Family background does not determine who can govern: Bihar Guv

SRINAGAR: Governor Arif Mohammad Khan on Wednesday confirmed that all preparations are in place for the first phase of voting in the state assembly polls, calling the elections a celebration of democracy.

"Tomorrow is polling day, and preparations have already been finalised. I am confident that democracy in our country has become very strong," Khan told reporters here after attending an event at the Sher-i-KashmirInternational Conference Centre (SKICC).

Calling the polls a celebration of democracy, Khan said that one's family background does not determine who can govern.

"The person who runs the government is chosen through the ballot box. They receive a mandate from the people of India and the states for a specific period. They are not sovereign; the people of this country are sover- $_{
m the}$ governor remarked.

Khan highlighted the examples of President Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, noting that their ascension to the highest offices in the country sends a powerful message: there are no limits to what anvone can achieve.

"What message does this send to the common man, especially to the youth? It demonstrates that we have a system where there are

no restrictions on how high you can aspire to go. However, you must earn the people's trust. After that, the sky is the limit," he added.

When asked about the dual power system in Jammu and Kashmir under the Union Territory setup and the lack of restored statehood, Khan acknowledged that it is unfortunate for Kashmir to have endured such painful situations.

He referenced the partition of 1947, stating that while many have suffered, the people of Kashmir have paid the highest price.

The governor expressed that everyone, including the prime minister, desires

Kashmir and wishes for the restoration of statehood.

"We cannot be complacent in thinking that trouble only arises in Kashmir. We are all concerned and desire normal conditions. As you pointed out (regarding statehood), this is the desire of everyone in India. The prime minister wants Kashmir to have the autonomy to decide for itself," he said.

However, he added that normalcy must be established, "so that the situation here can also return to

"It is a collective effort between you and us to create conditions where the rule of law is upheld in the same manner in Kashmir as it is elsewhere," he

LONDON: Prime Minister Narendra Modi's strong leadership is among the key advantages India has to offer as an attractive investment destination which is set to become the world's leading economy by 2047, Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu said in London.

In his chief guest address at the annual London Global Convention organised by the Institute of Directors (IoD) on Tuesday night, Naidu pitched his vision for the "speed of doing business" through a "public, private, people's partnership" model for his state.

The Telugu Desam Party (TDP) chief also presented his wife Nara Bhuvaneswari, Vice-President and Managing Director of Heritage Foods Ltd. with the prestigious IoD Distinguished Fellowship and the Golden Peacock Award for Excellence in Corporate Governance.

We have some advantages in India: One is economic reforms, second is around first mover advantages of IT, and third, we have a very strong leader Narendra Modi as prime minister," said Naidu.

"Recently, you have seen our GST reforms; what all structural deficiencies, he (Modi) is correcting now. We are having an additional advantage of demographic dividend... India is moving very fast. It is on autopilot now. It is unstoppable. India as of today is the fourth largest economy; by 2047, India will be the number one economy of the world," he said.

Following the awards presentation cere-

mony, Naidu praised his wife's remarkable contribution to public service, business leadership and society.

"Bhuvaneswari is not just an entrepreneur and philanthropist, but a proud representative of Telugu culture, upholding the best of Indian and Telugu heritage through her values, compassion, and leadership. Rahul alleges impurities in past polls but opposes SIR to clean up rolls: EC officials hit back

NEW DELHI: Rahul Gandhi flags impurities in past polls but opposes special intensive revision aimed at cleaning up electoral rolls, Election Commission officials said Wednesday hitting back at the Congress leader who alleged voter manipulation in Haryana assembly polls held last

They said it is now clear that Gandhi is supporting the special intensive revision exercise despite opposing it in the beginning.

They asserted that Gandhi's vote manipulation charge is "unfounded" as neither any appeals were filed against the electoral rolls in Haryana nor was any multiple voting flagged when it happened.

The poll body officials were reacting to Gandhi's claim that 25 lakh entries were "fake" and that the Haryana assembly polls were

They also questioned why Congress's booth agents did not flag voters who had allegedly cast multiple votes in the election in October

"Why were no claims and objections raised by INC's booth-level agents

during revision to avoid multiple names," an official asked, countering Gandhi's allegation.

Booth-level agents or BLAs are appointed by political parties to flag irregularities, if any, in electoral

The EC officials underlined that "zero appeals" were filed against electoral rolls and only 22 election petitions are currently pending in the Punjab and Haryana High Court.

As many as 23 election petitions were filed, and one was later withdrawn. The officials said Gandhi has raised the issue of the Rai and Hodal assembly seats in Haryana.

"Since election petitions have been filed in both the constituencies among the 23 filed for Haryana assembly elections, Mr Gandhi may be advised to use all his evidence there," an official suggested. An election petition can be filed

within 45 days of the announcement of the results in the high court of that

"What were the polling agents of INC doing in the polling stations? They are supposed to object if the elector has already voted or if the polling agents doubt the identity of the elector," the

Referring to EC's efforts to clean up the voter lists across states, officials wondered whether Gandhi supports the special intensive revision (SIR), which removes duplicate, dead, and shifted voters along with verification of citizen-

"Or is he opposing SIR," an official asked.

India consistently protects interests of vulnerable sectors in FTAs: Goval

AUCKLAND: Commerce and Industry Minister Pivush Goyal on Wednesday said India consistently protects the interests of vulnerable sectors like dairy and MSMEs in free trade agreements.

He also said that significant progress has been made in the rotiations of the proposed trade agreement with New Zealand.

The fourth round of negotiations is underway here for a pact between senior officials of India and New Zealand.

"India never compromises on the interests of dairy, farmers and MSMEs. We consistently protect the interests of vulnerable sectors," Goyal told reporters.

The remarks are important as New Zealand is a major dairy player in the world, and it may seek greater market access in the sector.

The minister said that both countries have agreed to respect each other's sensitivities.

India has never given any duty concessions in any of its previous trade agreements. Dairy and agriculture are politically sensitive areas.

"We respect each other's sensitivities...we will not touch such issues," he said, adding that "a trade deal is clearly on the table".

He, however, said that India can look at increasing cooperation in farming technologies, like dairy machinery.

Goyal is here on a four-day official visit. He is leading a business delegation.

When asked if more rounds of negotiations would happen, the minister said, "We may not need many more rounds as significant progress has been made"

He also said that various sectors hold huge potential between India and New Zealand to enhance cooperation, including in defence, agriculture, space, education and tourism sectors.

When asked about the movement of skilled professionals in the FTA, Goyal said it is part of the services chapter.

Goyal also met New Zealand Prime Minister Christopher media jointly on trade and other issues.

Luxon held about 15 minutes of intense talks with Goyal and New Zealand Trade Minister Todd McClay, even as his cavalcade was waiting.
