## Rajouri Admn scales up SEHAT, e-Shram registration campaign

RAJOURI: Intending to saturate the district under SEHAT scheme and E Shram Portal, the District Administration Rajouri is going to start its special three days enrollment camps at different locations from January 4 to 6 January 2022 to add all the left out beneficiaries under the twin schemes.

The camps are being organized on the directions of the District Development Commissioner Rajouri, Vikas Kundal.

PM-JAY is the world's largest health insurance/assurance scheme fully financed by the government. It provides a cover of Rs. 5 lakhs per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization across public and private empanelled hospitals in India.

Similarly, E Shram portal is the first-ever National Database of Unorganised Sector Workers (NDUW) created by the Ministry of Labour and Employment to register the unorganized workers.

The VLEs, Arogya Mitras and staff of the Education Department have been deployed for the task and directed to ensure cent percent coverage of all the eligible persons under the scheme during these camps.

General public has been requested to attend the camps for registrations with due adherence to covid protocols.

The field functionaries deployed for the task will also highlight the benefits of SEHAT scheme and E Shram to motivate them for registration.

The registration process will be monitored by the incharge Panchayat officers to ensure coverage of all the left out beneficiaries of their areas within three days.

Deputy Commissioner Rajouri, Vikas Kundal is making concrete efforts to cover the left out persons under these welfare initiatives of the Government. He has also directed the concerned authorities to work in a mission mode to saturate the district under these schemes to enable the public to avail the benefits.

BASOHLI: Col Mahan Singh (Retd.) DDC Chairman Kathua on Sunday said that the BJP Government led by PM Narendra Modi is committed to provide road link to all the villages and far flung areas.

He was addressing a gathering after inaugurating construction of 1 Km road stretch between Mann Badial and Sankhi Upper tribal areas at the cost of Rs 15 lakh.

Hundreds of Tribals and members of minority community have gathered at Gujjar Mohalla Sankhi to attend the inaugural ceremony. As Col Mahan cut the cer-

emonial ribbon the place started resonating with the slogans in praise of PM Narendra Modi and the country.

The DDC Chairman said that two separate roads connecting Pretha/Plassi with Sankhi, and Plakh with Pathiyara/Basohli have been sanctioned at a cost of Rs 5 Crore each with 3 Km stretch under Phase I. He added that these two roads will connect isolated areas of Pretha, Plakh and Plahi since construction of Ranjit Sagar Dam has alienated these areas.

Col Mahan Singh said that not only in Kathua but the government is afoot to con-

nect all the rural hamlets and far flung areas with the district headquarters by Pacca roads across the Union Territory. He said that the road network which the Modi government has provided to people is unprecedented and the same is the case of national highways as the current pace of construction of national highways in the country is near 50 Km per day which is a record.

Talking specifically about Basohli, he said that the upcoming road from Kathua-Mahanpur-Bani and Doda as part of Baharatmala project will entirely transform the Sub-District region by ensuring all round development.

## OBC status: Provide equal rights to J&K Jats at par with other states, says Ch Manmohan

KATHUA: All India Jat Maha Sabha (AIJMS) President and former Mayor, Chandhary Manmohan Singh while urging the Central as well as J&K Govt to immediately grant OBC status to the community members thus doing justice with them after having faced discrimination for decades, appealed to the Prime Minister Narendra Modi to intervene and ensure that the aforesaid status is granted at the earliest. He reiterated this demand in his address during a meeting of the All India Jat Maha Sabha (AIJMS) at Kathua which was presided over by him. A large number of members of Jat community participated in the meeting and highlighted the problems being faced by them. Addressing the meeting, Ch

Manmohan Singh expressed resentment against the J&K and Central Governments for depriving the Jat community members of their due share. He stated that in 11 states, Jats are enjoying the benefits of OBC status while the Jats of Jammu and Kashmir continue to be deprived of the same.

Ch Manmohan Singh said Modi Govt has always been reiterating the committed to provide equal rights to J&K people at par with people of the country. But the Jats continue to face numerous problems on various counts here in Jammu and Kashmir. He said that earlier Article 370 was cited as the hurdle in conferring OBC status to the Jat Community but now when Articles 370 as well as Article 35A are gone and full authority lies in the hands of the Union Govt why the government is adopting a dilly-dallying attitude on this very significant issue concerning the Jats of J&K. He also raised serious concern over dilly-dally tactics adopted by the government for not providing ownership rights to people of Jat community having possession of land for the last more than 30 years.

Ch Manmohan Singh

appealed to the Prime Minister Narendra Modi to come to the rescue of Jats of Jammu and Kashmir and grant OBC status to them so that they also enjoy the rights at par with the Jats in other eleven states of the nation.

In the meeting, the members of Jat community unanimously accepted the call of the AIJMS President Ch Manmohan Singh to vote and support only such political party and leader in the forthcoming elections which extends support to Jat community in getting their due rights i.e. granting of OBC status to Jats.
