'Goli Ka Jawab Goley Se' if Pak terrorists attack India again: Amit Shah

DARBHANGA/MOTI-HARI/BETTIAH: Union Home Minister Amit Shah Thursday Pakistan-sponsored terrorists to refrain from further attacking India, asserting that if they repeat the mistake, "goli ka jawab goley se diya jayega" (they will face cannons for bullets).

Explosives manufactured in Bihar's proposed defence corridor will be used against these terrorists, he said. "Terrorists from Pakistan

attacked our citizens in Pahalgam. They wiped off Sindoor from the foreheads of our mothers and sisters Prime Minister Narendra Modi avenged it by launching Operation Sindoor within 20 days. The Indian Army neutralised the terrorists on Pakistan's land," Shah said at a poll rally in Bihar.

He also said, "The PM is setting up a Defence



ka jawab goley se diya jayega' (they will face cannons for bullets).

The cannons to be used against terrorists will be made in Bihar, Shah said.

"Unlike the previous Congress regime, the government under Modi's leadership is committed to the safety and security of the nation," he alleged.

Shah launched a blistering attack on RJD supremo Lalu Prasad and his son Tejashwi in Bihar. If Yadav for "raising slogans in the praise of late Mohammad Shahabuddin", who was accused of unleashing terror

in Siwan during the RJD's

15-year rule in Bihar.

"Lalu and his party raise slogans like 'Shahabuddin amar rahe', dream of 'jungle raj' but Bihar people won't allow these," he said.

Addressing back-to-back $_{\rm in}$ Darbhanga, Motihari and Bettiah, Shah urged voters in Bihar to press the EVM button with the BJP's poll symbol 'lotus' to prevent the return of 'jungle raj' during the RJD rule

Champaran is witness to "how Bihar's land remained blood-soaked during the RJD's 'jungle raj'," he said.

Shah also hit out at Rahul Gandhi, the leader of the opposition in the Lok Sabha, for organising the 'Voter Adhikar Yatra' in Bihar.

"I dare Rahul Gandhi to organise as many yatras as he can to protect infiltrators. We will drive out illegal immigrants," he claimed.

Shah promised that if the NDA returns to power, the government will spend Rs 26,000 crore to harness the Koshi river water for irrigation and to prevent floods.

SIR of electoral rolls begins in 12 States, UTs

NEW DELHI: Election Commission's Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of voters' list commenced in nine states and three Union territories on Tuesday with the TMC dubbing the exercise as a "con job" by the 'compromised" poll body.

The electoral roll cleanup exercise is also being opposed by the ruling DMK and its allies in Tamil Nadu.

The Election Commission (EC) said its booth-level officers (BLOs) have fanned out to hand over semi-filled enumeration forms to electors and will also help them fill the required document.

According to the schedule announced by the poll authority, SIR will begin with the enumeration stage and continue till December

The EC will release the draft electoral rolls on December 9, and the final electoral rolls will be published on February 7.


