"During the encounter Mir wanted to put down his arms probably with an aim to come out and surrender to the security forces but was forced by the two Pakistani

terrorists to keep firing back.

"Details that emerged later including the post-mortem report further confirmed that Mir was actually killed by members of his own group, as a result of their failed attempts to resist him from surrendering," a senior official involved in the gunfight said.

Mir was a school dropout who initially worked as an Over Ground Worker and subsequently was recruited into the terror folds in December 2020 by JeM commander Saifulla alias "Lambu Bhai", a Pakistani

Even though Mir's stint as an active terrorist was short,

he had a long list of acts of terror attributed to him, including the Zewan attack in which three police personnel were killed and 11 others were injured on December 13

last year, the officials said. They said it was probably his involvement in a long list of terror-related incidents that prevented him from rejoining the mainstream and eventually when he was given an opportunity by the security forces to save his own life. he did not stand a chance at the hands of the very companions for whom he was working as the "terror mule".

J&K sees 6 more COVID deaths; 3,499 cases

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir recorded 3,499 fresh coronavirus cases on Sunday, taking the infection count to 3,59,373, while six deaths were also reported in the past 24 hours, officials said.

Out of the fresh cases, 1,210 were from the Jammu division and 2,289 from the Kashmir division of the Union Territory, the officials said. They said Srinagar district record-

ed a maximum of 614 new cases, followed by 556 cases in Jammu dis-There are 15,883 active coronavirus cases in Jammu and Kashmir,

while the number of recoveries stands at 3.38.923, the officials said. The new fatalities raised the death toll from the pandemic to 4,567 in

the Union Territory, they said. A total of 275 doctors and paramedics of various hospitals in Kashmir have tested positive for COVID-19 since January 1 this year,

Professor and Head of Department, Medicine. Community Srinagar, Dr Salim Khan said 145 doctors, 130 MBBS students and 130 paramedics have tested positive for COVID-19 in GMC Srinagar and

"No one among them has been hospitalised, but, they are in isolation. Hopefully, they will report back in a week's time," Khan said.

Khan appealed to the people to avoid visiting hospitals unnecessarily.

"Hospitals are most frequented places by infected people. Visit hospitals only in case of emergency. No need to visit your near and dear ones admitted to hospitals or isolated/ quarantined at homes. Please follow Covid-appropriate behaviour and all standard operating procedures," he

Meanwhile, Ladakh's coronavirus caseload increased to 23,209 during the past 24 hours as 130 more people tested positive for the virus, officials

Ninety of the new cases were reported from Leh district and 40 from Kargil district, they said.

According to the officials, the COVID-19 death toll in the Union territory stands at 222 with 164 fatalities in Leh and 58 in Kargil.

Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a supplementary chargesheet against four alleged Lashkar-e-Mustafa operatives in a case related to a conspiracy to carry terror activities here, an official said on Sunday.

The chargesheet against Mohd Arman Ali alias 'Arman Mansuri' and Mohd Ehsanullah alias 'Guddu Ansari', both residents of Bihar, and Imran Ahmad Hajam and Irfan Ahmad Dar of Jammu and Kashmir's Anantnag district, was filed in the NIA special court. Jammu, on Saturday, a spokesperson of the agency

The NIA said the case against the alleged terrorists

was filed under various sections of the Indian Penal Code, Arms Act, Explosive Substances Act and Activities Unlawful (Prevention) Act.

The spokesperson said the case relates to hatching of a conspiracy by the operatives of the Lashkar-e-Mustafa (LeM) at the behest of proscribed Pakistan-based terrorist organisation Jaish-e-Mohammed to carry out terrorist activities in the Jammu area with an intention to threaten the sovereignty, integrity and security

Initially a case was registered at the Gangyal police station in Jammu on February 6 last year and later, the NIA had taken
