Huge quantity of seized contraband/psychotropic substances destroyed

GANDERBAL: Police in Ganderbal conducted a mass disposal drive of the seized drugs. The District Level "Drug Disposal Committee, Ganderbal", destroyed huge quantity of the seized drugs & psychotropic substances, worth laacs. The contraband and psychotropic substances that were seized in 23 NDPS cases of district Ganderbal were disposed of, after obtaining proper permission from the competent court, through incineration method at Kashmir Health Care System, IGC Lassipora. All the contraband substances were destroyed in presence of the magistrate.

JMC conducts inspection drive of meat and chicken retail shops

JAMMU: In a continued effort to uphold public health, hygiene, and compliance with municipal laws, the Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC), under the directions of Dr. Devansh Yadav (IAS), Commissioner, JMC, carried out an intensive inspection drive of meat and chicken retail outlets across Jammu city. The inspection was conducted by a team from the Veterinary Wing of JMC, led by Dr. Jaswant Singh, Municipal Veterinary Officer (MVO). The primary objective of the drive was to ensure adherence to sanitary stan-

dards, possession of valid trade licenses, proper waste disposal, and compliance with food safety norms as prescribed under the Municipal Bye-laws and the Food Safety and Standards Act. During the inspection, several shops were found violating the prescribed norms, and notices were issued on the spot. A total fine of Rs 10,000 was imposed and collected from the defaulters under relevant provisions of the Jammu Municipal Corporation Act. Additionally, around 70 kilograms of meat deemed unfit for human consumption was seized and destroyed following proper procedure. The inspec-

tion teams also sensitized meat sellers about maintaining hygiene and stressed the importance of sourcing meat from authorized slaughterhouses only. Dr. Jaswant Singh stated that such drives will continue regularly to ensure the sale of safe, hygienic, and quality meat in Jammu. He urged citizens to purchase meat, chicken, and fish only from licensed outlets and to report any instances of illegal slaughtering or sale of substandard meat to JMC. The Corporation appealed to all retailers to follow the laid-down guidelines and cooperate in maintaining Jammu's cleanliness and public health standards.
