change in the lives of around 13 lakh farming families of J&K including 2.62 lakh small and marginal farming families, the Lt Governor noted.

No other region in the country has made such a revolutionary intervention in the Agriculture and allied sector. All arrangements, from seed to market have been made through the implementation framework of the plan, he added.

The Prime Minister has ensured that there would be no shortage of funds for farmers of J&K, the Lt Governor further added.

The Lt Governor also made valuable suggestions to improve productivity and tackling challenges as well as opportunities of the agriculture and allied sectors.

A strong agricultural marketing ecosystem will increase the farm income and reduce the value loss. We are working on covering the entire value chain including inputs, harvesting, processing, packing, storage, besides meeting the need of quality planting material etc. and developing infrastructure and other facilities while taking climatic conditions into consideration, the Lt Governor said.

We have also made provisions to arrange and grow 80% of fodder requirements locally within J&K, he added.

Speaking on the services extended by the government, the Lt Governor said that around 31 lakh land passbooks have been generated and more than 400 public services have been made fully online with a provision of Public Services Guarantee Act.

On the issue of proper functioning of Ranbir Canal, the Lt Governor said that a permanent solution via a policy for uninterrupted and proper functioning of Ranbir Canal will be ensured. He also clarified that there is no such rule for compulsory buying of cattle from outside the region to avail the subsidy. 'And if there is any, I declare it Null & Void', he added.

Bharat Bhushan, Chairman DDC Jammu, extended his gratitude to the Central Government under PM Narendra Modi for ensuring peace at Border areas which has led to development works like the Mega Fruit plant nursery at Chakroi.

Atal Dulloo, Additional Chief Secretary, Agriculture Production Department, congratulated the Horticulture department for completing the project of Mega Fruit Plant Nursery within a stipulated time frame.

This mega fruit plant nursery established with state-of-the-art equipment like Automatic weather monitoring system, will facilitate easy supply of quality fruit saplings.

Prof. JP Sharma, VC SKUAST Jammu, stressed the need to convert low density orchards into high density orchards and increase farmer's income through horticulture.

The Mega Fruit Plant Nursery houses 50 different Blocks for growing mother plants of different fruits including Citrus fruits. Spanning over more than 800 Kanal area the Mega Fruit plant nursery will grow and provide saplings of Guava, mango, litchi, other citrus fruits and also of the Dragon fruit.

It is the biggest fruit nursery in North India. In the coming time, 10 lakh saplings of fruit plants will be distributed to farmers. Micro irrigation system was also established in the mega fruit nursery for irrigation in addition to other advanced facilities and modern equipment. Tissue culture lab and other labs will also be established in the coming time, it was informed.

Several publications including Mega Fruit Plant Nursery Chakroi Magazine, Cultivation of Litchi and Strawberry and Strategic management of Stone Fruit were also released on the occasion.

allegations of irregularities in the written examination conducted by the JKSSB on March 27, 2022 for the recruitment of 1,200 Sub-Inspectors of Jammu and Kashmir Police. The result of this examination was declared on June 4, 2022.

In this case, 13 accused, including the Commandant of Border Security Force, one Assistant Sub Inspector and two constables of Jammu and Kashmir Police, one Central Reserve Police Force Constable, one ex-CRPF official, one teacher, were arrested. Over 36 places were raided to seize records required to produce in court.

Acting tough in the J&K Police Sub Inspectors paper leakage scam, the Central Bureau of Investigations (CBI) had also arrested Dr Karnail Singh, Medical Officer, BSF Frontier Headquarters, Puloura for detailed interrogation as it was established that he was instrumental in selling J&K Police S-I leaked question paper for hefty amount.

Earlier, the CBI had arrested Raman Sharma son of Chuni Lal, a resident of village Nore in Maira Mandrian area of Khour; posted as Selection Grade Constable (SgCT) in Jammu and Kashmir Police, Suresh Sharma, son of Ram Lal Sharma, a resident of Kaink Jageer in Akhnour; a tout and Jagdish Sharma, son of Dhani Ram, resident of Masyal Narayana in Khour; a Government teacher.

Kewal Krishan, an IRP constable posted at Mattan in South Kashmir's Anantnag district, Ashwani Kumar, son of Mela Ram of Kachryal in Khour; who had taken voluntary retirement from CRPF to run paper leak racket and Rakesh Kumar of Pel in Khour area of Akhnour; who had collected Rs 1.25 crore from the beneficiaries were also arrested.

On November 30, the Central Bureau of Investigation carried out searches at 14 locations across Jammu and Samba in connection with alleged irregularities in an exam by Jammu and Kashmir Services Selection Board (JKSSB) for the posts of Accounts Assistant, Finance Department.

Sources informed that huge transactions took place in Panchyat Assistants exam also. And after its preliminary inquiry, the CBI is likely to register another case within next few weeks.

initiated inquest proceedings under section 174 of CrPC to ascertain cause of death. Keeping in view the sensitivity of the case, a special investigating team was constituted by SSP Avantipora under the supervision of SDPO Pampore and investigation was promptly set into motion. During the course of investigation, several family members including the husband of deceased were called for questioning.

During questioning of some of relatives, the investigating team zeroed in on one Altaf Ahmed Ganie, brother-in-law of deceased for further questioning. After sustained questioning, he confessed about his involvement in murder of his sister-in-law. During questioning, he disclosed that since his sister-in-law was alone at home and thus taking advantage of her loneliness, he tried to exploit her sexually however deceased strongly resisted and raised hue and cry. The accused further disclosed that although he firstly tried to pacify her but when she continuously called for help, it frustrated accused, who strangled her to death and thereafter fled away from the spot. During further course of investigation, it also came to fore that at around 1700 hrs 11-year-old daughter of deceased came back to her home and on seeing her mother apparently dead, called for help. Thereafter, some of the neighbours including accused came and took the lady to hospital where doctors declared her as brought dead. The accused Altaf Ahmad Ganie, son of Late Shaban Ganie, 44 years old is a driver by profession, unmarried and is living separately in same house. He was accompanying the people when dead body was taken to hospital so that no one would suspect his involvement in murder: FIR 05/2023 under relevant sections of law already stands registered at Police Station Pampore and accused has been arrested. Investigation of the case is going on.

3 drug peddlers arrested, contraband recovered

PULWAMA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police have arrested 3 notorious drug peddlers on Tuesday and recovered contraband substance from their possession. During search, 350 gm Charas was recovered from their possession of accused identified as Kifayat Rashid Yattoo, son of Ab Rashid, Nazir Ahmad Bhat, son of Ab Aziz and Basit Ahmad Bhat, son of Mohd Shafi, all residents of Khellan Pulwama. They were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 01/2023 under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Litter and investigation started.

Shops, other business establishments served notices for violation of rules

KISHTWAR: As a part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav celebration, Assistant Labour Commissioner (ALC) Amit Kumar along with his team conducted surprise inspections of the shops and other business establishments in Kishtwar Town and adjoining areas.

A total number of 25 shops and establishments were inspected and those found violating the provisions of Jammu and Kashmir Shops and Establishment Act 1966 were served with written notice to appear before ALC Kishtwar in the Office. The notices were served mainly for violation of the different sections of the Shops & Establishment Act 1966, likewise opening the shops despite being a closed day, for non-registration of shops under the said Act, and for not displaying the registration Form C in the shops. During the visit, the ALC Kishtwar also briefed the necessity of registration under the act and further inspected the wage and payment registers under Payment of Wages Act and Minimum Wages Act. He informed the shopkeepers to ensure the timely payment of wages to their workers and also ensure the implementation of newly notified Wage Rate by the UT of Jammu and Kashmir.

Further, Inspection under Child Labour Act was also done in certain establishments and shops but no child labour was found in these establishments. Later, the ALC met the President & representatives of Shopkeepers Associations and encour-

and state lands, Omar claimed it was one of the reasons why elections were not being held in Jammu and Kashmir:

The government is now compelled to take these steps," he added.

Seven persons were killed and 14 others injured in the terrorist attack on January 1 in Rajouri district's Dhangri village.

been facilitating the promotion of GI-tagged products symbolizing the empowerment of the artisans.

These initiatives are aimed to help recognize and promote age-old crafts and methods that are otherwise in danger of being lost due to urbanization and industrialization, Director H&H said.

It is worth mentioning here that machine made products have implied a challenge to the entire Handicraft and Handloom sectors, however the GI certification will go a long way in preserving the crafts as well as facilitating buyers in making the purchase of genuine hand-made products.

So far 7 major crafts from Kashmir namely Kani Shawl, Pashmina, Sozni, Paper-Machie, Walnut Wood Carving, Khatamband, and Hand Knotted Carpets have already been GI certified. Besides, the process of GI registration of five more crafts viz., Kashmir Namda, Waggun, Shikara, Gabba and Kashmir Willow Bat is already under process and the dossier for GI certification of all these crafts has been submitted with the GI authorities in Chennai last month.

One of the major success stories in recent time for crewel and chain stitch has come from Noor Ari a women led Producer Company, has recently collaborated with Fab India, an international brand to provide various crewel and chain stitch items.

The Department of H&H from the last 2 years has been continuously upgrading the testing and labelling facilities for GI certification of different crafts and because of the aggressive promotion of GI certification of different crafts by the Department, a huge number of manufacturers and exporters are approaching the department for testing and labeling of the GI certified products.

The Department is also in process of launching the QR-Code-based GI labelling of 6 crafts as QR-Code-GI labeling for Carpets was already initiated last year. Additionally, non-GI crafts will also be brought under the ambit of QR code Labeling. Moreover, the visitors have also shown much interest in purchasing exclusive GI-certified crafts post these efforts of promoting Geographical Indication throughout the country and away.

"After his retirement from service, his primary focus was taking good care of his family and education of his children. He was a man with a golden heart and was always available in happiness and sorrow for everyone," he said.

Ex-principal of Nagbani School, wife booked for cheating, forgery, fraud

JAMMU: A case of cheating, forgery fraud and criminal breach of trust has been registered against one Alok Betab, Ex-Principal of Nagbani Higher Secondary School and his wife Meenu Betab at Police Station Domana.

As per details, FIR was registered against one Alok Betab and Meenu Betab in Police Station Domana under sections 418, 406, 420, 467, 468, 471 of IPC for cheating, forgery fraud and criminal breach of trust etc as he has produced some forged documents in the court of law. The case was registered by orders of City Judge Jammu, who after due verification, ordered SSP Jammu to register a case and proceed under law. Two FIRs already stand registered against Alok betab in 2016 at Police Station Domana for sexual harassment, criminal intimidation and indecent behavior on complaint of a woman teacher of the school. As per information, investigation in both the cases has been stayed by High Court since last 5 years. In present case, as per allegations, Alok Betab and his wife who is also working in same school, threatened and criminally intimidated a teacher of the school who had leveled serious charges of corruption and misbehavior against both accused. He also produced a fake and forged document in the court purportedly signed and written by said teacher in order to mislead the Court. The investigation of the case has been taken up by Police Station Domana.

Three minor siblings found at Railway Station Jammu handed over to CWC Kupwara

JAMMU: Three minor siblings aged six years, two & half years and six months, who were found alone at Railway Station Jammu, were safely repatriated back to Child Welfare Committee, Kupwara on Tuesday. The three siblings were found alone and abandoned at Jammu Railway Station on December 7, 2022 by an NGO working for the welfare of children. Afterwards, the siblings were produced before the Child Welfare Committee, Jammu the same day and were handed over to Government-run Cradle Baby Reception centre for shelter and care. After hectic efforts of ADGP Railways, SSP Railways and Child Welfare Committee, their father was traced in Tangdhar, Kupwara. After assessing circumstances, in which the father is placed, it was decided to repatriate children back to their district. Later, with personal efforts of ADGP Railways and SSP Railways, a police escort was provided for safe transfer of children to their native village and they were safely handed back to CWC Kupwara.
