RAMBAN: As per District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr. Suresh of the Health Department on Saturday administered Covid vaccine doses to 1127 people including 770 children in 15-17 years age group which includes 240 in Medical Block Banihal, 260 in Batote, 188 in Ukhral and 82 in Gool.

Meanwhile, continuing the enforcement drive to implement Covid protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams today fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance.

The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs. 46,400 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 81,06,900. The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking Covid vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr. Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 3262 samples including 633 RT-PCR and 2629 RAT samples besides administering Covid vaccine to 1127 persons at various dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

Fisheries Department plans to introduce Japanese fish**STATE TIMES NEWS**

RAJOURI: Fisheries Department has planned to introduce Japanese fish for increasing fish production in Rajouri District. The information was given in a meeting chaired by District Development Commissioner, Vikas Kundal convened to review the functioning of the Fisheries Department, here today. Chief Planning Officer, Mohammad Khurshid; AD Fisheries, Munish Sharma and other concerned officers attended the meeting. The AD Fisheries informed that there are two fish breeding farms in the district including a trout farm at Phalni in Budhal and one carp farm at Muradpur. In capture fisheries, there are 792 registered fishermen in the district who are dependent on fish catching only. Major fish in the areas include snow trout, hill stream fish and Mahashir; the AD said. While reviewing the implementation of Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY) in the district, the AD Fisheries informed the meeting that the scheme aims to enhance production through expansion, intensification, diversification and productive utilization of land and water.

For the introduction of the Japanese fish in the district, the DDC asked the concerned to culture the said species in ten fish farms on trial basis to check the possibility of its survival. He said that with the abundant availability of water resources the district has a huge potential in the fisheries sector and asked the concerned officer to promote it as a lucrative self-employment option.

College Rajouri gave the expert talk on the occasion. He dealt in detail on topics like introduction and origin to the beginning of virology, classification, and genome of human viruses, types of viral genomes, viroids, virusoids, prions, retrotransposons, Coronavirus, TMV, symptomatology of viruses, and ended his talk by highlighting transmission and control measures for their spread.
