NABARD funded road to connect Pretha, Plassi with Plakh Col Mahan successfully builds consensus among people to provide land

BASOHLI: District Development Council (DDC) Kathua Chairman, Col Mahan Singh (Retd.) on Monday visited Pretha, Khaloo, Wadi, Marthni areas of Pretha, Plassi and Plakh Panchayats of Basohli Sub District to take stock of the problems and issues of the residents of these areas here today.

The main purpose of today's visit was to build a consensus among the residents of these areas for providing their land for the construction of road in these isolated and backward areas which have remained cut off from mainland due to water of the majestic Ranjit Sagar Dam.

It is pertinent to mention here that the poor residents in these hamlets continue to be devoid of due development and facilities thus affecting

their daily lives. The 3 Km road estimated to cost Rs. 5 crore to be funded by NABARD will be connecting Pretha & Plassi Panchayats with Plakh Panchayat and shall be executed by Basohli PWD (R&B) Division.
