

CAT directs Secy H&UDD to clarify whether Directorate ULB is State Govt organisation or not

JAMMU: In a controversy over whether Directorate, Urban Local Bodies (ULB) is a State Government organisation or not, a Bench of the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) at Jammu comprising Dr Bhagwan Sahai (A) and Rakesh Sagar Jain (J), directed the Secretary, Department of Housing and Urban Development (H&UDD), State/UT of J&K to submit written reply clarifying whether the Directorate ULB is a State Government organization or not. This significant order was passed in a petition filed by one Jeet

Singh for release of salary. When matter was taken-up, CAT after hearing both the Counsels on last date, directed Deputy AG to file reply of respondents clarifying the status whether Directorate ULB is a State Government organization or not. Deputy AG, Rajesh Thappa submitted that as per instructions, Directorate ULB is not a State Government organisation but an organisation set up by ULBs themselves, and, therefore, the applicant employed by Director Local Bodies are not employees of State Government. Thappa also relied on earlier orders of Tribunal in which his

stand was accepted.

CAT after hearing Sr Adv Rahul Pant for petitioner whereas Deputy Rajesh Thappa for UT, observed that CAT is not convinced of Deputy AG's submissions, and directed to submit a written reply from Secretary, Department of Housing and Urban Development, State / UT of J&K clarifying whether Directorate ULB is a State Government organization or not.

Court rejects bail of fraudster

JAMMU: Railway Magistrate Jammu R K Lalhal rejected bail application of one Sanjeev Kumar Manotra, who duped money from innocent people on pretext of providing jobs.

According to case, police received an application wherein one Sajal Singh Slathia, son of Mohan Singh, resident of Gurah Slathia, Samba and his friend Rakesh Randhawa, son of Roshan Lal, resident of Randhawa colony, Vijaypur alleged that they had given an amount of Rs 4 lakh to one Mandep Singh alias Harmeet, son of Harpal Singh, resident of Devar Tral, Kashmir for providing them jobs of

driver in NHPC Jammu. They further told that had given Rs 3,90,000 on June 2 at Jewel, Jammu to accused and later transferred Rs 10,000 in Bank account as told by accused. Mandeep Singh has assured them to provide them job and after considerable gap of time no job was provided, they requested him to return their hard money back which he refused. As per contents of the application offence under Section 420 of IPC was made out and case FIR No. 190/2021 under Section 420 of IPC was registered in Police Station and investigation of case was entrusted to PSI Amreek Singh.
