DC reviews power supply scenario in Poonch

POONCH: Deputy Commissioner Poonch, Inder Jeet on Thursday reviewed the power supply scenario in the district and directed the concerned to ensure scheduled power supply to the consumers.

During the meeting, various issues were discussed in detail which includes the status of receiving stations and power supply to different parts of the district.

The concerned updated the chair about the status of new receiving stations being constructed in the district.

The executive engineer JPDCL informed that against the total revenue collection target of Rs 80 crore Rs 25 crore have been realised till December 31, 2021.

The Executive Engineer project wing Rajouri/Poonch Maqbool Chowdhary informed that 91 transformers under PMDFR and 85 transformers under DDUGJY scheme were allotted during the year 2021-22 out of which 156 have been installed and ensured that the remaining will be installed before March 31, 2022 positively. He further informed that several Receiving Stations have been completed in the district including: 3.15MVA in BG, 3.15 MVA

in Mendhar; 3.15 in Harni, 3.5 MVA in Jarawali Gali, 10 MVA in Surankote.

Setting deadlines for each project, the Deputy Commissioner directed JPDCL to complete installation work of the Receiving Station within 10days.

The Deputy Commissioner strictly instructed to put in extra efforts to realize the revenue targets before the end of current financial year.

Directions were issued to Executive Engineers to monitor the progress on receiving stations and submit the report to the DC office and also maintain consumer Complaint Dairy on a daily basis.

The JEs were asked to conduct regular inspections and regularise the illegal connections in their respective areas and submit the report within 10 days. The Executive Engineers were asked to remove all illegal commercial and domestic connections in the district.

The Deputy Commissioner said that strict action will be taken against those violating the set norms of the department. The meeting was attended by Executive Engineers JPDCL, Irshad Hussain; Xen Project Wing, Maqbool Chowdhary; AD Planning, M.A Khan; Assistant Executive Engineers, STD, JE's and senior officials of the department.

544 vaccinated, 3,790 samples collected in Ramban

RAMBAN: As per District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr. Suresh the Health Department on Thursday administered Covid vaccine doses to 544 people including 296 children in the 15-17 years age group across the district.

Continuing the enforcement drive to implement Covid protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams today fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance. The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs. 32,000 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 85, 03, 450. The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking Covid vaccination doses at their nearest CVC. As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr. Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 3390 samples including 633 RT-PCR and 3157 RAT samples besides administering Covid vaccine to 544 persons at various dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

DC Ramban discusses modalities for de-launching, re-launching of Maitra Bailey Suspension Bridge

RAMBAN: Deputy Commissioner Ramban, Mussarat Islam on Thursday chaired a meeting to discuss the issues pertaining to the de-launching and re-launching of the Bailey Suspension Bridge (Jhoola Bridge) over river Chenab here at Maitra. Additional Deputy Commissioner, Harbans Sharma; Project Director NHAI, Parshotam Kumar; OC 52-RCC Batote, representative of 35 BRTF, Police, Traffic Police and other concerned officers attended the meeting.

During the meeting the issues related to de-launching and re-launching of Bailey bridge were discussed in detail. It was informed in a meeting that the National Highway Authority of India has approved the project of

Rs. 493.11 Lakh for the de-launching of the existing Bailey Suspension Bridge and launching of 240 ft CI-40R BSB and protection work over river Chenab at KM 149 on old alignment road.

The DC directed the NHAI and BRO to complete the codal formalities and sign MoU with each other in the month of February to facilitate the construction work on the bridge project by the end of March. The DC directed the PD, NHAI to organize a follow up meeting for consultations with all stakeholders to ensure smooth and timely execution of the work. He also directed the BRO to stay prepared for completing the de-launching and re-launching of Bailey bridge before May 15, 2022.

Rajouri Admn scales up SEHAT, e-Shram registration campaign

RAJOURI: To saturate the district under SEHAT-Ayushman Bharat scheme and to ensure that all the unorganised workers are registered on E Shram portal, the District Administration Rajouri on Thursday organised special registration camps at twenty three different locations of the district. The registration camps were organised under the overall supervision of the District Development Commissioner, Vikas Kundal. PM-JAY is the world's largest health insurance/ assurance scheme fully financed by the government. It provides a cover of Rs. 5 lakhs per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization across public and private empanelled hospitals in India. Similarly, E Shram portal is the first-ever National Database of Unorganised Sector Workers (NDUW) created by the Ministry of Labour and Employment to register the unorganized workers. An enthusiastic response was observed among the public who attended the registration camps with due adherence to COVID protocols and got themselves registered under the schemes. The field functionaries deployed for the task also highlighted the importance of SEHAT scheme and E Shram Portal to motivate them to avail the necessary benefits under these welfare initiatives by the Government. Deputy Commissioner Rajouri has already asked all the concerned stakeholders that the targets under the schemes are to be achieved at the earliest so that all the families are registered in the schemes and may avail benefits under the same.
