Goons roamed freely & there were riots in UP when SP was in power: Rajnath

KASGANJ (UP): Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Sunday said while the BJP has ensured good law and order as well as development in Uttar Pradesh, goons used to roam freely and there were riots when the Samajwadi Party was in power.

He also said that now goons and the mafia do not get protection, "but bulldozers are run over their illegal properties".

"I want to know why riots always happened during the SP's (Samajwadi Party) government. Why did goons and miscreants roam freely in their regime," Singh said while campaigning here for next month's assembly elections in the state.

Voting will be held in Kasaganj on February 20 in the third phase of the seven phase polls.

Highlighting the achievements of the BJP government in the state, Singh claimed that "not a single riot took place in the five years of the BJP government".

The previous government in the state was that of the SP, which was defeated by the BJP in the 2017 assembly polls.

Lauding the state government for the law and order situation in Uttar

Pradesh, he said that "when the law and order situation is good, development also takes place rapidly".

"Today if Uttar Pradesh is witnessing development, then there is better law and order behind it. Now goons, mafia do not get protection, but bulldozers are run over their illegal properties," he added.

Singh attacked opposition SP, Bahujan Samaj Party and Congress, saying those who get cut from their roots becomes like a kite with broken thread.

Praising Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, he assured voters that "we will do development and also save our heritage".

In his address, Singh sought support of voters and asked them to help the BJP in forming a majority government in the state.

The Supreme Court on Friday refused to "lay down any yardstick" for granting reservation in promotion to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes in government jobs, saying the determination of their inadequate rep-

resentation is the discretion of the State.

The forum also wrote to Minister of State for Personnel Jitendra Singh recently, seeking the promotions and on other matters related to the CSS. Verma said the DoPT had, in June 2018, issued instructions to all the departments and ministries to carry out promotions, subject to the outcome of the apex court judgment in the matter of reservation in promotions.

Accordingly, all departments and ministries have been continuously issuing regular promotion orders of all central government employees, but only the CS division under the DoPT has not issued any such order for regular promotions in the CSS for more than six years on the pretext of pending court cases, he added. For the last eight months, Verma said, the DoPT has even stopped giving ad-hoc promotions.

It is ironical that in different departments and ministries, CSS officers are issuing regular promotion orders of other cadre officers, however, they are being denied even ad-hoc promotion, even after more than 1,800 vacancies in different grades. This has severely impacted the functioning of the central secretariat as the CSS officers are highly frustrated and feeling much de-motivated," he said.

In addition to the over 1,800 existing vacancies, there are more than 2,700 officials working on ad-hoc promotions, he said. "The Central Secretariat Service is one of the earliest organised services of the government of India. Despite this, CSS officers, who are considered to be the backbone of the government of India's function-

ing, are distressed over their long-delayed promotions by their cadre-controlling authority, DoPT, apparently due to a pending case in the Supreme Court," the officer said.

Cong showing love for armed forces with eye on polls: Prahalad Joshi

DEHRADUN: Union Minister Prahalad Joshi on Sunday accused the Congress party of making just a show of its love for the armed forces with an eye on polls and asked why did it not implement the one-rank-one-pension plan if it cared for them.

Dubbing INC as an acronym for the "Indian National Confusion", Joshi, also the BJP's Uttarakhand election in-charge, said it becomes a party of Hindus whenever convenient and a lover of the armed forces when the polls are round the corner. "It should explain why did it not implement the OROP scheme despite being in power at the Centre for decades if it cared for the armed forces personnel. It should tell why did it not buy modern weapons and equipment required by the armed forces, he asked. The people of Uttarakhand can never forget how the Congress once called the country's first Chief of Defence Staff and pride of the state Gen Bipin Rawat a "streetside hooligan" and demanded a proof of the surgical strike, he added.

Responding to the government's stand, Sumesh Nair, Co-founder and CEO of Board Infinity says, "The directive by UGC against the 'franchise arrangement' is an enormous blow on all Ed-Tech companies engaged in upskilling space, offering courses in distance learning and online mode in association with recognised universities and institutions".

Chidambaram said the feedback from the ground is "positive" and expressed confidence that the Congress' alliance would do well as the "anti-BJP sentiment" is gathering pace everyday.

After suffering BJP's 'misrule' for 10 years, the people of Goa want a non-BJP government, he said.

"Among all the states and UTs, Goa registered the lowest in real GDP growth in 2019-20, the year for which data has been published by the RBI? Goa and Goans deserve better," he said.

Chidambaram expressed confidence that the people of Goa will vote the Congress and its ally GFP to form the next government.

Assembly polls for all 40 seats in Goa will be held on February 14.

No tie-up with NCP-Shiv Sena for Goa polls but 'we are & will remain friends': Chidambaram

NEW DELHI: Senior Congress leader P Chidambaram on Sunday said an alliance could not be forged between his party and the NCP-Shiv Sena for the Goa Assembly polls despite best efforts but asserted that they "will remain friends" and after the elections, the Congress would continue to explore opportunities to "work together" with them. Chidambaram, who is the Congress' senior election observer for the Goa Assembly polls, also hit out at the TMC for its bars at the Congress for not forging an alliance with it, saying the party continued to poach Congress leaders, despite making an offer of a tie-up.

The senior Congress leader said he received no instructions from the party leadership to hold talks with the Trinamool Congress (TMC) and added that, "I am sure our leadership had taken into account all the facts and circumstances".

In an interview with PTI, Chidambaram said that among all the States and UTs, Goa registered the lowest in real GDP growth in 2019-20, the year for which data has been published by the RBI, and asserted that Goans "deserve better".

He also said that whether the Congress would announce a chief ministerial name before or after the elections would be decided after consulting all the candidates and the party would go by the consensus among them.

He also asserted that the contest in the Goa polls is "between the Congress (plus Goa Forward Party) and the BJP and we will be able to win a simple majority". Asked why the Congress was not able

to tie up with other Opposition parties especially the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) and the Shiv Sena, Chidambaram said the NCP and Shiv Sena are the Congress' allies in Maharashtra and it would have liked them to be allies in Goa as well.

"We tried. They made certain proposals. We made certain proposals. Unfortunately, there was no meeting point. I acknowledge that both sides had compulsions and despite our best efforts we could not find a meeting point," Chidambaram said.

"Nevertheless, we are friends and will remain friends. After the elections, we will continue to explore opportunities to work together with NCP and Shiv Sena," he said.

After the 2019 Assembly elections in Maharashtra, the Shiv Sena, which till then allied with the BJP, joined hands with the NCP and the Congress, to form a government, which was given the name Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA). The Shiv Sena and the NCP had earlier this month announced that they would contest the Goa elections together.

Asked about the TMC's bars at the Congress over not forging a tie-up with it, Chidambaram said he is not able to understand the TMC's position.

"They entered Goa a few months ago and my distinguished friend, Mamata, declared in Goa that TMC had formed an alliance and any other party was welcome to join their alliance. The General Secretary of TMC declared that TMC will contest all 40 seats. Then, they lured Mr Luizinho Faleiro, Congress MLA, to the TMC," Chidambaram said.

The Congress announced its first list

of candidates on December 16, including the name of Reginald Laurence, sitting MLA, and four days later, on December 20, Laurence was admitted to the TMC, he said, detailing the sequence of events.

"On December 24, TMC's Vice President met me and suggested that the two parties should work together in Goa. I agreed to convey the suggestion to our leadership, and I promptly did," he said. However, the TMC continued to poach our leaders, sarpanches, panches, etc., for example in Vasco and Marmugao, he said.

"I received no instructions from our leadership to hold talks with TMC. I am sure our leadership had taken into account all the facts and circumstances. As far as I was concerned, the matter rested there," Chidambaram said.

On the Congress MLAs switching to BJP in the current assembly and what measures the party was taking to prevent a repeat, the Congress' Goa polls in-charge said "loyalty" is the "top priority" for the party.

The most important measure which has been implemented in 30 constituencies is that candidates recommended by the Block have been selected to contest the elections, he said.

"Blocks were asked to place loyalty as the top criterion. Next, the candidates spontaneously offered to take a pledge before a Temple, a Church and a Dargah. I think such a pledge has removed any lingering doubt about the loyalty of our candidates to the Congress Party and to the voters who will vote to office," Chidambaram said.
