Yogesh Sawhney on Sunday invited attention of Government towards increasing COVID cases in Jammu & Kashmir and asked the administration whether

UT is prepared to handle a third wave of virus, the likelihood of which is increasing with every passing day. Terming the present situation 'tense and extremely worrisome', he stated that there is an urgent need to address the spike in cases to prevent it from escalating any further.

"DC Office, University and other centres of importance have come in contact of virus; as such administration needs to take strong measures instantly. All schools and universities should be closed immediately and all necessary precautions and restrictions be put in place," said Sawhney.

GoI has given Sindhu CU & Medical College to Ladakh; so also is the need for HC & CAT Benches

The Ladakh Tableau joining the Republic Day Parade/ Pageant (cavalcade, procession, carnival) for the first time on 26th January 2021 marking the 72nd anniversary of Indian Republic, in one way, asking the otherworld to see India beyond Kashmir valley, Ladakh to Kanyakumari. So far Ladakh region of erstwhile J&K State had been a little known to outside world and now after it has been made by present NDA Government a UT in 2019, it is being seen as a pointed dimension of Bharat. Government of India, has, in a way set a pointed process of identifying local identities and needs of Ladakh region which very significantly carried the cultural & geographical identities of ancient Bharat Varsh. The initiatives taken by Narendra Modi led Union Government in August 2019 have started showing signs of positives at socio-economic levels for locals and at the diplomatic levels in relation to foreign affairs.

Before October 31, 2019 although Ladakh 'region' formed a very large part of the then Indian state of J&K (area of Ladakh region that has been illegally encroached by Pakistan and China has been around one Lakh Sq Km or in other words about 8 times the encroached area of other regions) but even then all these years, J&K State related issues and socio-economic needs have been very less addressed w.r.t lands & people other than Kashmir Valley and so have instead the irrational accession related controversies floated by some from valley, too attracted disproportionate attentions of outside world.

A very large part of Ladakh region remains cut off by road for about six months in a year (many areas even don't have easy access to even air travel and a large segment of Ladakh region (presently UT), population is very ill-equipped due to economic constraints for moving out for better higher/ professional education/ criti-

cal health care needs and people remained hard pressed economically. Due to the administrative, economic and geo-

graphical constraints, the growth there has remained 'stagnant' to a few families only. Going by the environment that prevailed immediately after 1947, in late 1950s some frontline J&K leaders from Kashmir Valley had woven a web of strategies for keeping grip on the democratic Governments to follow in Indian State of J&K. Some power-hungry leaders from outside Kashmir valley too walked along 'their' side.

Even till recent past for basic college education the people had to come to Jammu/ Srinagar (presently there are six degree colleges, 4 in Kargil and 2 in Leh). Similarly, for superior legal remedies for/ criminal/ writ matters the people of region have to come to Jammu or Srinagar and the government employees there do not have any

higher court for remedies regarding service disputes. Imagine the fate of the local population that has been and would be even now after 2019

(after 7 decades in Independent India) as regards reaching Higher judiciary (HC) ?


No doubt after the Governor's rule was imposed in 2018, pressing needs of the region had been recognised to some extent in view of which University of Ladakh was established in 2019 under the University of Ladakh Act 2018 (enacted by Governor of Jammu and Kashmir - Act no. LVI of 2018) and by virtue of Section 2(e) of Act, the six existing colleges of Leh and Kargil district became part of the University of

Ladakh) in the Union Territory of Ladakh when in a brief statement on the Central Universities (Amendment) Bill, 2021, Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan informed that every year, about 7,000 students go out of Ladakh for higher studies as the university can accommodate about 2,500 students. Another happy note for present UT of Ladakh has been that in September 2019 J&K H&ME Department decided to start a Medical college and 250-bedded hospital in Leh (201 Kanals of land at Shey Sindhu Ghat village was earmarked for Government Medical College in Leh) and as per Dr Pawan Kotwal, college will be taking in first batch in 2022.

But still, UT of Ladakh neither has a separate High Court for Ladakh UT/ region nor even a Court section or wing of High Court in Leh or Kargil like Jammu and Kashmir regions of J&K UT have in Leh or Kargil. Imagine how diffi-

cult it is still for Ladakh UT (region) people to seek total ultimate judicial and administrative justices. Anyone who has to appeal against judgement of Sessions Court or has to file a writ petition has to file the same in Jammu or Srinagar only since wings/benches of Jammu and Kashmir & Ladakh High Court are in Jammu and Srinagar. Same is the position as regards CAT. Imagine how pressing and expensive it must be for people to file petitions. So since irrespective of the fact that UT of Ladakh has very less population, the geographical placement of the population of UT of Ladakh over-rides any other argument against giving separate wing/bench of High Court in Ladakh as well as a separate bench of CAT in Ladakh, for which demands have started smirring.


