'We all must put united and collective efforts to make Jammu a truly smart city and also transform it into the cleanest city", the Lt Governor said after laying the foundation stone for upgradation of Transport Nagar in Jammu.

Kashmir gets respite from extreme cold but day temperature falls

SRINAGAR: Snowfall in the higher reaches and light drizzle in the plains extended the respite from cold wave conditions in Kashmir as minimum temperatures stayed around freezing point in most parts of the valley, officials said on Monday.

There was light to moderate snowfall in hilly areas like Gulmarg, Sonamarg-Zojila and Machhil in Kupwara, the officials said. They said a light drizzle took place over night in many plain areas of the valley.

The meteorological department had forecast moderate snowfall at many places in the higher reaches and light
