

Distt Admn Srinagar for cent percent coverage of 15-17 yr age-group for COVID-19 vaccination

All schools directed to complete vaccination process within a week

SRINAGAR: To safeguard teenagers in the age group of 15-17 years from COVID-19 infection and ensure enabling environment for schools to move towards reopening, the District Administration Srinagar on Saturday held an interaction session under the Chairmanship of Additional Deputy Commissioner Srinagar, Khurshid Ahmad Shah with heads of various Schools and Senior Health functionaries at Banquet Hall, here.

The interaction session was held on the directions of the Deputy Commissioner Srinagar, Mohammad Ajaz Asad which was attended by Sub Divisional Magistrate East/ Nodal Officer Covid-19 Mitigations, Owais Mushtaq, Chief Medical Officer, Dr Jameel, Deputy Chief Education Officer, Anjum Raja, Zonal Education Officers,

Principals and Heads of various Government Schools, Zonal Medical Officers and all Tehsildars of Srinagar, besides representatives of various Private Schools of the district.

During the meeting, a thredbare deliberation was held with regard to ongoing process of Covid-19 vaccination for 15-17 age group in Srinagar District and target achieved till date.

The meeting was informed that in Srinagar district over 83000 teenagers under 15-17 age group are targeted to

inoculate anti Covid-19 dots. It was also given out that total 9312 students under 15-17 age group are enrolled in 111 Government Schools in the district out of which 7045 students have been inoculated Covid-19 jabs, while left out students will be covered under the process soon.

Similarly, the meeting was informed that over 5000 students enrolled in 174 private schools have also been administered necessary Covid-19 shots.

On the occasion, the ADC

asked all other private schools to update their students registration details so that all students under 15-17 age group are inoculated with the Covid-19 vaccine within one week to achieve the set target.

Speaking on the occasion, the Additional Deputy Commissioner said that decisions with regard to vaccination, their research, approval and certification has been scientifically driven. He said vaccinations for children aged between 15 and 17 will not only protect students from the deadly effects of Covid-19 pandemic but also go a long way in assuring worried parents for sending their wards to schools.

He stressed on better coordination between Education and Health Departments to achieve the cent percent target by February 03.

The ADC said the Deputy Commissioner Srinagar is personally monitoring the

vaccination process on a regular basis to ensure a viable environment for schools to reopen for offline classes.

ADC further said in wake of present Covid-19 situation, the students under the target age group can inoculate the Covid-19 jab at any vaccination site as per their convenience and the same can be submitted to school authorities through WhatsApp for updation of School level.

The ADC asked the authorities of both Government and Private Schools to ensure all students under 15-17 age group are vaccinated by Feb 03. He also asked them to upload links regarding registration of students.

The ADC also asked the CMO Srinagar to speed up the pace of ongoing vaccination process of the target group and keep close liaison with all school heads so that the process is completed within a weeks' time.

trict.

While giving the details, AD planning informed the meeting that against the available outlay including

Area Development Fund of Rs. 219 crores, an expenditure of Rs. 151 crores have been incurred on the projects so far. It was informed

that out of 1805 allotted works, 938 works have

been completed so far in the district.

No need to panic over NeoCov virus: DAK

SRINAGAR: With apprehensions among people about newly discovered coronavirus, called NeoCov, Doctors Association Kashmir (DAK) on Saturday said there is no need to panic as the virus is confined to animals and does not cause human infection.

"NeoCov has been found in bats and in its current form there is no threat of the virus jumping from bats to humans," said DAK President and Influenza expert Dr Nisar ul Hassan.

The DAK President said news reports about NeoCov virus's potential to kill one of every three infected persons are doing the rounds on the internet for the last couple of days. The news is based

on a preprint paper by Chinese researchers.

"However, there is little connection between the paper and inference that have been drawn by news reports," he said.

"The researchers clearly

say that the virus which exists in bats cannot infect humans except in case the virus undergoes a particular type of mutation which is a mere speculation," said Dr Nisar.

"The idea that NeoCov may be able to infect human beings is in the realms of theory and should not be a

cause of concern," he said.

General Secretary DAK Dr Arshad Ali said coronaviruses are often found in animals, including bats which have been identified as a natural reservoir of many of these viruses.

"Not everything jumps to humans and there is no way of predicting anything," he said.

"It is important that we must continue surveillance of zoonotic pathogens as the likelihood of potential spillover events from animals to humans is possible," he added.

Regarding the progress under PM Kisan, the meeting was apprised that there are 78191 Farm Operating Families in the district and so far 09 installments have been credited to the accounts of the beneficiaries.

While reviewing the status of the progress on Kisan Credit card scheme, it was informed that 97 percent farmers of the district have been covered under the scheme. He directed the concerned to expedite the progress and ensure that all the beneficiaries are covered under KCC. Discussing the activities being carried out in the field of apiculture, it was informed that there are 136 departmental colonies and 36 registered beekeepers in the district.

Regarding the Soil Health Card scheme, he advised the officers to motivate the farmers to get their soil tested as it helps them improve the health of different crops grown by them.
