The tournament featured the top eight ranked athletes shortlisted during the recent selection trials held at Srinagar, along with two medalists from the All India Police Games, who were invited to compete in this prestigious ranking event. Before the commencement of the matches, all shortlisted athletes underwent a comprehensive physical fitness assessment, and only those who met the prescribed standards were cleared to participate.

Competitors displayed outstanding performances in both Sanda and Taolu events, reflecting their rigorous training and commitment. Based on their overall performance, the Selection Committee of the Wushu Association of India (WAI)

has recommended the top four ranked athletes for the National Wushu Coaching Camp, scheduled from 15th November to 14th December

Additionally, the top two athletes will undergo two months of foreign exposure training in China from mid-December to 30th January
