

4 ventilator-fitted beds in every PHC must: Sadhotra

JAMMU: In view of WHO alarming report regarding severe 3rd wave of Corona and also Omicron, former Minister and senior National Conference leader, Ajay Kumar Sadhotra asked J&K Government to provide four ventilators fitted beds and 10 oxygen fitted in every Primary Health Centre (PHC) of Jammu and Kashmir. Sadhotra said this while addressing a meeting of prominent workers of Block Bhalwal held under the Chairmanship of Subash Chander Bhagat, Block President and was organized by Ch. Bagh Ali, Zonal Vice President (Central). Sadhotra further said that last time Govt. took a decision to provide oxygen gas cylinder fitted beds in every Panchayat. The decision was welcomed by one and all but to utter surprise neither oxygen nor a

trained person to operate was provided and the decision was implemented. "Government should ensure that this decision is implemented in letter & spirit so that immediate oxygen fitted bed is provided to the patient," he said and also urged the Govt to put Omicron and COVID-19 preparedness programme to treat and prevention in public domain so that people could know in case of illness where to go for treatment and to avoid panic.

LEH: To improve connectivity in rural areas, the Lieutenant Governor of Ladakh, RK Mathur, on Monday distributed smartphones to village-level workers (VLWs) in the presence of Secretary, IT, Saugat Biswas.

These smartphones were distributed to 10 Gram Panchayat each in Leh and Kargil districts on a pilot basis to bridge the connectivity gap and enable people in the rural areas to make free calls to any

cellular network through VSAT Wi-Fi. These smartphones preinstalled with a one-year subscription of the BSNL Wings application would be placed at the Panchayat Ghar for usage by the villagers free of cost.

Secretary IT Saugat Biswas informed the Lieutenant Governor that the villagers earlier used VSATs for internet connectivity but were unable to make voice calls. However, now the villagers can make free calls using smartphones.

JAMMU: Chief Engineer (Distribution) JPDCL Jammu has informed that the power supply to Badyal Brahmana, Suhagpur, Kotli, Jabowal, Part of Arnia, Trewa, Gadigarh, Dhrap, Indra Nagar and its adjoining areas shall remain affected on January 04 from 9 am to 2 pm.

Similarly, the power supply to Pargwal, Channi Tanna, Rajpura, Bhalwal Bharat, Dhalwal Mulu Hanipurkona, BSF and adjoining areas shall remain affected on January 04 from 9 am to 3 pm. Likewise, the power supply to Gool, Dharam and adjoining areas shall remain affected on January 04 from 10 am to 4 pm.

Similarly, the power supply to areas being fed from Grid Stations-Sidhra-I & II, Jhajjarkothi, BB-II, Akhnoor, Kalakote and some non-essential areas of Grid Station Janipur shall remain off on January 04 from 11 am to 3 pm.

Vaccinating 15-18 yr age-group will be big respite to parents: Arvind

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir BJP Secretary & Vaccination Incharge, Arvind Gupta, while expressing gratitude to Narendra Modi government and the UT for launching the vaccination for 15-18 years age group, said that it will cover a large population and give respite to the parents of their children.

In a statement, Arvind said that

the decision of the government to start vaccinating for this age group will not only be one more step towards ensuring the benefit of dose to the uncovered young children but also free parents of the worries related to their safety and well being.

Arvind, who has been coordinating the vaccination exercise with the UT administration on behalf of the party, informed that after its launch-

ing on January 3, a target of 8.33 lakh has been fixed, which will be completed in ten days time.

The Health Department has collaborated with the Education Department, under which first dose of COVAXIN will be injected to the students in the school premises itself. Moreover, this facility can be availed by non school going children in the already established vaccina-

tion centres across Jammu and Kashmir. Arvind further shared that those born in 2004 or earlier will be benefitted by it and appealed the people to strictly follow the Covid Appropriate Behaviour in view of the reports of Omicron variant of the virus.

Gupta said that those falling in the fixed age group, will be given second dose after 28 days.

Speaking after the launch, the Minister said, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the entire concept and format of the PM's Excellence Award has undergone a revolutionary change since 2014. PM's Awards for Excellence in Public Administration portal for the year 2021-2022 is www.pmaawards.gov.in. For the year 2021, the scheme for Prime Minister's Awards for Excellence in Public Administration aims to recognize the contribution of civil servants in: 1)Promoting 'Jan Bhagidari' or Peoples' participation in Poshan Abhiyan 2)Promoting excellence in sports and wellness through Khelo India scheme 3) Digital Payments and good governance in PM SVANidhi Yojana 4) Holistic Development through One District One Product scheme 5) Seamless, End-to-End Delivery of Services without Human Intervention and 6) Innovations. The applications for the award would be required to cover all the aspects of implementation of a scheme in holistic manner; such as, activities covering production stage, quality control, governance and outcomes.

The eligibility to submit nominations for the Prime Minister's Awards 2021 will be open to the following:Awards for Scheme 1, 2, 3 and 4 for holistic development to Districts, while Award for Scheme 5 shall be open to Districts, as well as any service providing Department/ Organisation of Centre or State with one Award for the District and one Award for others. Awards for Innovation: Organizations of Central/ State Governments / Districts/Implementing Units. The Period of consideration is 1st April 2019 to 31st Dec, 2021. The total number of Awards under the Prime Minister's Awards for Excellence in Public Administration 2021 would be 18. The Criteria for evaluation of PM's Awards, 2021:Based on pre-determined indicators in consultation with Line Ministries/ Departments (excluding Innovation). There would be a mix of common parameters across schemes and flexible parameters which would be provided by the concerned Line Ministries/Department. The award for Innovation Category will be evaluated based on introducing and implementing an innovative idea/scheme/project to meet stakeholders' requirements.
