With the notification of Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016 by Government of India and subsequent notification of Jammu & Kashmir Government Solid Waste Management Bye-Laws 2019, it is incumbent / compulsory for all waste generators including households, shops, commercial establishments, Hotels, Institutional Establishments, vegetable / fruit / flower / mutton / meat markets etc. to segregate waste at source and also to strictly ensure management, segregation, recycling and reuse of Municipal Solid Waste strictly as per aforementioned rules.

"Fine" means penalty imposed on waste generators or operators of waste processing and disposal facilities under the bye-laws for non-compliance of the directions contained in these rules and/or bye-laws

If any waste generator, who fails to comply with the duties entrusted upon him under rule 4 of the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016, shall be liable to pay fine under these bye-laws. The quantum of fine shall be imposed in accordance with the offences mentioned in the Schedule.

The general public through the medium of this notice is informed to fine / Penalty for Incompliance of Solid Waste Management rules 2016 within limits of Jammu Municipal Corporation as per the following rates:

DM Doda issues order for mandatory disclosure of details of tenants, installation of CCTV cameras in shops

DODA: District Magistrate Doda, Vishesh Paul Mahajan, has issued an order under Section 144 CrPC, asking all landlords, property owners, vehicle owners, shop and commercial business establishment owners, attorney holders, and persons in charge of properties in any capacity located within the jurisdiction of the district to submit detailed particulars of their tenants to the concerned police station within 7 days.

The order has been issued with the aim of ensuring public safety and preventing anti-national and anti-social elements from seeking hideouts in residential areas under the guise of tenants and domestic helpers.

The landlords and property owners,

along with the tenants, have been made accountable under the order. It also clarifies that arrangements such as paying guest and subletting are also covered under the order, and owners who have allowed jhuggies on their land are also required to disclose the details as per the declaration form. The SHO concerned will maintain a separate register for the purpose.

The declaration form can be found on the district website, as individual notice cannot be served. Any person found contravening this order will be punishable under Section 188 of the Indian Penal Code.

DM Doda has taken this step to ensure public safety and keep a check on anti-national and anti-social elements,

who might seek hideout in residential areas in the guise of tenants/domestic helpers. This move is expected to help the law enforcement agencies in maintaining peace and order in the district.

The District Magistrate of Doda has issued an order mandating the installation of CCTV cameras in all shops, establishments, restaurants, hotels, garages, and scrap dealers on National Highway, as well as in main markets and other important roads within the jurisdiction of the district. Owners have been given 15 days to comply with the order; failure to do so will be punishable under Section 188 of the Indian Penal Code. The Senior Superintendent of Police has been tasked with ensuring the implementation of this order.

Notice for Prohibiting Production, Stocking, Distribution, Sale & Use of Single Use Plastic (SUP) Items

Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change has issued notification No G.S.R. 571(E) dated 12th August 2021 vide which manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale and use of identified single use plastic (SUP), including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities shall be prohibited with effect from the 1st July, 2022.

(a) Ear buds with plastic sticks, plastic sticks for balloons, plastic flags, candy sticks, ice-cream sticks, polystyrene (Thermocol) for decoration;

(b) Plates, cups, glasses, cutlery such as forks, spoons, knives, straw, trays, wrapping or packing films around sweet boxes, invitation cards, and cigarette packets, plastic or PVC banners less than 100 micron, stirrers.

As per Rules 4(1)(c) of PWM Rules, 2016 (as amended) "Carry bag made of virgin or recycled plastic, shall not be less than one hundred and twenty (120) microns in thickness with effect from 31st December 2022.

This Notice is being issued to inform all Producers, Stockists, Retailers, Shopkeepers, e-commerce Companies, Street Vendors, Commercial Establishments (Malls/ Market place/ Shopping Centres / Cinema Houses/ Tourist locations/ Schools/ Colleges/ Office Complexes/ Hospitals & other Institutions) and general public to stop production, stocking, distribution, sale and usage of identified SUP items.

Any non-compliance in this regard will attract penal action as per Jammu & Kashmir Non-Biodegradable Material (Management, Handling and Disposal) Act, 2007 and as per its subsequent amendment by Government of India vide notification No. S.O. 1229(E) dated 31-03-2020 in above which may include fine up to the tune of Rs. 50,000/- and punishment for a term which may be extended for a month or both.

Section 3 (B) of the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016, provide as:-

"Bulk Waste Generator" means and includes buildings occupied by the Central government departments or undertakings, State government departments or undertakings, local bodies, public sector undertakings or private companies, hospitals, nursing homes, schools, colleges, universities, other educational institutions, hostels, hotels, commercial establishments, markets, places of worship, aseems and sports complexes having an average waste generation rate exceeding 100 kg per day;

In view of the above,

All resident welfare and market associations, all gated communities, and institutions with more than 5,000 sq. m. area, shall through the medium of this notice pay Rs. 5,000/- per month as user charges to Jammu Municipal Corporation for collection, transportation & processing of their segregated waste.
