

Shiv Sena constitutes 'Women & Child Protection Cell'

JAMMU: Shiv Sena Jammu and Kashmir unit has announced the formation of its 'Women and Child Protection Cell'.

During a programme organized at the party state office, president UT J&K, Manish Sahni said that this cell has been constituted under the guidance of Party National Secretary and MP, Anil Desai. Sahni accused the government for not being serious on the significant issue concerning the safety of women.

Sahni said that with the abrogation of Article 370 the State Women Commission got abolished.

Despite the lapse of a long gap of 30 months, the Women's Commission could not be constituted, due to which women of J&K are being forced to accept the

crimes committed against them as their destiny, he said. Sahni said that being a Union Territory, there should be 33% reservation for women in the police force, but unfortunately Lt. Government of J&K has given just 15%. On the other hand Jammu and Kashmir does not have district level women police station and even most of the police stations does not have women desks.

Sahni said that this attitude proves that government is non-serious to provide justice and security to almost half the population of J&K.

While announcing the office bearers of this cell, Sahni announced Preeti Joshi as President Jammu division, Geeta Lakhotra as General Secretary, Vaishnavi Hindustani and Nagina Khan as Secretary, Meenakshi Sharma and

Bina Devi as joint Secretaries.

JAMMU: Peripheral arterial bypass surgery has been commenced at Swami Vivekananda Medical Mission (SVMM) Hospital Amphalla with successful bypass surgery of a 47-year-old patient Pritam Chand, whose artery is blocked.

This surgery is a high end technical procedure which is performed in ever

increasing number of occlusive arterial disease known as PAD and it is at present performed in a limited number of centres.

However at SVMM, the patient underwent this procedure at a very reasonable expense which is much less as compared to the other centres.

These surgeries are performed by experienced vascular surgeon anesthetist and trained paramedical staff and full logistic sup-

port of management of Swami Vivekananda Medical Mission. The hospital is already offering facilities for latest endovascular phlebology procedures for varicose veins which has generated a significant response already in addition to radiofrequency proctology procedures hemodialysis facility and vascular access procedure at a very patient friendly budget which has been the tradition of the hospital.
