovered contraband substances from their possession. In Shopian, a police party of Police Station Zainapora at a checkpoint established at Kashiwa-Zainapora axis, intercepted two suspicious persons. They have been identified as Mohd Zafran Lone, resident of Tanger, Ramban & Irfan Yatoo, resident of Verinag, Kapran, A/P both working at Pandit Colony, Allowpora, Keegam. During search, charas-like substance weighing approximately 190 grams was recovered from their possession. They have been arrested and a case vide FIR No. 103/2025 under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Zainapora and investigation has been initiated. In Budgam, acting on specific information, a police party of Police Post Humhama, at a checkpoint established near Salsabeel Educational Institute, Humhama intercepted two suspicious persons who on seeing the police party tried to flee from the spot but were apprehended tactfully. During their personal search, heroin-like substances weighing about 18.4 grams was recovered. They have been identified as Javid Ahmad Lone, son of Bashir Ahmad Lone, and Sakir Rashid, son of Ab. Rashid Dar, both residents of Humhama. They have been arrested and a case FIR No. 307/2025 under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Budgam, and investigation has been initiated. In Pulwama, a police party of Police Station Pulwama at a checkpoint established near veterinary point at Dangerpora intercepted a motorcycle (registration number JK02BT3985) ridden by 02 persons. Upon search, officers recovered 553.5 grams of Charas chora and 19 grams of Charas-like substance from their possession. They have been identified as Abrar Ahmad Yatoo, son of Ghulam Nabi, resident of Sonachuk Rajpora & Waqar Ahmad Chopan, son of Ghulam Mohammad, resident of Gund Hyder Dangerpora. They have been arrested and a case vide FIR No. 257/2025 under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Pulwama and investigation has been initiated. Vehicle used in the commission of the crime was also seized. Moreover, a police party of Police Station Pulwama at a checkpoint established at Mughalpora intercepted a motorcycle (registration number JK13B/0269) ridden by 03 persons. They have been identified as Parvaiz Ahmad Kasana, son of Mir Hussain, resident of Chawan Keller, Bilal Ahmad Gorsi, son of Mohammad Sadiq, resident of Zampathri Shopian & Ruksar Ahmad Gorsi, son of Bashir Ahmad, resident of Zampathri Shopian. Upon search, cannabis weighing 29.5 grams, 31 grams, and 22 grams respectively was recovered from their possession. They have been arrested and a case vide FIR No. 256/2025 under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Pulwama and investigation has been initiated. Vehicle used in the commission of the crime was also seized.

Life imprisonment to man in brutal murder case

GANDERBAL: In a significant achievement towards ensuring justice and upholding the rule of law, J&K Police has successfully secured conviction in a brutal murder case. Absconder arrested evading law for over two decades

2 vehicles seized for illegal excavation, transportation of minerals

The police team, by using all possible means and technical assistance, developed some leads and succeeded in tracing the missing lady on 01-11-2025. After completing all codal formalities, the lady was handed over to her husband, and the missing report was accordingly closed.

Drug peddler apprehended with Charas

DODA: In a continued drive against the menace of drug trafficking, Doda Police apprehended a person and recovered a Charas-like substance from his possession during a surprise naka checking in the Thathri area. A police team of Police Station Thathri, while conducting surprise naka checking at Link Road Phagsoo near Zero Point at about 1500 hours, noticed one person approaching the naka point from the Jangalwar side. On seeing the police party, the individual tried to hide himself and moved hurriedly towards Thathri. Sensing something suspicious, the police team immediately intercepted and apprehended him. During his personal search and preliminary inquiry, about 45 grams of Charas-like substance was recovered from his possession. The accused has been identified as Komit Singh Rana, son of Chander Prakash, resident of Gundow, Jakayas, Tehsil Chilli Pingal, District Doda. In this regard, a case FIR No. 66/2025 under Sections 8/20 of the NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Thathri, and investigation has been set into motion. SSP Doda, Sandeep Mehta (JKPS), reiterated that Doda Police is committed to intensifying its efforts against drug peddlers and safeguarding the youth from the scourge of narcotics.



Criminal arrested with Glock pistol
