

CS reviews preparations for Republic Day celebrations

JAMMU: The Chief Secretary, Dr. Arun Kumar Mehta on Friday chaired a meeting to take stock of preparations to be put in place for the celebration of Republic Day-2022.

Director General of Police, Administrative Secretaries of Departments of Health & Medical Education, Home, PWD(R&B), General Administration, Youth Services & Sports, Forest, Ecology & Environment, Rural Development, Jal Shakti, besides Divisional Commissioners of Jammu and Kashmir, Additional Director General of Police, along with HODs of concerned departments participated in the meeting.

Detailed deliberations were held regarding the venues, security arrangements, parade/band contingents of Army, CRPF, Police, School children, cultural items, seating arrangements, transport/parking arrangements, sanitation, drinking water, electricity, medical aid, and emergency facilities.

It was informed that the main Republic Day functions will be organized at MA

Stadium Jammu and Sher-e-Kashmir Cricket Stadium, Srinagar. Further, Beating the Retreat ceremony will be organized on 29th January, 2022.

The Chief Secretary directed the concerned to ensure arrangements regarding various facilities including transport, parking, seating, availability of drinking water, uninterrupted electricity supply, deployment of health, fire and emergency staff and equipment, cultural programmes and illumination of important government buildings.

Dr. Mehta underscored the importance of observing of the COVID SOPs and CAB by the participating contingents and audience. The con-

The Health Department was asked to put in a mechanism for testing the participants prior to their participation in the event along with thermal screening of audience on the day of the function at both the venues.

The Home Department, School Education Department and the Youth Services and Sports Department were asked to observe CAB and laid down protocols during the rehearsals. It was informed that in view of the prevailing

COVID situation, participation of only vaccinated people is being ensured, with a special focus on school children in the age group of 15-17 years who are being vaccinated on priority.

The Chief Secretary impressed upon the Culture Department to lay special emphasis on befitting celebrations of the 73rd Republic Day under the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav which is being observed across the country to celebrate 75 years of Independence.

Training programme for MOs to make PCCCs functional commences

SRINAGAR: To strengthen Covid-19 containment measures at primary level in villages and to mitigate the pressure on secondary and tertiary care health institutions amid spike in fresh Covid-19 positive cases, the two days training programme for Medical Officers (MOs) of all the districts commenced on Friday at Institute of Hotel Management (IHM) Rajbagh, here.

The Divisional Covid-19 Control Room Kashmir (DCCRK) has organised the training programme with an aim to sensitize Medical Officers of all districts regarding the treatment and management of Covid patients who have a mild disease at Panchayat Covid Care Centres (PCCCs) established during the 1st and 2nd waves.

The training programme was presided over by Dr Talat Jabeen Epidemiologist, SSO Kashmir while the resource persons on the occasion were Community Medicine Specialists at DCCRK, Dr Rouf Hussain Rather and Dr Umar Nazir.

In her inaugural speech, Dr Talat recapitulated the role played by Panchayat Covid Care Centers during the first two waves where patients with mild symptoms were admitted and treated by the designated medical teams.

She said that PCCCs were established at every Panchayat that reduced

pressure on patients in Sub district, district hospitals and tertiary care hospitals. She said PCCCs facilitated isolation of covid patients with every requirement from treatment to the proper referral to these patients.

Dr Umar in his presentation highlighted the need to make these PCCCs functional once again and also described the augmentation of the medical and paramedical staff besides making these Medics as master trainers so that they can train Paramedics, PRIs, Teachers, NGOs and Social Workers to make those centers functional without wasting much time.

He stressed on the identification of patients with mild infection who shall be admitted at those centers besides he stressed on making all the previous logistics functional so the third covid wave could be contained successfully.

In the 2nd presentation, Dr. Rouf highlighted the importance of CAB & Vaccination and also threw light on the evolving situation of Covid-19 globally, national and at divisional level.

Later, a question answer session was held during which the participants asked questions regarding the third wave, severity, its impact on health and immune system, its treatment and SOPs which were answered by Resource persons to the best satisfaction of the participants.

SCHOLARSHIP NOTIFICATION
National Means Cum Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS)-Inviting applications from Class-VIII (8th) Students

It is notified for information of aspiring candidates that Ministry of Education (MoE), New Delhi through the Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education is going to conduct National Means Cum Merit Scholarship Scheme (NMMSS) Examination 2021-22 on 16th March, 2022 (Wednesday) for students who have appeared in class 8th Annual Examination during the Session October- November, 2021 in the Kashmir Division/Winter Zones areas of Jammu Division, Ladakh and are going to appear in 8th Annual Examination in March-2022 in Summer Zone areas of Jammu Division.

Other Eligibility Criteria:

- The student must be studying in Government, Government Aided and Local body Schools only.
- The student must have been promoted from class VII irrespective of minimum marks as a special case for the exam year 2021-22.
- The overall family income should not exceed Rs 1.5 Lakh per annum.
- The scheme would provide reservation to different categories of students as per the reservation policy of U.T of J&K.

For availing the scholarship:
The student must pass both the tests i.e. MAT & SAT with at least 40% Marks in aggregate taken together for these two tests. For the SC/ST, this cut will be 32% Marks. Further the students must have scored at least 55% Marks or equal grade in Class 8th, 9th and 11th Examination and 60% Marks in class 10th Examination for continuance of scholarship. There will 5% relaxation for SC/ST students. The student must continue higher studies in Government School up to Class 12th.

No. of Scholarships:
1091 scholarships will be awarded only to the students selected in order of merit and the amount shall be Rs.12000/- per annum per student i.e. Total amount Rs.48000/- for each selected student from class 9th to 12th.

Examination: NMMSS Examination will comprise of two papers viz:-
