



CRIME REPORT**3 drug peddlers arrested; psychotropic substance recovered****STATE TIMES NEWS**

SOPORE: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs from society, police on Monday arrested 3 drug peddlers in Sopore and recovered psychotropic substance recovered from their possession.

As per details, officers from Police Post Warpora at a checkpoint established at Chinar Crossing Warpora intercepted three suspicious persons. During checking, 12 bottles of Codeine Phosphate were recovered from their possession. The accused were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 03/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Sopore and investigation started.

Theft in GHS Jatwal, 16 batteries stolen**STATE TIMES NEWS**

SAMBA: Thieves on Monday burgled Government High School Jatwal and decamped with 16 batteries of 5 KV solar panels.

As per details, School Head Master Darshana Devi lodged a complaint with police stating that from December 24 to January 2, the school was closed for winter vacations and the day when it reopened, she found 16 solar panel batteries stolen from school. Police has registered a case and started investigation.

Rs 54,930 fine recovered from SoPs violators in Rajouri**STATE TIMES NEWS**

RAJOURI: Continuing the enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across the district Rajouri, the joint COVID control teams on Monday fined 516 violators and recovered a fine of Rs 54,930 for not adhering to COVID Appropriate Behaviour.

The Chief Medical Officer, Dr Shamma Un Nissa Bhatti informed that as many as 15,100 vaccine doses were administered to persons of different age-groups across the Rajouri district on Monday. It is pertinent to mention here that 4,882 samples including 704 RT-PCR and 4178 RAT tests were also conducted in the district.

Deputy Commissioner Rajouri, Vikas Kundal has set a daily target of testing. He further urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at designated COVID Vaccination Centers.

Absconder wanted in several cases detained**STATE TIMES NEWS**

RAJOURI: Police on Monday nabbed an absconder who was wanted in many cases at Rajouri. As per details, a party of Police Station Rajouri headed by SHO Police Station Rajouri Insp Fareed Ahmed and assisted by PSI Shokit Iqbal of Police Station Rajouri laid a surprise Naka at Jawahar Nagar area. During Naka checking, police party arrested a notorious thief, drug addict/absconder and habitual offender Sunny Sharma, son of Romesh Chander, resident of Ward-5 Jawahar Nagar, Rajouri.

As per record of Police Station Rajouri, various cases were registered and Challaned in the court of law vide FIR No 428/2012 under sections 307/341/323/382/34 of RPC; FIR No 503/13 under section 379 of RPC; 626/14 under section 379 of RPC; FIR No 158/15 under sections 353/336/332 of RPC; 529/15 under sections 457/380 of RPC; FIR No 71/16 under sections 380 of RPC; FIR No 748/16 under sections 457/380 of RPC; FIR No 755/16 under sections 457/380 of RPC; FIR No 13/17 under sections 382/34 of RPC; FIR No 134/17 under sections 234 of RPC; FIR No 443/20 under sections 457/380 of IPC; FIR No 423/20 under sections 232/224 of IPC and FIR No 407/20 under sections 457/380/109 of IPC.

However, warrant of arrest under section 512 of CrPC has been issued by the court which include warrant under section 512 of CrPC in FIR No 71/16 under sections 380/201 of RPC; FIR No 620/12 under sections 457/380 of RPC and FIR No 407/20 under section 457/380 of IPC. The accused is presently in Police lock-up and will be produced before the court of law.

Five peddlers arrested with heroin & Charas**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Jammu Police achieved major success by recovering 36 gm heroin i.e., 15 gm heroin by Police Station R S Pura, 6 gm by Police Station Domana, 9 gm by Police Station City, 6 gm by Police Station Gandhi Nagar and 160 gm Charas by Police Station R S Pura, from five different drug peddlers during patrolling duty in their respective jurisdictions.

As per details, during Naka checking, a police team of Police Station R S Pura led by SHO Insp Jai Pal Sharma constituted under supervision of SDPO R S Pura Shabir Khan, rounded up two suspects traveling in a vehicle. On search, 15 gm heroin and 160 gm Charas was recovered from the possession of suspects, who were identified as Vijay Kumar, son of Ashok Kumar, resident of R S Pura and Parvinder Singh, son of Kulbir Singh, resident of Chohalla R S Pura. The vehicle involved in crime was seized.

On the other hand, a team from Police Station Domana led by SHO Domana Insp Mahesh Sharma assisted by PSI Sumit Sharma during patrolling duty near Muthi camp area rounded up a suspect namely Manpreet Singh, son of Balwant Singh, resident of Top Paloura, Jammu. On search, 6 gm heroin was recovered from him.

Similarly, teams from Police Station City and Police Station Gandhi Nagar led by SHO City Inspri Vijay Kumar and SHO Gandhi Nagar Inspri Pankaj Sharma during patrolling duty in area rounded up two different suspects namely Anuj Dubey, son of Uttam Chand, resident of Lower Mastgarh Jammu and Ashwani Kumar alias Patti, son of Late Kamal Kumar, resident of Nanak Nagar Jammu. During search, 9 gm heroin was recovered from the possession of Anuj Dubey while 6 gm heroin was recovered from Ashwani alias Patti. On this, FIR No. 02/2022 under sections 8/20/21/22/29 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station R S Pura; FIR No. 02/22 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Domana; FIR No. 01/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station City and FIR No. 01/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Gandhi Nagar. All the peddlers were arrested. The overall arrests and recoveries were made under the supervision of SDPO R S Pura Shabir Khan, SDPO Domana Sunil Singh, SDPO North Sharad Kalu and SDPO South P K Mengi respectively. Further investigation is going on.

7 vehicles seized for illegal mining**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: In a quest to check menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which teams from Police Stations Domana, Nagrota, Police Posts Chatta & Chatha acted stringently on specific inputs and raided different locations in their respective areas and seized 7 different vehicles involved in illegal mining. JAMMU: In a massive drive against bovine smuggling, Jammu Police rescued 13 bovines from three different vehicles during Naka checking at Ban Toll Plaza Nagrota.

The accused were identified as Mohd Hanief, son of Abdul Rishid, resident of Dablaheer, R S Pura District Jammu (driver of vehicle JK02CN/5243); Amir Hussain, son of Liaquat Ali, resident of Kachwan, Anantnag (associate with vehicle No JK02CN 5243); Sadam Husain, son of Mohd Raiz, resident of Gunn Reasi (driver of vehicle JK02CU/1566); Mohd Sadiq, son of Nazir Ahmed Chouhan, resident of Qaziqund (associate of vehicle JK02CU/1566) and Mohd Gafoor, son of Shah Mohd, resident of Wali Nalla Udhampur (driver of vehicle JK14E/6012). The arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Inspri Vishav Pratap Singh under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Parupkar Singh. The operation was done under guidance of SP Rural Sanjay Sharma.




