# No traffic on Srinagar-Sonamarg-Gumri road today due to fresh snowfall

LEH: As per the weather advisory issued by the Meteorological Department, some parts of Ladakh have received fresh snowfall on the intervening night of Monday and Tuesday. Light to heavy snowfall is likely to continue for the next few days in different parts of the Union Territory as per the weather forecast. On account of fresh snowfall and slippery roads, district police Kargil has suspended traffic movement on Srinagar-Sonamarg-Gumri Road and on Kargil-Zanaskar Road for Wednesday, 5th January 2022. People within the district have been advised to use Anti-Skid chains while driving. Several parts of Leh district including Nubra and Shame also received fresh snowfall. Traffic on Khardongla road was temporarily affected due to snowfall. District Administration Leh has put all concerned departments on the job to ensure minimum disturbances in essential

supplies due to bad weather.

On Monday the Meteorological Department issued a weather advisory alerting that two Successive Western Disturbances would most likely affect the Union Territories of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh and adjoining areas from 3rd January (late night) to 9th January (forenoon), 2022. "Under the influence of these weather systems, Widespread Moderate

Rain/snow is expected in Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh regions. Light rain/snow would commence at a few places of Kashmir from 3rd January evening and thereafter increase in intensity & distribution. Main activity of this system will be the occurrence of Moderate to Heavy rain/snow, most likely during 5th and 8th January and mutual decrease thereafter," it added.

JAMMU: Highlighting plight of PoJK displaced persons in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, the leaders of All J&K PoJK 1947 Sharnarhi Intellectual Forum urged the Union Home Minister to fulfill all the promises made with the DPs of 1947. While addressing a Press Conference here on Tuesday under the leadership of its President, Adv Amrik Singh and joined by General

Secretary Surjit Singh along with other senior members of forum, the leaders said that due to Pak aggression in 1947, about 40,000 PoJK people sacrificed their lives for the sake of country but their family members are known as Sharnarthees, even after 74 years.

Speaking on the occasion, Amrik Singh said that the DPs tried a lot to highlight their issues at every level, but it is a matter of grave concern that nothing con-

crete was done by any Government to resolve all their genuine issues, till date. He urged the Union Home Minister to fulfill all the promises made with PoJK DPs without any further delay. Surjit Singh, General Secretary urged Chairman of Delimitation Commission to defreeze at least 10 seats for PoJK DPs.

Other demands highlighted on the occasion included releasing balance ex-gratia relief of Rs 24.50 lakh, granting Pahari and Minority status to PoJK DPs, giving official language status to Punjabi etc.

# Dr Jitendra releases Special Postage Stamp commemorating 75th Platinum Jubilee year

NEW DELHI: Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh on Tuesday released a Special Postage Stamp commemorating the 75th Platinum Jubilee year of CSIR-National Physical Laboratory (NPL) New Delhi.

The Minister also dedicated the nation 'LED Photometry Laboratory' at CSIR-National Physical Laboratory, New Delhi to fulfill Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision to develop energy-efficient illumination technology. He also inaugurated Science Exhibition by school students and interacted with them on the demonstrated themes and subjects. Later, addressing the

galaxy of scientists and students, Dr Jitendra said that CSIR-NPL is a monumental illustration of India's incredible scientific journey in the last 75 years. Dr Jitendra said that all the six Science & Technology (S&T) departments including Space and Atomic energy and the Autonomous Institutes have contributed hugely in the fight against COVID-19 through the research for development of vaccines, genome sequencing and other protocols. He said, the first DNA vaccine trial was done by the Department of Bio-Technology and it has again taken the lead for the Omicron Virus. In his concluding

remarks, Dr Jitendra said that three important tasks of integration of different Science Streams among themselves and with the general line Ministry Streams in due course, speedy conversion of lab technologies for use by common man at affordable costs and giving proper recognition to Scientists have become a necessity to achieve at the earliest.

Referring to the 'LED Photometry Laboratory' at CSIR-NPL, Dr Jitendra said, this national level facility would contribute to making India 'Atma-Nirbhar' in the apex level calibration and testing of LED lighting products. 'These will not only save the

foreign exchange spent on availing testing and calibration services from abroad but also significantly reduce turn-around time. The Minister also released Bharatiya Nirdeshak Dravya (BNDs) to support the testing and calibration laboratories for quality assurance at par with the international standards for high purity gold, silver and other elements. He also launched Certification Process for Indian made Ambient Ozone Analyzers.

Among other releases to mark the Platinum Jubilee celebrations, Dr Jitendra Singh launched the Calibration Facility for Infusion Pump Analyzer used

for testing the infusion pump. He also launched Certification Process for Indian Made Low-Volume PM2.5 Sampler to fight pollution. The Minister launched the Responsive Website of CSIR-NPL, the aim of which is to showcase and disseminate the details about the Metrology-related activities of CSIR-NPL, in a fully responsive and more appealingly designed format.

DG CSIR, Dr. Shekhar C. Mande, Director CSIR-NPL, Professor Venugopal Achanta, Ashok Kumar, Post Master General, Dr C.Sharma, Senior Scientist, CSIR and other Scientists, Students and Officials took part in the event.
