"This is special time in history, you are a special generation, you have a special mission, this is the mission of making an impact for India on the global scene," he said in his address to the youth.

For every mission a foundation is needed, whether it is for economy or education, sports or startups, skill development or digitalisation, he noted. "In every domain, a strong foundation has been laid in the last 8-9 years. The runway is ready for your takeoff."

The inaugural event held at the Railway Sports Ground here was attended by Karnataka Governor Thaaawarehand Gehlot, Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai, Union Ministers Pralhad Joshi and Anurag Singh Thakur among others.

Highlighting that there is great optimism in the world today towards India and its youth, Modi said, "this optimism is about you, because of you and for you."

Noting that there are global voices saying that this century belongs to India, he said, "It is your century, century of India's youth. There are global surveys saying majority of the big investors want to invest in India, these investors want to invest in you. India's youth."

From toys to tourism, defence to digital, India is making headlines across the world, the PM said, adding that this is a historic time when optimism and opportunity are coming together.

Touching upon 'Naari Shakti', he said, women are today flying fighter jets, and are getting inducted in combative roles in the Army. "Whether it is Science, technology, space and sports our daughters are reaching heights."

"We have to make 21st century, India's century, for it we have to think 10 steps ahead from the present. Our approach should be futuristic. To fulfill the aspirations of the youth, you have to do positive disruption and move ahead of modernised countries of the world."

Possibly before the end of this decade our world is going to change, emerging technologies like Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning, Internet of Things would have evolved much, and data science and cyber security would have become part of our life much deeper, he said. "So our youth should be prepared with future skills."

Observing that initiatives like digital payments, Swachh Bharat, Jan Dhan, indigenous COVID vaccines were made fun of, Modi highlighting their success today told the youth, "So if youth have new idea, you may be subjected to fun, but if you have trust on your idea, stick to it."

status report to the office of Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir for its onward submission before the High Court.

DB after taking status report on record asked the counsels representing various government departments to file status reports indicating the follow up action that has been taken pursuant to the directions issued by the Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir in a status report submitted before it in terms of order passed by the court on September 19, last year observed that court had also put a blanket ban on constructions besides prohibited use of plastic and plastic material in all the existing parks, open spaces and green spaces in Srinagar and Jammu. Division Bench had further directed all the authorities maintaining those parks to see that no such plastic or plastic material is thrown in the parks or green spaces except in the dustbins which shall be cleared periodically.

It had further asked the authorities to take effective steps in accordance with law for the removal of all encroachments or unauthorized constructions from all parks and green spaces and ensure that no construction in the vicinity is raised without the proper permission/sanction of the map by the competent authority.

However, the bench allowed the authorities to undertake construction of sufficient washrooms and toilets at appropriate places to be earmarked by some expert in each of the parks and to construct proper pathways wherever feasible.

In a significant move, the Army in 2019 began the process of inducting women into the military police.

are expected, while the weather will remain mainly dry after that till January 18.

The night temperature decreased and settled below freezing point across the Valley, but stayed above the normal for this part of the season.

Srinagar recorded a low of minus 0.2 degrees Celsius on Wednesday night, down from 3.5 degrees the night before, the officials said.

Qazigund, the gateway to the Valley, registered a minimum temperature of minus 0.4 degrees Celsius, while Kokernag in south Kashmir recorded a low of minus 2.8 degrees, they said.

The minimum in Kupwara, a frontier district, settled above the freezing point at a low of minus 0.4 degrees.

The tourist resort town of Pahalgam in Anantnag district, which also serves as a base camp for the annual Amarnath Yatra, registered a low of minus 1.7 degrees Celsius.

The minimum temperature in Gulmarg in Baramulla district was recorded at minus 5.5 degrees Celsius, they said.

Kashmir is currently under the grip of 'Chillai Kalan', the 40-day harshest weather period when the chances of snowfall are maximum and most frequent.

Chillai Kalan begins on December 21 and ends on January 30. The cold wave continues even after that with a 20-day-long 'Chillai Khurd' (small cold) and a 10-day-long 'Chillai Bachha' (baby cold) following it.

### Man arrested with intoxicants

JAMMU: Police on Thursday arrested a man arrested and recovered with 224 psychotropic capsules and 92 psychotropic tablets from his possession.

As per the details, acting tough on menace of drug trafficking and substance abuse, a team of Police Station Domana led by SHO Domana Inspr Tilak Raj assisted by Incharge Police Post Chinore PSI Anoop Kumar while on patrolling duty in Raipur Kheri area, rounded up a suspect namely Vivek Kumar, son of Satish Kumar, resident of Ward-8, Akhnoor, Jammu. On search, 224 psychotropic Proxywel spas capsules, 19 BPNX plus tablets (Buprenorphine and naloxone), 45 Nitrazepam -10 mg tablets and 28 UPTRACET semi tablets ( Tramadol) were recovered from his possession. He was arrested and FIR 09/2023 under sections 08/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Domana.

## Excavator, 6 dumpers among 13 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: Carrying out a massive crackdown on menace of illegal mining, 6 vehicles involved in illegal mining were seized in Jammu. Local intelligence was generated and accordingly multi-pronged strategy was devised whereby multiple raids were conducted on suspected locations by police teams of Police Station Nagrota, Police Posts Phallain Mandal, Sidhra and Chatha and 6 vehicles involved in illegal mining were seized.



The seized vehicles included a tractor trolley without registration number seized by Nagrota Police; a tipper (JK02CW-1736) seized by Phallain Mandal Police; a tractor trolley (JK02DA 8987) seized by Sidhra Police; a tractor-trolley (JK02DA 1362), two tractor-trolleys bearing Chassis no MBNGAALF2NRF01212 and Chassis no MBNBEBBU2LJN00891 seized by Chatha Police. The recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Partap Singh, Incharge Police Posts Phallain Mandal PSI Ajesh Singh Jamwal, Sidhra-PSI Nitish Khajuria and Chatha-PSI Harjinder Paul Singh in their respective jurisdictions.

Meanwhile, a team of Geology and Mining department, headed by District Mineral Officer Kathua seized a heavy excavator machine and four Dumpers from Bani Nallah and 2 dumpers at Ding Amb involved in illegal mining and illegal transportation of minerals. As informed by DMO Kathua, the action was taken on the complaint lodged by PRI members about illegal mining by stone crusher in Bani Nallah. "The excavator had excavated and lifted a total of 3300 MT of Nallah muck below water level thereby causing serious loss to water body and land on the both sides of Nallah. The huge sum of penalty was calculated for the pits and excavated material," DMO informed. He further said that the seized machines and dumpers have been kept in the custody of Police Station Bani and Chadwal, Kathua till realization of penalty from violators.

## Not fair to comment: Army Chief on his predecessor's remarks on theaterisation

NEW DELHI: Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande on Thursday chose not to respond to recent comments by his predecessor Gen MM Naravane that framing a national security strategy was a prerequisite to take forward the ambitious theaterisation plan.

Gen Pande said an integrated and tri-services response to meet future security challenges is an "imperative" and that there was a need to get "right joint tri-services structures in place".

"It is not fair for me to comment (on Gen Naravane's remarks). But I think in the future, integrated and tri-services response to meet future

security challenges is an imperative and towards this, I think, we need to get right joint triservices structures in place," Gen Pande said at a press conference.

He was asked to comment on the former Army Chief's remarks.

"Just to elaborate, we are looking at theatre command as a single entity looking after all security aspects and issues in a geographical area under one general commander. So I leave it here just highlighting the importance of theatrisation but stop short of commenting on what my predecessor's views were," Gen Pande said.

The Army Chief said the process of consultations and deliberations

among the three services on the theatreisation plan was underway.

Delivering a talk on theaterisation at the 4th General KV Krishna Rao Memorial Lecture last December, Gen Naravane had said, "Theaterisation is not an end, it is only a means to an end. And that end has to be specified first in the form of a national defence strategy. That defence strategy, in turn, has to flow out of a national security strategy." "Unless there is a national security strategy in place, to just keep talking about theaterisation is actually putting the cart before the horse," he said.

Gen Naravane was the Chief of Army Staff from December 31,

2019 to April 30, 2022. According to the theaterisation plan, each of the theatre commands will have units of the Army, the Navy and the Air Force and all of them will work as a single entity looking after security challenges in a specified geographical territory under an operational commander. At present, the Army, Navy and the Air Force have separate commands. Initially, a plan was firmed up for the creation of an Air Defence Command and Maritime Theatre Command. The theatre commands are being planned to integrate the capabilities of the three services and to ensure optimal utilisation of their resources.
