Former Legislator Ch Fateh Mohd passes away

JAMMU: Veteran leader and two time Legislator, Chowdhary Fateh Mohammad passed away at his residence at Gandhi Nagar here, this morning. He was 97. As per family sources, he was not feeling well for the last few months.

Born in a village Darsopur, Miran Sahib, Jammu to Zaildar Chowdhary Hashim Ali, in December 1924, Ch. Fateh Mohammad was a Member of Legislative Council (MLC) for two times between 1972 to 1978 and 1978-1984.

In late sixties he served as Managing Director, JAK-FED in J&K. He was an active member of Indian National Congress (INC) for around five decades.

He survived with three sons including Parvez Chowdhary Addl. SP and Habib Choudhary SE PDD.

Many leaders and scholars expressed deep condolence on his demise including Ch. Talib Hussain Ex Minister, Masud Choudhary former Vice-Chancellor, Dr. Javaid

JAMMU: Jagdev Gag, IYC Secretary in-charge, Jammu & Kashmir Youth Congress, while alleging administration's mismanagement in handling Covid crisis, have sought immediate review of measures to control the ongoing Corona pandemic.

He stated this during an emergent meeting of the party stalwarts after a sudden surge in Covid-19 cases in J&K the other day and overall alarming situation emerging as a result of the Omicron variant of the virus. The meeting was conducted through virtual mode to discuss the challenges posed by the probability of the third wave of the pandemic striking soon.

According to the press note issued by the party, the significant meeting was conducted on the directions of Rahul Gandhi, Krishna Allavar, Incharge Indian Youth Congress; Srinivas BV, National President IYC; Smt. Rajani Patil, Indian National Congress J&K affairs; Ghulam
