JAMMU: In keeping with its policy of promoting heritage sites and lesser frequented beauty spots of Jammu through a series of short treks, Tawi Trekkers J&K, the pioneer trekking club of Jammu, shall start its winter activities with a soft adventure picnic in the Mansar-Mohoregarh area.

The first batch of about 135 students shall undertake this picnic trek on November 15 which shall be followed by many other groups on subsequent days.

The target for participation in the one-day soft adventure picnics during the winter season has been fixed at 2000 which the club hopes to achieve by the end of December this year.

However, this activity



shall continue to the end of February, 2025.

Whereas Shashi Kant, a trained mountaineer shall be the leader of the first group, Sonam Sidharth, Sumit Khajuria, Sushil Singh, and Shilpa Charak shall be among the leaders of the other groups. Every group shall be escorted by at least two other activists of the club.

It is pertinent to mention here that Tawi Trekkers J&K has been exploring

the possibilities of linking Purmandal, Mohoregarh, Bhupnagar, Dhergarh, Mansar, Surinsar and Pahar Devta for creating an adventure and heritage cum pilgrim circuit. Accordingly, the club has been regularly conducting reconnaissance of these areas for making them a winter hub of soft adventure activities like adventure camps/ picnics and short heritage treks.

The efforts of the club have already started bearing fruits as during the last four years about 4000 boys and girls have participated in the one-day treks organized by the club from Mohore Garh to Mansar; Dher Garh to Mansar; Bhupnagar to Mansar; from Kattal Batal to Aitham via Bhed Devta and to Devi Pindian near Panthal in Reasi District.

Vishal dazzles again with 5-wicket haul as J&K ends Day 3 at 65/3, chasing Gujarat's imposing 320

AHMEDABAD: Continuing his exceptional run of form, left-arm spinner Vishal Kumar delivered another masterclass with the ball, weaving magic against Gujarat's batting line-up at the Narendra Modi International Stadium, Motera, Ahmedabad.

Fresh off a stellar 9-wicket performance against Meghalaya, including a five-wicket haul, Vishal once again proved to be the game-changer for Jammu & Kashmir. After being



asked to bat first, Gujarat posted a competitive total of 320 runs in their opening innings. Kushan Shyam

Patel anchored the innings with a resilient 97 off 227 balls, laced with 12 boundaries, while Rudra Mayur Patel contributed a solid 56 runs off 128 deliveries, including 7 fours and 1 six.

Vishal Kumar stood out among the J&K bowlers, claiming 5 wickets for 80 runs from 30.4 overs, effectively restricting Gujarat's scoring. Manit provided key support with 3 wickets, while Sarvashish chipped in with 2 crucial breakthroughs. In response, Jammu & Kashmir found

themselves under pressure at stumps on Day 3, reaching 65/3. Akash Ayoub Bhat led the reply with 31 before perishing, while Mehran Ahmed Mir (6) and Udhay Partap Singh (5) were also dismissed. Yuvraj Saini (13*) and captain Shivansh Sharma (1*) will look to rebuild when play resumes.

For Gujarat, Shen Patel struck twice and Kushan Shyam Patel picked up a wicket, keeping J&K on the back foot as the contest heads into a critical phase.
