RTI activist demands urgent construction of Multi-Tier Parking at GMC, SMGS to resolve parking crisis

JAMMU: Renowned RTI and Social Activist of & Kashmir, Balvinder Singh, has urged the State Government, Health Department, and particularly the Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, to immediately address the worsening parking crisis at Government Medical College (GMC) Jammu and SMGS Hospital.

In a statement issued today, Singh highlighted that both prestigious hospitals have undergone a significant expansion in medical infrastructure and bed capacity over the years.

He said "Ten years ago, GMC Jammu had a capacity of 500 beds, which has now increased 1,066 Similarly, SMGS Hospital, which began with 150 beds, has now expanded to 750 beds, with an additional 250



shortly. Despite this massive growth, the supporting infrastructure-particularly parking facilities-has not kept pace.

Singh acknowledged that the hospital authorities have indeed made sincere efforts to accommodate the maximum number of vehicles within the limited parking

However, the existing facilities are grossly insufficient

He therefore urged the government to construct multitier (multi-level) parking facilities at both institutions, emphasizing that such structures are the only sustainable and long-term solution to the worsening space He further pointed out

that due to the acute shortage of designated parking spaces, visitors are compelled to park outside the hospital premises, often on congested approach roads and restricted zones. This not only causes severe traffic congestion but also leads to challans being issued for alleged wrong parking, even when visitors have no alternative. Patients, attendants. and even emergency vehicles are facing continuous hardships because of this longpending issue.

Singh stressed that the situation has now reached a

tates immediate government intervention. Establishing multi-tier parking facilities at GMC and SMGS would significantly ease public inconvenience, streamline vehicular movement, and support the expanding healthcare operations of these vital institutions.

He further warned that if timely action is not taken, the problem will intensify in the coming years due to the steadily increasing patient load in Jammu city. Addressing this parking crisis, he said, is not merely a matter of convenience but an essential requirement for ensuring smooth, efficient, and accessible healthcare delivery.

Singh urged the authorities to treat this matter with utmost seriousness in the larger interest of the people
