## J&K records highest single-day jump of 2,456 virus cases

Highest 588 cases reported in Jammu Distt; 12 more areas declared micro containment zones; elective surgeries suspended in GMC

SRINAGAR/JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir on Friday recorded highest single-day jump in the third wave of novel Corona virus by recording 2,456 new cases, officials said, adding that due to surge in cases, 12 more areas of the Jammu city have been declared as micro-containment zones while entry in Government Medical College Hospital here has been

According to officials, 934 cases were reported from Jammu division and 1522 from the Kashmir division, even as five Covid related deaths were also recorded three in the Jammu Province and two in the Valley. Highest number of 588 cases have been recorded in the Jammu District followed by 464 in the Srinagar District.


