As India and China are expected to meet on January 12 to hold 14th round of Corps Commander talks to resolve the logjam on the Line of Actual Control India should focus on coming out of this bottleneck straining the ties between the two countries as this is not in the interest of any of the country in the sub continent. Earlier, during thirteen rounds of talks between the two countries many issues regarding border conflicts have been resolved and both armies have amicably decided to maintain calm. The 14th round of India-China talk will held mainly to resolve the Hot Springs area which is the only new friction point left to be resolved between the two countries. The Indian side has adopted a very mature approach to resolve the difficult situation step by step and it is likely that the 14 round of talks will go a long way in further easing the tension between the two countries and will help in restoring normalcy on the LAC as was the case before Galwan Valley clash. There is no doubt that both India and China are looking at the resolution of the Hot Springs friction point which emerged after the Chinese aggression last year. The friction points on the banks of the Pangong Lake and Gogra heights have been resolved but Hot Springs remains to be addressed and India is hopeful that the dialogue this time will help in resolving the issue. On the same lines, India has also been demanding the resolution of the DBO area and CNN junction area which have been there before the April-May timeframe last year and are considered to be legacy issues. This is for the first time that India has been working towards establishing peace in the area but has also maintained a high level of preparedness to thwart any misadventure by the troops of Dragon nation. It is also promising that despite stand-off, India has been maintaining proper pressure on the Chinese side by raising edifice required to thwart Chinese designs to harm the country. India is anticipating peaceful resolution through talks but it is also ready for military conflicts as reports suggest that India can bring around two lakh troops along LAC in no time, if need arises. This kind of preparation is unprecedented and necessary for coming to terms with China which is also observing the proactive stance of the country thus paving way for early resolution of remaining issues between the warring nations.

Further, in most of the places, the text is not about deeper elements of philosophy or mysticism rather it's about how to live life practically in a


Listening and inculcating the knowledge described in the beautiful Song by Lord Krishna will make your life purposeful and successful for sure.

Double transit effects of Saturn & Jupiter on various sun-signs

The role of Jupiter and Saturn has been elaborately mentioned in the previous post of this topic. These two planets have a major role to play in shaping the destiny of a person after one's birth, depending upon the situation in which these two planets are located in one's horoscope. In the process of their contributions in shaping the destiny of a person after one takes birth, the Saturn bestows and Jupiter blesses the bestowal of favors of Saturn. Bestowed favors of Saturn depend upon one's 'Karmik' actions of the past births, which are the deeds and the performances of a person during his/her past 'Janmas'. Similarly Saturn and Jupiter have a distinct role to play during their movement (Transit) in the sky above, over all the matters of functional importance of individuals and the country as a whole as per 'Mundane' astrology. In particular the joint double transit effect of these two planets for the 12 signs of the zodiac, which constitutes a horoscope, has a great relevance.

Jupiter is transiting in Aquarius from November 21, 2021 at 00:05 hrs until 13th April 2022. At this point of time of transit of Jupiter, Saturn is in Capricorn thus making 2/12 combination with Jupiter, which is not good as per astrological norms. This position will remain till April 13, 2022. Thus for nearly five months both Jupiter and Saturn will remain in this position and will jointly aspect Libra sign (Tula) Rashi, by its 9th and 10th aspects respectively in the zodiac. According to this double transit effect of Jupiter and Saturn on the house and the planet which may be placed in that house, will get impacted and activated, when the results there of will be proportionate to the significations (Karka-Tatwas) of that house in a horoscope. The double transit effects upon the country and the ruler of the country have already been explained in an earlier post about it. Double Transit (Gochara) effects of Saturn and Jupiter on the 12 Rashis occupying the Lagna (Ascendant) are briefly mentioned as under. These are generalised effects only as much more depends upon the basic quality of one's horoscope and the pattern of Dasha at a given point of time. It is further emphasized that astrology should be taken as an indication and not as a dictation. The 'Karmik' actions and the results there of further depend upon ones adherence to the path of righteousness which is ones 'Dharma'. Let us all follow our individual Dharma to ward off the evil effects of planetary positions.

Aries (Mesha): For this sign as the lagan (Ascendant), Libra (Tula) Rashi falls in the 7th house. 7th house in horoscope is mostly relevant to marital significations, but it is not limited to that only, and has much astrological relevance too, which needs a lot of space to describe here. This will cut down imports substantially besides bridging the demand and supply gap in the poultry sector and generating employment by attracting new entrepreneurs as mentioned by LG during Vishal Pashudhan Vyapar Mela organized at Hiranagar, Kathua. In beginning, the event was organized on pilot basis at Nagri and Hiranagar in Kathua district which got an overwhelming response from the farming community besides the livestock owners from the neighbouring states of Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh and others.

This move of the UT administration was aimed at showcasing the high quality breeds of cows, buffaloes, sheep, goats etc and related machinery of state of the art technology pertaining to Animal and Sheep Husbandry sectors. Besides, the provision of facilitating sale/purchase of animals, awareness generation of all government schemes for farmer welfare, health check up of animals, tagging and insurance of animals after sale and purchase are also taken up. Lakhanpur being the gateway to J&K fits well as the focal point for hosting of Mega Livestock Trade Fair as it is easily accessible, approachable for farmers across the UT who otherwise had to spend a lot of their valuable time and money in search of good quality livestock. The featured event which is now a monthly affair has become a cynosure of all eyes being the only event of this magnitude offering a great deal of opportunities to the farmers of Jammu and Kashmir.

stration are very much promising and encouraging as gauged by the prosperity it has brought into the lives of farmers benefited from the host of schemes like Integrated Dairy Development Scheme (IDDS), Integrated Poultry Development Programme (IPDP), Integrated Fodder Development Scheme (IFDS), Integrated Sheep Development Scheme (ISIDS) besides provision of free vaccination against the FMDV disease minimizing the associated risks. Kathua alone has witnessed a whopping increase in establishment of IDDS units (each unit comprising 5 animals) from the last year tally of 78 units to 142 units (710 animals) so far in the current financial year with two months remaining. The breakup of IDDS beneficiaries in Kathua district includes 31 units from Nagri, 28 from Barnoti, 26 from Marheen, 20 from Kathua, 11 from Mahanur, 6 from Basohli, 6 from Keerian Gandyal and 1 from Nagrota Gujroo and 1 from Hiranagar blocks respectively.

Likewise, farmers of other districts of J&K UT also availed opportunities of buying high quality breeds of cow, buffaloes, etc from these Pashudhan Melas which includes purchase of 106 animals by farmers of Samba district, 690 from Jammu, 56 from Rajouri, 36 from Reasi, 39 from Udhampur, 43 from Ramban, 84 from Doda, 44 from Pooneh, 54 from Srinagar, 47 from Baramulla, 21 from Ganderbal, 20 from Shopian, 70 from Kupwara, 5 from Kulgam, 15 from Budgam, 14 from Bandipora and 21 from Anantnag districts respectively.

Narrating his success story, Progressive Farmer Kewal Krishan Khajuria of Block Nagri of Kathua district termed initiative of the administration as a path breaking step to bring effervescent and ebullient changes in the lives of farmers who are looking forward to explore avenues in the dairy sector. "With the technical know-how provided by the team of experts from District Animal Husbandry Office Kathua, I have successfully established a Dairy unit by purchasing 40 animals under IDDS running with name and style M/S Krishna Kamdhenu Dairy and providing over 3.5 quintals of milk daily to JKMPCL which was founded with help of Gujarat Dairy Cooperative Amul in 2004 to empower milk producers in Union Territory of J&K.

Another farmer Sayed Ali Chaudhary from Block Marheen who has established 8 units under IDDS expressed his happiness to get quality breeds of animals through Pashudhan Vyapar Mela which is providing handsome earning to him. While expressing his gratitude towards the administration, he said, "Pashudhan Vyapar Mela is transforming lives of people associated with farming/agriculture to unprecedented scale". District Animal Husbandry Officer, Kathua, Dr Satvir Raina, who is District Nodal Officer to look after the featured Pashudhan Vyapar Mela said that the initiative has got huge response from everywhere as farmers of every nook and corner across J&K UT has availed benefits from this

especially those publishing books. Despite a global shift in reading habits from printed books and newspapers to digital, an exemption in taxes and duties on paper, which is imported into country, is very important. The obvious benefit is that it would make education more accessible in the country as tax exemptions would lead to production of cheaper books. The taxes had pushed cost of books beyond the reach of even middle-income folks. There is indeed a case to be made for reducing taxes on imported paper if it can lead to publishing of cheaper books and thus easier access to textbooks. But, question arises whether that still holds true for a generation that is far more in sync with consuming media and doing their studies digitally rather than older generations, who found greater value in published products. In such a scenario, one perhaps needs

to weigh costs and benefits of giving students books versus digital tools. The enforced adoption of digital classrooms and distance learning due to COVID-19 pandemic mean that more and more students are engaged with digital learning products when compared to books. However, the challenges faced in ensuring widespread adoption of digital technology and lower literacy overall mean that books will remain viable in the country for a good while longer. Hence, printed books will continue to play a critical role in providing cheaper education. Last but not least the Government certainly ought to at least consider suggestion, making sure that any eventual remission is ultimately passed on to public.
