Qatar has exposed Pakistan's lies: Gaurav on Al Jazeera showing full J&K as India

JAMMU: "Al Jazeera's updated map showing the whole of Jammu & Kashmir as part of India is not just a correction it is a diplomatic message to Pakistan that the world no longer buys its fabricated narrative."

With these firm words, Gaurav Gupta, BJP J&K Spokesperson and Convenor International Affairs, reacted to the Qatar-based broadcaster's decision to air an India map that includes Jammu & Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan.

Gupta said the change amounts to a "long overdue recognition of India's sovereignty," calling it a moment that reflects shifting regional equations and Doha's declining willingness to stand behind Pakistan's long-peddled claims.

According to him, the development must be seen against the backdrop of Pakistan's rapidly eroding regional credibility. "Pakistan's foreign policy inconsistencies, its collapsing ties with the Taliban, and its inability to honour key defence commitments have left it isolated. Qatar's map correction shows that the region is no longer captive to Islamabad's outdated rhetoric," Gupta

He argued that Pakistan's miscalculations from cross-border strikes in Afghanistan to prioritising Saudi Arabia over Doha have weakened its influence in the Gulf, allowing a more truthful, balanced understanding of Kashmir to emerge.

"By displaying the correct map of India, Qatar has delivered a clear signal. It recognises India as a reliable, responsible partner and rejects Pakistan's hollow propaganda. This strengthens India's diplomatic standing at a critical time," he added.

The shift comes as India-Qatar ties

continue to deepen across energy, security, economic and strategic domains. Gupta emphasised that Al Jazeera's new depiction aligns naturally with the trajectory of the India-Qatar partner-

This is not merely a map change. It is Qatar telling Pakistan that truth matters, stability matters, and responsible global leadership matters. The world is moving forward, even if Pakistan refuses to." Gupta remarked.

Diplomatic observers say the move sends a clear message to Islamabad, whose influence in the Islamic world has diminished amid internal chaos, economic instability, and foreign policy missteps.

As discussion grows across strategic circles, Gupta concluded by highlighting the leadership behind India's growing international stature "This moment reflects the global respect India commands today under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. His decisive foreign policy, strong global engagement and unwavering stand on national sovereignty have ensured that the world recognises India's position with clarity and respect."

CS advocates robust lifelong skilling ecosystem for J&K

JAMMU: Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo on Thursday convened a high-level meeting of concerned officers and academicians to deliberate upon the proposed action plan of the Skill Development Department (SDD) for initiating a comprehensive mega skilling programme for the population of Jammu & Kashmir in the productive age group of 18-39

The meeting, held to chart

out a structured roadmap for transforming J&K into a skilled and employment-ready workforce hub, was attended by Additional Chief Secretary, Education Higher Department; Principal Secretary, Finance; Managing Director, J&K Bank; Vice Chancellor, BGSBU; Secretary, Skill Development; Secretary, School Education; Managing Director, Skill Development Mission: Director SDD: senior faculty members and Deans from universities, IIT Jammu, and other eminent academic and technical institutions. besides senior officers of the administration.

Speaking in the meeting, the Chief Secretary underscored the critical importance of creating a robust and sustainable platform for skilling the youth of J&K, describing skilling as a continuous and evolving process that cannot be achieved in a short span of time.

He maintained that establishing a strong foundational ecosystem would provide the necessary momentum and allow gradual expansion and strengthening of skilling initiatives in future.

He emphasized the urgent need for a well-defined and targeted action plan to skill lakhs of individuals in the 18-39 age group, enabling them to enhance their employability and secure sustainable liveli-

Drawing parallels with sectors such as medicine and engineering, he highlighted how the creation of dedicated regulatory



frameworks like NMC and AICTE, along with premier institutions such as AIIMS. IITs and NITs, led to the systematic development of trained

manpower and attracted pri-

vate sector participation.

The Chief Secretary called for emulating a similar model in the skill development sector, stressing its alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. He underlined the necessity of defining clear roles for schools, colleges, universities, institutions of excellence like IITs, IIMs, AIIMS, and technical institutions such as ITIs and Polytechnics.

He further stressed that the success of this model should be measured through tangible outcomes, with strong linkage to employment whether through self-employment or private sector placements.

Participants from academic institutions and stakeholder departments shared valuable insights and assured their full cooperation by contributing resources, expertise and manpower to ensure the effective implementation and success of the proposed action plan in accordance with its core objectives.

Secretary, Development Department, Kumar Rajeev Ranjan, elaborated on the roadmap, stating that the proposed framework envisions skilling as a lifelong process beginning right from school education. He outlined a structured approach whereby students from Classes 6th to 9th would be imparted foundational vocational skills.

He further explained that at the collegiate level, a 'Career Launchpad' model would be introduced, offering minor skilling courses in digital and technology skills, business, finance, entrepreneurship, green energy, creative and design fields, complemented by soft skills, workplace readiness and structured placement support.

Director, Skill Development, Shahzad Alam, informed that technical institutions would be transformed into industryready skilling hubs in collaboration with MSMEs. This would involve curriculum revision, capacity building of trainers and infrastructure upgradation, Polytechnics being strengthened and eventually developed into a dedicated Skill University for J&K.

The meeting also highlighted the importance of integrating short-term skilling mid-career programmes, upgradation courses and competitive examination packages to institutionalize lifelong learning as a social and economic norm. This would encourage individuals to continuously invest in enhancing their professional competencies throughout their careers.

Among the key ecosystem

enablers discussed were effective placement coordination mechanisms, skill financing solutions, introduction of 'Skill Passports' reflecting individual skill scores, and establishment of a comprehensive institutional framework for continuous monitoring and evaluation of skilling initiatives across J&K.

Shailendra Kumar chairs Pre-Budget review meeting for Agriculture, Horticulture

JAMMU: Additional Secretary (ACS) , Agriculture Production Department (APD), Shailendra Kumar, on Thursday chaired a Pre-Budget meeting to review and discuss the Revised Estimates (RE) 2025-26 and Budget Estimates (BE) 2026-27 the Agriculture and Horticulture sectors of Jammu & Kashmir.

The meeting focused on a detailed review of expenditure and proposed allocations under CAPEX, HADP, SASCI, CSS and NABARD.

Present in the meeting were Secretary in APD, Director APD,, Finance Director (Planning) APD, Managing Director JKAGROS; Secretary Kisan Advisory Board; Director Agriculture, Director Horticulture, Director CAD Jammu; Director Sericulture; representatives of SKUAST-J & SKUAST-K; Joint Directors of Agriculture and allied Deputy Director sectors: Agriculture (Planning); Chief Agriculture and Horticulture Officers of Jammu Division, scientists and senior officers of the



During the meeting, the ACS emphasized that special attention is being given to ensure expenditure under HADP, CSS and CAPEX aligns with long-term infrastructure development goals of the agriculture and horticulture sectors. He conducted an extensive review of CSS components under Krishonnati Yojana, highlighting flagship schemes including PMKSY, PDMC, SMAM, RAD, RKVY, PKVY, ATMA, NFSM, and

others aimed at promoting rural prosperity and farm sustainability.

He issued clear instructions to all the departments under the APD to integrate awareness on stray animal management during every extension activity, noting that this is also in compliance with directions of the Supreme Court. He stressed that stray animals must not be seen within office premises and directed that Nodal Officers be appointed in each department to monitor and manage stray animalrelated responsibilities.

Reviewing the PDMC component,

he stressed strengthening of the micro-irrigation initiatives. He directed the officers to enhance farmer awareness regarding microirrigation facilities and associated subsidies. He added that the greatest benefits must reach the farmers who have adequate water availabil-

en programmes.

ity for irrigation expansion. He further instructed that Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) be circulated to all departments, ensuring that no work is executed outside approved project guidelines. He directed all the departments to submit Utilization Certificates (UCs) and ensure financial achievements are reported within one month.

ACS also reviewed the progress on JKCIP, discussed existing bottlenecks and directed that yearwise targets be communicated to all Chief Officers for effective and timely implementation.

The meeting concluded with a call for coordinated efforts across all wings of the Agriculture Production Department to ensure efficient budgeting, timely project execution and strengthened farmer-centric service delivery.
