J&K hits record 6,570 one-day COVID-19 cases; 14 more die

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday recorded 6,570 fresh coronavirus cases, the highest single-day spike since the pandemic began, taking the infection tally to 4,09,166, while 14 people succumbed-seven each in the Valley and the Jammu Division-- to the disease in the last 24 hours, officials said.

Out of the fresh cases, 1.555 were from the Jammu division and 5.015 from the Kashmir division of the Union Territory, the officials said.

This is the highest singleday spike in fresh cases since the first Covid case was detected in Kashmir in March 2020, surpassing the previous high of 6,568 infection on January 22 this year.
