## Push for systematically improving indices of teaching-learning process, effective implementation of NEP-2020: Advisor Bhatnagar

JAMMU: Advisor to Lieutenant Governor, Rajeev Rai Bhatnagar on Friday asked the officers of the School Education Department to work in the direction of systematically improving the different indices in teaching-learning process besides effective implementation of National Education Policy-2020 (NEP-2020) across the schools of UT of Jammu and Kashmir.

The Advisor made these remarks while reviewing the performance of the Department in a meeting at Civil Secretariat here which was attended by Directors of both the provinces, Project Director, Samagra Shiksha, Chairperson JKBOSE and other concerned officials of the department both in person and through video conferencing.

Speaking during the meet, the Advisor emphasised on the officers that there are set parameters devised by different national and international bodies to assess the teaching-learning outcomes. They should not restrict their activities to surveys only but work for improving the overall outcomes using the finding of these surveys.

Highlighting the need of holding training sessions for teachers, Advisor Bhatnagar said that teachers need retraining and upskilling. He asked the department to hold specific training sessions for each group of teachers as per their ability and requirements. He advised them to set a target of pushing each of them to a certain standard of quality for better learning outcomes among pupils they teach. The Advisor also asked the officers to assess

the fruitfulness of training sessions by assessing the capacity building of each trainee.

Advisor Bhatnagar directed the officers to factor out the reasons for drop-outs at upper primary/middle level. He also remarked that the department will be held responsible and accountable for learning outcomes and timely creation and maintenance of infrastructure. It was further revealed in the meeting that the drop-out rate of J&K stands at 3.91 for Primary, 3.2 for upper primary and 16.7 for High school students which is lower than the national average of 4.6, 4.8 and 18.6 respectively for above categories of classes.

It was also informed that the net enrollment ratio for J&K is 81.73, 47.12, 29.32, 29.00 at Primary, upper primary, high and higher secondary level respectively.

Reviewing the ongoing developmental activities at Bagh-e-Bahu Garden, the Chief Secretary directed conversion of the guest house building the Garden into a museum to boost the footfall of visitors.

The Chief Secretary further asked the Department to explore the possibilities of establishing Tulip Gardens at Sonamarg and Gulmarg to prolong the tourist season in the Union territory, besides identifying other flower crops suitable to the climatic conditions of Jammu and Kashmir. The Chief Secretary impressed upon the Department to develop thematic gardens at each tourist place.

The Department was asked to undertake a study of the asset based and corresponding proportion in the economic activity of J&K.



## JK Govt formulates Rules for 'outstanding sportspersons': Farooq Khan

**Rules stipulate appointment of sportspersons to gazetted, other jobs**

JAMMU: The Jammu and Kashmir Government has issued Jammu and Kashmir Appointment of Outstanding Sportspersons Rules, 2022 through a notification by the General Administration Department.

In a press conference held on Friday, Advisor and Vice Chairperson JK Sports Council, Farooq Khan formally announced the new Rules, which have been framed under the aegis of Lieutenant Governor and Chairperson JKSC, Manoj Sinha.

Under the Rules, outstanding sportspersons, holding domicile of J&K, would be eligible to be appointed against gazetted (Level 8) and other non-gazetted posts. Detailed grading system has been mentioned in the notification which would help rank sportspersons applying under the quota.

Advisor informed that sportspersons from 44 recognized sports would be considered under the rules. Besides, 5 outstanding sportspersons would be appointed at gazetted posts, while another 25 would be appointed to non-gazetted posts every year, he added. All backlog under this quota, since 2014,

would also be cleared, he clarified.

Moreover, the gazetted officers would be given one 'out of turn' promotion, while the non-gazetted officers would be given two 'out of turn' promotions throughout their service career.

They are also eligible for 5 special salary increments throughout their career.

It was informed by the Advisor that selection under the rules would be done by a high level committee headed by Chief Secretary and consisting of Home Secretary, Secretary Youth Services and Sports, Secretary GAD and

Secretary Sports Council.

Advisor hailed the rules and said that through the rules, a framework has been established in which sports persons with outstanding achievements would be ranked objectively thereby eliminating chance of favouritism or prejudice.

Farooq Khan termed the rules as "incentive, not welfare" and added, "it is our way of acknowledging sports talent and their achievements".

Sportspersons would be able to submit applications to the JK Sports Council which would forward the cases to the high level

committee. The committee is permanent in nature and would verify and approve the appropriate cases within a 3 months period, preferably around the month of March, informed the Advisor.

Olympics, Winter Olympics as well as Paralympics have been given the greatest weightage under the selection criteria. Such Olympians can score a maximum 60 marks, (including participation and winning medals). Mere one-time participation accounts for 46 marks under the rules. Maximum marks have been set as 100.

Similar marking system has been formulated for other national and international sports events like Asian Games, Commonwealth Games, World Cups, World University Games, International Cricket Matches, National Sports Championships, Inter-Zonal Championships, Senior National Championships etc under the rules.

For gazetted posts, minimum education qualification has been set as Graduation with only exception for Olympics medallists for whom the criteria has been set as class 12 or above.

The Advisor said that the government is trying to incentivize

and promote sports culture in J&K through such measures. A number of sports infrastructure projects have been completed and many others are nearing completion here. Every district has at least one indoor sports stadium for encouraging participation in sports, he added.

The government is establishing state of the art sports stadium all over J&K. The football stadium at Parade Ground Jammu is also about to complete, informed the Advisor.

While answering questions by the mediapersons, the Advisor informed that the government is working to inculcate sports culture at village level and has already ensured that each panchayat has one sports ground and minimum possible equipment. Besides, a grant of Rs 25,000 per panchayat has already been given in this regard, he said. He also assured of setting up an indoor sports facility at Jagti and other sports facilities at Purkhoo and Muthi camps at Jammu.

Secretary J&K Sports Council, Nuzhat Gul, was also present in the press conference.

## For Jammu or against Jammu

Now that the Gupkar gang as a group and its constituents, including Farooq Abdullah's NC, Mehbooba Mufti's PDP and MY Tarigami's CPIM; Sonia Gandhi Congress' leaders like GN Azad and Saifud-Din Soz; and Apni Party of Altaf Bukhari, have again and again opposed the Delimitation Commission's proposal that allocates 43 seats to Jammu province, including six out of seven additional seats, in the 90-member assembly with some even urging the Commission to allot at least three seats to Kashmir out of the seven reserved seats for the SCs in Jammu province, it's time for the Jammu-based supporters of all the these Kashmiri parties to tell the people of Jammu province if they stand with them or if they stand with their masters in Kashmir.

The Jammu-based supporters of the Kashmir-based parties have to decide if they are with the suffering people of Jammu province or if they are with those in Kashmir who destroyed Jammu province and treated its citizens as their slaves for 72-long years and who continue to taunt, abuse and oppose

them in a most brazen manner telling them that they have no other option but to groan under their oppressive misrule. They have to tell the people of Jammu province if and why they support the December 29, 2021 and January 01, 2022 anti-Jammu protests held by the Apni Party and Gupkar Gang in Srinagar.

The Jammu-based supporters of the Kashmir-based parties have to tell the people of Jammu province if they support the allotment of six additional seats to Jammu province, reservation of seven seats for the SC communities in Jammu province and reservation of nine seats for the STs, including Gujjars and Bakerwals (all Muslims) and Gaddis (all Hindus). If they support these reservations and endorse the loud clamour in Jammu province for at least 50 seats in the 90-member assembly, they must pass unambiguous resolutions to this effect and submit the same to the Delimitation Commission and hold press conferences in Jammu to tell the Gupkar gang, Azad, Soz, Bukhari, Tarigami and ilk in Kashmir that they are with the suffering people of Jammu province and that they are with the people of Jammu province.

The Jammu-based supporters of the Kashmir-based parties have to make a solemn commitment and that too in writing that they shall work for the disempowered Jammu province, defend and promote further its legitimate cause and oppose tooth and nail those in Kashmir who talk pluralism, secularism, democracy, brotherhood and peaceful co-existence in Jammu but do exactly the opposite in Kashmir. It would hardly matter if the Jammu-based supporters of the Kashmir-based parties operate

from different platforms like their masters in Kashmir operate but speak for the suffering people of Jammu in one voice like all the Kashmir-based parties and groups speak. It is a matter of grave concern that the Jammu-based supporters of the anti-Jammu-based parties have maintained a stoic silence even after December 21, despite grave provocations and despite the no-holds-barred campaign unleashed by their masters in Kashmir against the discriminated against people of Jammu province, Hindus, Muslims and Sikhs included. It must also remain a matter of regret that these Jammu-based supporters of the Kashmir-based anti-Jammu parties, which also demand a semi-independent status for the UT of J&K and seek to force down the throat of Jammu province their separatist will and ideology, continue to talk secularism and democracy in Jammu even after December 20, 2021, when the erstwhile Kashmiri ruling class openly and in a most shameless manner attacked, abused and opposed the people of Jammu province.
