# India won't be coerced by anybody: Jaishankar's strong response to Pakistan, China

Balakot strike sent much-needed message



DELHI: India's counter response to terroremanating from Pakistan and to aggressive cross-border skirmish with China displayed that the nation will not be coerced by anybody, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said. He added that the country will do everything to ensure its security.

The Balakot air strikes conducted by the Air Force in

response to the Pulwama terror attack had sent the much-needed message across, he said referring to the incident in 2019.

"On the northern borders, China is today seeking to change the status quo by bringing in large forces and violating our borders. Despite COVID-19, our counter response was strong and firm. Our troops deployed in thousands safeguarded our frontiers in

extreme terrain and harsh border and (protection of borders) continues to this day," Jaishankar said while addressing the Tamil weekly Thuglak's 53rd anniversary here on Saturday evening.

"The national wellbeing has many facets and national security is without question the basic foundation. All countries are tested in this regard but we perhaps had more than our fair share of problems ranging from insurgency to cross-border terrorism, especially terrorism. The Balakot air strikes sent the much-needed message," the External Affairs Minister said.

"India is a nation that will not be coerced by anybody and it will do everything to ensure its Jaishankar said.



Sericulture or silk production has a long established

history amd market, local as well as foreign, in Jammu and Kashmir. The region is known for its high-quality bivoltine silk and has the potential to become a major silk producing hub in the country. However, the industry has faced challenges in recent years and there was a need for its development and modernization in order to meet the growing demand for superior silk which can match and replace not only the silk being imported to the country but also compete in its export requirements abroad.

"Sericulture is the only cash crop that ensures significant returns in a short span of time, earning it a special place in the rural

Although the state produces high-quality bivoltine cocoons, productivity and total cocoon output are low" said Atal Dulloo, Additional Chief Secretary, Agriculture Department Production while highlighting the broad contours of the samctioned project. Similarly, cocoon yields are half of the national average and over the past few years the output from the sector has been shrinking. Improving seed quality, rearing facilities and cocoon processing will provide a huge shot in the arm for the sector and improve income at farm levels, he added. "Technological interven-

#### SIT rules out terror angle in DGP Prisons' murder, finds accused was driven by 'deep grudges' official said.

JAMMU: Ruling out terror angle in the sensational murder of H K Lohia, a former director general of Jammu and Kashmir prisons, in October last year, the police investigation in the case has found accused Yassir Ahmad was driven by "deep grudges" against high-ranking officials.

The Jammu and Kashmir Crime Branch Special Investigation Team that carried out a detailed probe, including a Narco analysis on Ahmed, concluded he was disturbed over self-assumed noncompliance of promises of a government job in lieu of services he rendered as a domestic help to Lohia an

The sensational murder of Lohia, a 1992-batch IPS officer, had raised many eyebrows especially after a littleknown terror group, Peoples Anti-Fascist Front (PAFF). claimed responsibility. It was dismissed by police as mere tactics of these outfits to own 'everything shamelessly".

During a detailed enquiry, the official said, the police could not find any link between Ahmed and any terror group. His detailed journey over the two years, after he left his home at Halla Dandrath of Ramban district in Jammu, was also chalked out. The charge sheet said the accused, during

## Bharat Jodo Yatra to reach J&K on January 19: Patil

SRINAGAR: The Bharat Jodo Yatra, led by Rahul Gandhi, will reach Jammu and Kashmir on January 19 and culminate in a huge rally here on January 30. Congress leader Rajani Patil said on Sunday, asserting that the Jammu and Kashmir administration has promised all support to the foot march.

The yatra will culminate in Srinagar on January 30.

Patil, the Jammu and Kashmir in-charge of the Congress, told reporters that Gandhi will arrive at Lakhanpur on the Punjab-Jammu border on January 19. A flag-holding ceremony will be held there to welcome

the former Congress chief, who will then walk from Lakhanpur to Kathua. Samba and reach Jammu's Satwari Chowk, where a public gathering will be held.

Patil said Gandhi will reach Banihal from Jammu through Udhampur. From Jammu, he will reach Srinagar's Pantha Chowk after travelling through Anantnag.

"A big rally will be held here after Gandhi walks in the valley for three days. We are receiving several calls from people to attend the rally. We need a huge venue to accommodate so many people," she said. Patil said Congress president Mallikarjun
